The Department of Computer Science and IT of IIS (deemed to be University) organized a one-day workshop on Blender led by Dr. Sameer S Sahasrabudhe Senior Project Research Scientist, at the Department of Computer Science, IIT Bombay on 7 March 2020 from 9:00 am to 1:30 p.m. Dr Sahasrabudhe is specialized in advertising, animation film production and open source 3D animation software: Blender. He focused on the concept of designing and provided various activities to make it clear.

lecture was followed by hands-on for PCR reaction set up.



The workshop commenced with the inaugural session on 24th February. Prof. K.S. Sharma, Director CRIT apprised the participants about the functioning of CRIT and objectives of the workshop. He further emphasized on the fact that this workshop was organized to address the challenges and opportunities in the field of research with the help of statistical software like SPSS and EViews. He also stated that the workshop will help the researchers to identify right analytical tool for conducting data analysis. In all50 participants actively

participated in the workshop.

Resource person for the 1st session was Prof. C.R. Bishnoi, Head, Department of Economics, IIS (deemed to be University). He elaborately discussed the importance of data analysis and its implementation in the respective domains. 2nd Session taken by Dr. Shweta Kastiya, Head, Department of Management Studies, IIS (deemed to be University), she demonstrated the functioning of SPSS including the following teachers like data entry for analysis, finding outliers, exporting and importing of data etc. Last session was taken by Dr. Vandana Sachdeva, Senior Assistant Professor, Department of Management. She discussed the concept of some features like select case, case split file and graphic presentation in SPSS software.

On 2nd day of the workshop, first three sessions were taken by Prof. C. R. Bishnoi, he covered the topic of Hypothesis Testing and the various parametric and non-parametric tests using SPSS. The last session of the day was hands on training on SPSS under the supervision of Dr. Shweta Kastiya.

Resource Person for day 3 and 4 was Dr. Seema Malik, Assistant Professor, Department of Commerce, Bhagat Phool Singh Mahila Vishwavidyalaya, she discussed the concept of Structural Equation Model (SEM) using AMOS and also taught the participants about how to compare the results of SPSS and AMOS. She also conducted a training session on exploratory factory analysis.

Training sessions on day 5 and day 6 was taken by Dr. Sunita Arora, Government College of Women, Rohtak. She gave hands on training on SPSS and Eviews covering the topics like; Regression Analysis, Multiple Regression, Time Series Analysis, Vector Auto Regression Model, Co-Integration Model, Ordinary Least Square Model and Auto Regressive Distributed Lag model.

The workshop was a learning experience for all the participants and the techniques learned over past 6 days and will definitely help in improving the quality of research.



## Workshop on Introduction to Innovative Zoology Software

Date: 7th February 2020

Objective of the workshop: To give the information about Innovative Zoology software through which students can learn classifications of the animals

An activity was organized by the Department of Zoology on 7th February 2020, in which Dr. Pallavi Kaushik and Dr. Neetu Kachhwaha introduced innovative zoology software by which students can learn classifications of the animals. Students love zoology as a subject as they get to know about themselves and animals around but the systematic classification is burdensome and they often face problems to memorize the classification of the vertebrates and invertebrates. There is a wide gap between the scientific knowledge of animal classification and student's conception. A study showed that the students of elementary, secondary and college level when asked to do complete classification tasks, all age groups failed to generalize and discriminate among examples and non-examples of animals. The weakness in the basics of Zoology results in poor performances at all levels. It is also seen that during the examination the students skip and do not like to attempt these questions preferably. To solve the problem the software will help students at all levels to excel in the subject of zoology and solve basic problems. This will also help the students who are pursuing undergraduate (UG), post- graduation (PG) in science (Zoology as one their subject) and also students who are preparing for the competitive examinations like UGC-NET, RAS, NEET. Students of M.Sc. and B.Sc(H) attended the programme with great enthusiasm. This activity proved very useful for the students and faculty as well.



mentioned things that don't work in a CV which include spelling errors, lack of personal details,

The second half was all about how to write a Statement of Purpose. The student has to

understand that it is not a literary exercise. She also suggested checking the SOP, editing it,

rewriting it and asking a family member or a friend to read the document to provide suggestions.

The things that are to be taken into consideration when writing an SOP is , to avoid lies,

plagiarism, flattery, childish sentences.

In this Workshop, the following areas have been covered:

1st day: Preparation for Aptitude Test, and

2nd day: Techniques for Group Discussions and Mock Group Discussions

3rd day: Tips for Personal Interview and Mock Personal Interviews

Day1

The workshop was commenced on October 10th 2019. On the first day, Ms. Manchanda discussed about how to enhance aptitude and reasoning skills. She discussed various forms of vocabulary including the meaning, origin, pronunciation and usages of words, their synonyms and antonyms, as well as uses of idioms and phrases.

Day2

On October 11th 2019, the resource person discussed the techniques of participation in Group Discussions, Do's & Don'ts in Group Discussions, and conducted Mock Group Discussions for the students. There were about six Group Discussions held in the session. Each group consisted of 8-10 members. The topics of the discussion were related with current scenario. All the students actively participated in the mock Group discussions. At the end of each discussion, the resource person gave personal feedback to the students.

National Workshop on Curative & Preventive Conservation of Textiles

Date: 20th September-21st September 2019

Venue: Vinayak Hall

No. of Participants: 56

Objective of the workshop: To bring together experts from the field of Textile Conservation to

give hand on training for better upkeep of artifacts.

Department of Fashion & Textiles organized two day National Workshop on "Curative and Preventive Conservation of Textiles" in collaboration with Textiles and Clothing Research Centre (TCRC). This workshop was conducted with the help of presentations and practical exercises. There were 53 participants from all over the India. Besides Rajasthan, there were participants from Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh and Uttar Pradesh.

The workshop began with the inaugural session seeking the blessings of almighty followed by lighting the lamp. Resource persons of the workshop were Dr. Anamika Pathak, Founder Chairperson, Textile and Clothing Research Centre (TCRC). Dr. Simmi Bhagat, Associate Professor, Lady Irvin Collage, Founder Member TCRC, New Delhi. Ms. Smita Singh, Textile Conservation Consultant, Founder Member and Chief Editor TCRC, New Delhi.

On day one workshop began with an inaugural ceremony. In which Dr. Ashok Gupta, Vice Chancellor, IIS (Deemed to be University) Jaipur extended warm welcome to all the resource persons, delegates and participants and threw light on the importance and relevance of the workshop. After this Dr. Anamika Pathak highlighted the importance of preserving textiles for historic interest. She also explained the aesthetic appeal and cultural significance the textiles. She explained role of textile as heirloom, art and craft. She mentioned Rajasthan as the "Garh" of textiles because of its rich heritage and culture. In her presentation she showed collection of textiles of Museum through pictorial presentation to give exposure towards cultural heritage.

After this session, Dr. Simmi Bhagat explained the meaning of conservation with reference to textile as cultural property. She focused on restoration as a third branch of conservation after preventive and curative treatment. She emphasized on different factors of deterioration like natural and manmade and discussed the factors that cause damages through an example of Calico Museum Ahmedabad. Sensitivity of textiles and vulnerability to decay when stored or displayed in inappropriate environmental conditions was also explained.

Thereafter Dr.Anamika Pathak briefed the audience about the handling and movement of textile objects. She described the materials used in handling of textiles like aluminium with wooden edges, PVC tubes of different dimensions according to the products and for storage of the object like flat keeping, framing, mounting and card box. Another session was taken by Ms. Smita Singh. The key highlights were on the different factors and causes of deterioration like mechanical, physical and chemical. She gave the condition report for textiles to the participants for getting an idea about the practical procedures of documentation of textiles. This report is used by the conservators in museum to keep record of the objects. She also explained the concept of reactions which can be the cause of degradation of textiles like photochemical and oxidative reactions in the presence of light, humidity and temperature. She also explained how condition reports are produced after detailed examination of the object.

The second day of the workshop begins with the session conducted by Ms. Smita Singh. She addressed on analysis and testing methods for textiles like weave analysis, stitch analysis and digital methods. She explained the method of handling objects which includes folding with the concept of tissue paper padding to resist the object from creases. This was followed by an overview of curative treatment of textiles. She explained that there are two types of cleaning i.e. mechanical and solvent cleaning were explained. She emphasized the selection of appropriate cleaning method to be used for conservation of textiles either in museum or in personal wardrobe.

She also demonstrated the digital tool known as dinolight microscope which is used to take pictures of minute details of the object. This was followed by practical exercise where participants used sponge, brush and vacuum cleaner for cleaning purpose. Thereafter Dr. Simmi Bhagat took a session on stabilization of textiles. In this session she explained the basic stabilization of textile conservation stitches. She demonstrated various stitches and participants tried those stitches on samples.

Outcome of the activity/event/seminar/workshop: The sum up the workshop was very useful and meaningful for the participants and delegates. With the help of practical experiences participants were able to understand the importance of valuable textile heritage, handling the

IPR Session 1 - Types of Intellectual Property Rights

#### IPR Session 3 - Significance of IPR at the Educational Institution Level

He began by posing the question, 'What can you do with your house?'Different answers were proposed by the delegates, such as, 'to live in it',' to sell it', or 'to put it up for rent', leading to Mr. Sharma's reason for asking the question, which was to clarify that the term 'license' should be used instead of the word 'rent' and like such tangible property intellectual property can also be utilized and commercialized and that's why called property too. He further stated that anyone could get an idea but difference lies in how it is utilized. He emphasized that focus is essential on wealth creation, knowledge generation and social well being.

The entire session was a structured process of brain storming and information exchange.

#### IPR Session 4- Role of IPMC

Mr. Pankaj Kumar, Asst. Professor and IP Management Cell Coordinator, deliberated on IPR and incubation activities at the University level. #### Japanese Wood Block Print Making Workshop

**Objective of the workshop:** In this workshop, Japanese artist Kenji Najima displayed his prints, discussed his works' subject, technique and process and demonstrated how to create water based wood block print.

The Department of Visual Arts organized a three day workshop on "Japanese Woodblock Printmaking by Kenji Najima" and "Demonstration cum artist talk on Chine- Colle by Tomoyo Ihaya". Kenji Najima and Tomoyo Ihaya were the artists invited from Japan for their demonstration. Born in 1968 at Mie, Kenji Najima is a Japanese Printmaker who completed his Bachelors of Art in Japanese Literature from Chukyo University. Kenji Najima works on woodblock plates and prints them with a baren, a hand tool with flat bottom used in Japanese woodblock printmaking on handmade Japanese paper using watercolor pigments.

The printmaking studio of Visual Arts Department of IIS University Campus, Mansarovar, Jaipur on 27th February 2019 was bustling with young artists on Wednesday when Canada-based Japanese artist Tomoyo Ihaya shared with them a special technique of graphic art in the morning. The printmaker demonstrated techniques of Chine Colle graphic art. The usual intaglio style of printmaking involves the incision of the required image on a metal plate on which ink is applied and then imprinted on a thick paper. In the Chine Colle method, the paper used is of a smoother and thinner variety. The artist does not need to prepare and print additional plates. "This is an Italian technique in which the image produced is creamier and has special effects of smoother textures. Since initially Chinese natural fibre paper was used, the method is known as Chine Colle. But now, a Japanese paper, gampi, made from a variety of wild mulberry plants, is used," said Tomoyo. She demonstrated how the same image when produced on gampi has sharper details than on European paper. Students also tried their hand at it and Tomoyo guided them well. It was an exceptional experience for the students.

Econometrics and its applications

The Department of Economics of IIS (deemed to be University) organized a five-day National Workshop on Basic Applied Econometrics from 26-30 December, 2018. Each day of the workshop consisted of four sessions from 10 am to 4 pm with intermittent breaks for a refreshing

breakfast, lunch and tea.

The first day of the workshop began with a welcome note by Dr. Anima Vaish, Organizing Secretary of the workshop. She also introduced the resource person of the workshop, Prof. Pranab Banerji, who was associated with the Indian Institute of Public Administration (IIPA) as Professor of Economics from 2001 to 2015. He was welcomed by the Vice Chancellor, Dr. Ashok Gupta with a memento. Dr. Gupta stressed on the growing importance of econometrics in various arenas of academic studies. He then invited Prof. Banerji to commence the workshop. Prof. Banerji started with a brief introduction of self and an introduction to econometrics. Econometrics is a discipline based on application of statistical techniques for empirical analysis of various theories. He briefly described the plan of the workshop and how it would help in building the foundation of econometrics. With this, the inaugural session came to an end and was followed by refreshments. After refreshments began the other sessions for the first day, which covered topics like sampling, statistical inference, methods of estimation, desirable properties of estimators and hypothesis testing. In the last session, Prof. Banerji also introduced the popularly used software of econometrics, EViews, which was to be used for the subsequent days of the workshop. The participants learned the user interface of EViews- opening and creating workfile. importing data, generating series, etc.

Day 2 was centered towards bivariate analysis- assumptions of the classical linear regression model, estimation of regression equation, properties of OLS estimators and hypothesis testing of regression coefficients. This was followed by practical session of bivariate regression in EViews. The focus of Day 3 was on multivariate analysis. The resource person, after a quick recap of the topics covered in the previous day, introduced the multiple linear regression model, its

assumptions and interpretations. This was followed by practical exercises on EViews and use of Coefficient Diagnostics, which comprised of Omitted Variable Test, Redundant Variable Test and Wald Test. He also discussed the various criteria of choosing variables in a regression model. As the foundation of simple and multiple regression models was built in the three days, Day 4 of the workshop was centered on violation of assumptions of the classical linear regression model- the problems of multicollinearity, heteroskedasticity and autocorrelation. Prof. Banerji dealt with the consequences, detection and remedial measures for each of these problems. The applications of these concepts were covered with practical exercises on EViews. On the last day of the workshop, the resource person discussed some advanced topics in econometrics namely, endogeniety, instrumental variables and a way forward through Time Series and Panel Data analyses. Time series econometrics evolved during the 1980s as time series data cannot be easily analysed using the traditional methods of econometrics. Prof. Banerji explained the concepts of stationarity, white noise, spurious regression, cointegration and VAR. He also went over the topics of panel data analysis- the random and fixed effects models. All these concepts were demonstrated using various exercises on EViews.

The workshop drew to a close with a few participants sharing their experiences and insights and thanking the resource person for elucidating the concepts with such innovative examples. Finally, Dr. Anima Vaish concluded with a formal vote of thanks. The workshop thus proved to be a great learning experience for all the participants.

Outcome of the workshop: Participants got knowledge about theoretical and applied Econometrics. All concepts, techniques and models had been dealt with the help of EViews which enabled the participants to learn the applied Econometric techniques.

# Workshop on Mammalian Chromosomal assay

**Objective of the workshop:** To enhances the skills of students in the area of Genotoxicity and Chromosomal Abberations.

The Department of zoology organized a workshop on Mammalian Chromosomal Assay. Dr. Rajbala Verma Assistant Professor, Department of Zoology, University of Rajasthan was the resource persion. She shed her expertise to post graduate students organized a workshop. She gave a lecture on Genotoxicity and Chromosomal Abberation Assay. Chromosomal aberrations are abnormalities in the structure or number of chromosomes and are often responsible for genetic disorders. Chromosomal abnormalities can result from either a variation in the chromosome number or from structural changes. These events may occur spontaneously or can be induced by environmental agents such as chemicals, radiation, and ultraviolet light. Visible changes to chromosome structure and morphology have played a very important part as indicators of genetic damage in both clinical and cancer studies. Postgraduate students have research dissertation in their curriculum in which they have to choose some research problem. So they learnt this techniques by which they can assess genotoxicity of any chemical or compound. Dr. Rajbala Verma explain the technique in detail followed by practical demonstration. This workshop proved very helpful for students.

Outcome of the workshop: Students learnt the technique based on Genotoxicity and Chromosomal Aberrations Assay.

### **Workshop on Mud Printing**

Date: 24th March 2018

Objective of the workshop: Skill enhancement and product development among the students.

Crochet is a part of department's curriculum in skill enhancement course where the students are taught to make articles like mobile covers, table mats, accessories(Jewellery) and apparel like shrug and tops using the crotchet tool with wool or crocheting threads. Department of Fashion and Textiles had organized a workshop on "MUD PRINTING" on 24th March 2018. The resource persons were Mr. Sandeep Chippa & Mr. Govind Chippa, Poonam Textiles, Bagru, they defined the traditional process of this printing methods through mud paste, and natural dying agents on pretreated cotton fabrics. In this workshop they taught how to prepare the mud paste and colour. The process of finishing was as follows:

- 1. Pretreated (cambric cotton) fabric was used.
- 2. Mud paste: Black soil, gum, lime, and wheat powder, were mixed and keept for one day. This paste was applied with wooden blocks on the Pretreated fabrics. After printing the fabric, students waited for drying of the fabric.
- 3. After that they took two tubs and made the independent solution of Harda & Kashish dye (popular name). Harda gives yellow colour to the fabrics and Kashish dyed gives grey colour to the fabrics. After completion of dyeing process, fabrics were kept in the sun light till they dry.
- 4. Than the dyed fabric was washed in separate clean water for removal of the mud and than dried in shade.

Outcome of the workshop: Students learnt the natural process of the Bagru print; they had prepared the samples for made-ups (table cloth, cushion cover, mats) with the help of mud printing.

## Demonstration of "Drying of Solvents and Chromatographic Techniques"

Date: 16th-18th August 2017

**Objective of the workshop:** Drying of solvents is an important step in inorganic and organic synthesis with non-aqueous solvents. Chromatographic techniques also play an important role in Chemistry. To inculcate the students with these techniques this workshop was organized.

The workshop on "Drying of Solvent & Chromatographic Techniques" was organized by the Department of Chemistry for M.Sc. Semester III students under the supervision of Ms. Manjinder Kour on 16th and 18th Aug, 2017. She explained the importance of solvent drying and effect of impurities in a solvent including moisture. Describing the importance of solvent drying, it was explained that it is more economical to purify commercial grades than to purchase more expensive Analytical grades. Next day lecture and demonstration on "Chromatography techniques: Column and Thin Layer Chromatography" was carried out. Column Chromatography is a method used to purify and separate individual compounds in a mixture.

Experimentally also, they performed Column Chromatography and prepared TLC plates. The workshop was summed up with the question answer session. Next day another method for the drying of high boiling point solvents was demonstrated.

Outcome of the workshop: After the workshop the students were able to dry solvent with appropriate technique and use chromatographic techniques whenever required.

#### Workshop: An Introduction to ChemDraw

**Objective of the workshop:** ChemDraw is software used for the generation of chemical structure. The knowledge of ChemDraw is essential for the UG, PG and Research students so that they can present cleaner, authentic and high resolution structure in their work. With this aim we have planned to organize this workshop.

The workshop on "ChemDraw" was organized for all the M.Sc. Students on 12th August 2017 at the IIS University Jaipur. Ms. Manjinder Kour wonderfully simplified the use of ChemDraw program which helped the students to efficiently draw simple 2-D representations of organic molecules, chemical formulae and reaction schemes required for their seminar reports, publications and thesis. The workshop began with the introduction of ChemDraw. Ms. Manjinder guided the students about the software, how to draw molecular structures and also the importance of that software. ChemDraw is a molecule editor application first developed in 1985 by David A Evans and Stewart Rubenstein. ChemOffice suite consists of three programs viz. ChemDraw, Chem3D and ChemFinder, and is available for MacOS and Microsoft Windows.

ChemDraw has many applications viz. drawing chemical structures, giving names to chemical structure, in the conversion of a chemical name to structure, in NMR spectrum simulation (1H and 13C), in mass spectrum simulation, and in structure cleanup. It has an extensive collection of templates, including style templates for most of the major chemical journals, exporting to SVG and PDF format. Students learned to draw different structures on ChemDraw under the supervision of Ms. Manjinder Kour. The workshop was over with Q&A session.

Outcome of the workshop: After the workshop students were able to draw the structures in ChemDraw and its use in the interpretation of IR, NMR and Mass spectrum.

The documents are arranged caste wise and in alphabetical order dealing with the customs and traditions of the different castes in the contemporary period.



- There is a need to build synergetic networks to be developed among researchers, academicians and voluntary organizations in order to ensure sharing of knowledge and capacity building.
- The government as well as nongovernmental organizations should take concrete steps to improve women's access to public schemes.
- The measures for empowerment of women should be accelerated with active participation of print and electronic media.
- Establishment of support systems for reproductive and domestic roles of women with work, which lead to temporary or permanent halt of employment.
- Entrepreneur friendly gender inclusive ecosystem is required.
- Enterpreneurship Development Cells should be established in higher education institutes to provide training in entrepreneurial activities and sustainability of business.
- Organizations should develop specific career paths for women which permit breaks for reproductive roles and child care.
- Adoption of positive educational reforms which contribute to achievement of equality between girls and boys.

immune-histological sections.

Day 4 the participants continued the processing of immuno-histological sections, followed by

histochemical section preparation and the result analysis. She also provided hands on training

Day 5 started with the lecture of Dr. Vivekananda of Malviya National Institute of Technology

Jaipur. He talked on the generation of bioenergy and the production of biogas. It was followed by

# National Workshop on Research Methodology

Date: 24th-30th November 2016

The Centre for Research, Innovation and Training (CRIT) of the IIS University, Jaipur organized a "Seven-Day National Workshop on Research Methodology" from 24 November to 30 November 2016 for research scholars and young faculty members in the IISU Campus. The workshop was inaugurated by Dr. Ashok Gupta, Vice Chancellor, the IIS University. The workshop was organised keeping in mind the need of the hour to improve the quality of teaching and learning process. The workshop commenced with an introductory remark of the basic purpose of the Workshop by Dr. SubhashGarg, Dean & Director, CRIT. The core objective of the workshop was to equip the research scholars with set of skills and potentiality to undertake the research very effectively in the disciplines of Commerce, Management and Social Sciences.

The workshop was designed to achieve the following objectives:

- To make the participants familiar with the basic concepts of Research Methodology.
- To familiarize the participants with the basics of data handling and analysis.
- To give hands on experience in Primary research to the participants through the practical work assigned to them.
- To enable the participants to develop research plan proposal.
- To enable the participants to develop quantitative and qualitative research skills.

The workshop brought together over 51 participants from different universities. The workshop focused on both qualitative and quantitative aspects of research. The workshop provided an interactive atmosphere between the resource persons and the participants. The workshop focused on helping participants to understand basics of research methodology with special emphasis on writing a research proposal. The workshop was handled by a team of eminent resource persons from the respective field. Some of the notable speakers were Dr.Balwinder Singh, Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar, Prof. Balkishan, Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla, Dr. Ramesh C Gaur, Jawaharlal Nehru University(JNU), New Delhi, Dr.NeerajKaushik, NIT, Kurkshetra, Dr.SanketVij, B.P.S.MahilaVishwavidyalaya, Sonipatand Dr.Satish Kumar, MNIT. Jaipur.Dr.PoonamMadan was the convener of the workshop and Dr.BhawanaArya, Dr.PayalMehtani, Dr. Mani Bhatia and Dr. R. K. Taylor were the co-convenors of the

workshop. Most of the participants who attended the workshop were Research Scholars and Faculty Members.

The detailed report of the workshop is as follows:

### Day 1

The first session of the workshop was conducted by Prof. Rashmi Jain, Vice Principal, University Maharani College, Jaipur who introduced the participants to the basic aspects of qualitative research, with a purpose of building a strong foundation within aspiring researchers. In her session, shediscussed Grounded theory as a qualitative research approach. She talked about Ethnography as an extremely broad area with a great variety of practitioners and methods. However, the most common ethnographic approach is participant observation as a part of field research. She explained about ethno-methodology and stressed that interpretative understanding of the society is essential in order to draw generalizations. She concluded her lecture by highlighting the importance of qualitative research. This was followed by interactive session which proved to be enriching for all the participants.

The Resource person of the second session was Prof. NishaYadav, Controller of the Examination, The IIS University, Jaipur. She elaborated the philosophy of qualitative researchand reflected on its various aspects. She also discussed the various methods of analysing and interpreting qualitative data. Major qualitative approaches were also introduced to the participants. She explained Critical Research as the notion which includes self-critique, a critical posture vis-a-vis qualitative inquiry itself.

The resource person for the technical session III&IV of Day I was Dr.Satish Kumar, MNIT, Jaipur. The discussion topic for his session was handling the Literature Review which is one of the most vital parts of the research endeavour. The steps to be followed for developing the Review of Literature in a structured fashion were discussed. He suggested that the researchers should read the book "Research Design" by Jennifer Walker to brush up their knowledge. He explained the uses of Mendeley as a free reference manager, data manager for citation for academic and social network. He threw light on online bibliographic programmes. He also addressed several issues related to writing quality research papers He explained about end notes and foot notes. He gave information about the requirements of a good article emphasized on its originality. He stated that researchers should make efforts to publish their articles only in peer

#### Day 2

Dr.NeerajKaushik, who is a renowned expert in the field of researchmethodology, was the resource person for the day. Dr.NeerajKaushik is currently working as Associate Professor in Department of Business Administration, National Institute of Technology, Kurukshetra. He explained about Exploratory, Descriptive and Experimental research. He discussed about internet sources for collection of data. In the subsequent sessions he dealt with basic statistics, importance of statistical enquiries and their limitations, mean & median and elaborated on SPSS. He explained about measures of central tendency, measures of dispersion, moment & kurtosis and skewness.

In his second session, he discussed about questionnaire building and formation of Research Questions. He dealt at length with questionnaire framing and types of questions. He focused on questionnaire designing. Types of questions to be included, avoidance of overlapping categories, reliability and validity of the questionnaire were discussed. Various issues related types of question sequence of questions were addressed during this session.

#### Day 3

Dr.NeerajKaushiktook a session on identifying variables for research. Hediscussed the concept ofIndependent, Dependent, Extraneous, Mediating and Moderating VariablesControlling Extraneous Variables.He discussed the concepts in Hypothesis Testing, Null and Research Hypothesis, Statistical Significance and confidence Intervals, Inferential Errors

He a took a session on Identification of Statistical Tools for Data Analysis and gave brief introduction to the participants on various topics like Scales of Measurement, Sampling Theory, Probability and Non Probability Sampling. He stressed that sampling which otherwise is often mistaken for an easy task actually demands utmost care and sincerity He expounded on universe, population and sampling. He discussed about the types of probability sampling with the help of examples. Detailed discussion was carried out on simple random sampling, stratified sampling, convenience sampling and snowball sampling. He stated that generally the social science and management researchers work on 5% confidence level. He also explained about sample size criteria, level of precision and degree of variability.

In his post lunch session on Formulating Hypotheses, he discussed about role and sources of hypothesis, and explained about null and alternate Hypothesis. He emphasized the acceptance and rejections of hypothesis are research outcomes. Dr.NeerajKaushik also conducted practice sessions on Research Questions and Hypothesis Framing.

#### Day 4

The resource person for the day was Dr.BalwinderSaini, Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar. The session provided an overview of the data sources available to researchers and demonstrated how different types of data can be incorporated into research. Particular attention was paid to how primary datacan producehigh quality research output. The basics of SPSS and data entry were dealt in he session on Data preparation- Coding & Tabulation, Basic Data Cleanings in SPSS followed by Descriptive statistics & Cross-tabulation. He explained about Data Entry & Data Cleaning and outlier data. He stressed that data duplication should be avoided since it can be identified by SPSS.He explained the process of data selection in SPSS. He discussed about parametric and non-parametric tests. Chi Square test of independence, chisquare test of goodness, spearman's correlation, phi- test, split file and weighed cases. He explained the steps of these tests with the help of examples. He apprised the participants about the software, the Sigma Plot, which can help us to decide the application of the type of tests. He also gave information about E-Views for regression. He also gave information about ETD, ETHOS and Australian Digital Thesis Programme for downloading thesis on various topics. He emphasized that curiosity is the basic need for learning any software. Students were guided how to perform statistical analysis, data & text mining, predictive modelling and decision optimization. They were also informed about important software available as ready-reckoner for smoothness in their various research analyses. The participants were also given practice of the same.

#### Day 5

The expert of the sessionwas Prof.Balkishan, Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla.In his session on Hypothesis Testing, Interpretation and Results,hedeliberated that since every research has future concerns, so think wisely and make hypothesis near to reality.He drew special attention on regression.He gave clarification about how Regression Analysis is different from Correlation AnalysisDr.BalKishan carried further the discussion of quantitative analysis by talking on Correlation Analysis with SPSS. He said that one has to take utmost care in making

correlation between two variables. It should be logical He mentioned that sampling should be carried out carefully otherwise the conclusion will be misleading. He explained concepts with hands on practice of writing Results from SPSS. He explained about the application of bivariate correlation, partial correlation, pearson's coefficient, spearmen's rank correlation and Kendall Tau. He elaborated on one sample t-test, independent sample t-test, paired t- test and ANOVA.

#### Day 6

Dr.BhawanaArya took a session on Research Design and designing an effective survey. She elaborated on various types of research designs. She explained about descriptive and exploratory designs with the help of examples. She threw light on various aspects of research methodology. He detailed the participants about various statistical tools used in the research process. He laid emphasis on effective research design for quality research. She gave insights on how to design effective survey for research.

The post lunch session was delivered by Prof. R.C. Gaur, Jawaharlal Nehru University (JNU), on issues surrounding plagiarism. He familiarized the participants with the use of anti-plagiarism tools in research. He enlightened the participants with the technical terms like H-index, citation and impact factor. He explained that an annotated bibliography is a list of citations to books, articles, and documents and follows the appropriate style format for the discipline, i.e., MLA, APA, Chicago Manual of Style, etc. He explained that creating an annotated bibliography calls for the application of a variety of intellectual skills: concise exposition, succinct analysis, and informed library research. He explained the uses of citation builder and discussed the meaning and seriousness of plagiarism. He discussed and demonstrated how to create bibliography using zotero from various sources and different formats of bibliography. At the same time he stressed on the importance of references and various styles prevalent for the Reference Management.

# Day 7

The sessions on the last day were conducted byDr.SanketVij, B.P.S.MahilaVishwavidyalaya, Sonipat.In his session onWriting and Presenting Research Proposal, heintroduced basic principles of writing proposals across a range of disciplinesHe explained the various formats of research proposals and explained the in depth for all the components of Research Proposal. Dr.Vij introduced the practical rhetorical and grammatical principles of writing effective proposals to the participants of the workshop.He informed the participants that proposal should include a working bibliography of key texts that inform about their study andmethodology.

Researcher should include all sources cited in his or her proposal. Session presented practical strategies, and it included examples of successful proposals. The session helped the participants to understand the rhetorical situation of the thesis proposal and common elements of such proposals. He explained the intricacies of research progress. He stressed that knowledge of applied statistics and IT tools was must for good research work. He explained the use of SPSS software package. This was followed by interactive session which proved to be enriching for all the participants.

The workshop ended with the valedictory session wherein participants were provided with the certificates of participation.

#### Panel Discussion on Goods & Service Tax

Date: 5th October, 2016

Venue: A.V hall

No. of Participants: 80

Objective of the activity: Introducing the concept of GST and its impact on Indian economy.

CA Yash Dhadda is a fellow member of The Institute of Chartered Accountants of India. He is associated with M/s Dhadda & Co as Senior Partner (Taxation). CA Jatin Harjai is a practising Chartered Accountant based out of Jaipur. He has expertise as a knowledgeable professional, advisor, & consultant in the field of financial consultancy and tax advisory. The discussion started with CA Jatin Harjai introducing the concept of GST. He discussed about Goods and services tax and its various types. He explained the various types of taxes in a very simple example of automobiles. He explained the various concepts like VAT, CST, Excise duty, Luxury Tax, Service Tax, Entertainment tax etc. He also told about the India's tax structure complications because of which investors leave investments in India. He thus emphasized on the importance and benefits of GST. He ended his discussion part with informing that GST is not tax to manufacture, sale, entry, admission, luxury or provision but tax on the supply of goods and services.

CA Yash Dadda conducted the second part of the discussion. He stressed at the point that, "Is GST really a single tax?" He basically informed about the disadvantages of GST. He told about why customs duty is called customs duty. He sarcastically said that it was in our tradition that people used to bring gifts for kings when they use to meet them so following that tradition we are also paying customs duty. He emphasized on one tax problem because of federalism in our country. He introduced the concept of uniform tax structure and polling of sovereignty of states at the center. He told about central GST, State GST, and integrated GST. He said that manufacturing states will have problem of GST as states purchasing will get GST not the states that are manufacturing. He also informed about the GST council, Union list, State list and Concurrent list. He ended his discussion part by talking about Intra-state supply and Inter-state supply and the respective taxes implied on these supplies.

The third speaker was CA Keshav Gupta who talked about impact of GST on various sectors. He told that to register for GST registration has to be done and he told about the threshold for registration. He also told the advantages and disadvantages of registration. He also talked about

INDIA who is liable to pay GST - suppliers and recipient of goods and service and features of audit under GST - turnover based audit and special audit. Coming to the point of impact of GST he informed that there is no exemption on test i.e. the burden to pay taxes will increase for consumer durables and textile/garments. Presently no tax is imposed on education sector i.e. school and colleges are not taxed for the services provided but after GST taxes will be paid on inputs. In case of banking and financial sector after GST will be implied tax horizon will expand. Small enterprises will be more compliance to pay tax as threshold limit will be free. And for automobiles taxes will be reduced from 30-40% to 20-23%.

Outcome of the Activity: The takeaways of panel discussion were that tax evasion will not be there, inflation will be controlled, multiple taxation will be reduced, increase in employability, compliances to pay taxes will increase and last but not the least no cascading effect. The panel discussion ended with questions asked by students of both the department who enthusiastically cleared all their queries by the help of our chief guest. Thus, the discussion proved to be very informative and it was very helpful for all the students who attended the session.

Objective of the seminar: The institutions of higher education in India are facing crucial challenge in creating, nurturing and maintaining the level of quality research. To operationalize this vision, there is need to train, reorient and reactivate the students on research methodology. The current workshop is an effort to enrich the students on research methodology.

The session started with the welcome of Dr. Neelima Gupta. She delivered lecture covering the various aspects of research methodology and scientific writing to incorporate the research acumen among the students. She stated that "if it is not published, it is not science." Science is the collection of observations, their interpretation and applications, which is converted in different forms of communication. The important aspect of scientific writing is that we must remember about reader while writing i.e. if we are successful in delivering our point of work to the reader then it is a good writing. In a good article there should be a flow in scientific article. In scientific writing, the introduction must be interesting and this interest must be followed up to the conclusion. Every part of an article is important.

She categorized scientific publications in three types- Primary, Secondary, Tertiary publications and explained all the components. She also explained the procedure for the selection of an appropriate journal for submission of a manuscript, submission procedure and their editorial procedure. We can select a journal for paper submission on basis of their publishers, subject and impact factor. After submission the manuscript is reviewed by the reviewers associated with that journal. They check for the validity of approach, originality, significance of report finding, interest, timeliness to scientific community and clarity.

Further she explained the writing of a review article. The schematic layout for preparation of review article is-

- 1. Collection of data
- 2. Collection of related literature
- 3. Writing an outline
- 4. Writing first draft
- 5. Use of highly specific scientific language

Two Week Workshop on Research Methodology

Date: 15th-28th June 2016

No. of Participants: 56

Research is a continuous process and requires progression to achieve meaningful results for the benefit of the society at large. Research Progression requires a logical and conceptual

knowledge. To meet this challenge it is necessary to train and equip the faculty and research

scholars so that they can comply with the quality standards of research in their respective

disciplines. To address these issues a Two Week Workshop was organized by The Centre for

Research, Innovation and Training, The IIS University, Jaipur. The workshop was designed to

achieve the following objectives:

• To make the participants familiar with the basic concepts of research methodology.

• To impart skills in the integration of qualitative and quantitative research.

To make the participants user friendly with the statistical softwares for data analysis.

To develop the applied research skills of the participants

The workshop was attended by 56 participants. The workshop focused on both qualitative and quantitative aspects of research. The detailed report of the workshop is as follows:

Day 1

The resource person for the day was Dr. Satish Kumar, MNIT, Jaipur. The topic of First session was Research Methodology: Conceptual Frame work. He discussed about the basic idea of research. He stated that researchers should make efforts to publish their articles only in peer reviewed and indexed journals. He talked about various aspects of qualitative research and stressed that researchers should focus on validity, legitimacy and generalization. In the subsequent sessions he elaborated on review of literature. He suggested that the researchers should read the book "Research Design" by Jennifer Walker to brush up their knowledge.

Day 2

Dr Satish Kumar, MNIT, Jaipur was the resource person. He explained the uses of Mendeley as a free reference manager, data manager for citation for academic and social network. He threw light on online bibliographic programmes. He explained about end notes and foot notes. He also elaborated on various types of research designs. He explained about descriptive and exploratory designs with the help of examples.

He gave information about the requirements of a good article. It should be original and should contribute to the existing body of literature. He explained about the steps of framing of paper and process of review of papers

#### Day 3

The sessions were taken by Prof. Sanket Vij, Bhagat Phool Singh Mahila Viswavidyalaya, Khanpur Kalan, Sonepat. The topic for the first session was Plagiarism. He explained the uses of citation builder and discussed the meaning and seriousness of plagiarism. The basics of SPSS and data entry were dealt with in the subsequent sessions. The last session was practice session.

#### Day 4

The sessions for the day were taken by Prof. Sanket Vij. He discussed about questionnaire building. He dealt at length with questionnaire framing and types of questions. He explained about data entry, data cleaning and outlier data. He stressed that data duplication should be avoided since it can be identified by SPSS. He explained the process of data selection in SPSS. The participants were also given practice of the same.

### Day 5

The expert for the sessions was Prof. Sanket Vij. He discussed about formulation of hypothesis and explained about null and alternate hypothesis. He emphasized that acceptance and rejection of hypothesis are research outcomes. He explained about the parametric tests of hypothesis testing. He elaborated on one sample t-test, independent sample t-test, paired t-test and ANOVA. In the last session of the day he focused on questionnaire designing. Various issues related to types of question, sequence of questions were addressed during this session.

#### Day 6

Dr. Ashwini Kumar, J.K. Lakshmipat University, Jaipur was the resource person for the day. He explained about various methods of data collection like observation and case study method. He discussed about writing a case and points to be kept in mind while case study like asking probing questions, noting down the details, avoiding any kind of argument, not evaluating the information simultaneously. The last session was devoted to questionnaire designing. Types of questions to be included, avoidance of overlapping categories, reliability and validity of the questionnaire were discussed.

## Day 7

The resource person for the day was Dr. Balwinder Saini, Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar. He discussed about parametric and non-parametric tests. Chi Square test of independence, chi-square test of goodness, spearman's correlation, phi- test, split file and weighed cases. He explained the steps of these tests with the help of examples. He apprised the participants about the software, the Sigma Plot, which can help us to decide the application of the type of tests. He also gave information about E-Views for regression. He also gave information about ETD, ETHOS and Australian Digital Thesis Programme for downloading thesis on various topics. He emphasized that curiosity is the basic need for learning any software.

#### Day 8

Dr. Neeraj Kaushik, NIT, Kurukshetra was the resource person for the day. He explained about Exploratory, Descriptive and Experimental research. He discussed about internet sources for collection of data. In the subsequent sessions he dealt with basic statistics, importance of statistical enquiries and their limitations, mean & median and elaborated on SPSS. He explained about measures of central tendency, measures of dispersion, moment & kurtosis and skewness.

#### Day 9

The resource person was Dr. Neeraj Kaushik. He expounded on universe, population and sampling. He discussed about the types of probability sampling with the help of examples. Detailed discussion was carried out on simple random sampling, stratified sampling, convenience sampling and snowball sampling. He stated that generally the social science and management researchers work on 5% confidence level. He also explained about sample size criteria, level of precision and degree of variability.

#### Day 10

Dr. Girish Taneja, DAV University, Jalandhar was the resource person. The session was on measures of association. He also explained the concept of variance and covariance. He explained about application of bivariate correlation, partial correlation, pearson's coefficient, spearmen's rank correlation and Kendall Tau. He explained bivariate regression with the help of a concept map. He also discussed assumptions of multiple regression He discussed the concept of Heteroscedacity and multi co linearity. The participants were also given practice in multiple regression on SPSS.

#### Day 11

The resource person for the sessions was Dr. Ajay Chauhan, IMT, Ghaziabad. Multi variate analysis was discussed in the first session. He explained about Exploratory factor analysis and Confirmatory Factor Analysis and Analytic Hierarchy Process. He also introduced the participants to AMOS commands for analyzing constructs. The AMOS Commands for EFA and CFA were also explained. The participants were given practice in model construction using AMOS.

#### **Day 12**

The sessions were taken by Dr. Ajay Chauhan. The sessions were on Structural Equation Modelling and Path Analysis. He stated that SEM is a widely used multivariate statistical method in the area of social science. It is used for analyzing cause and effect relationships among a set of constructs represented by multiple measurable variables in a single model. SEM uses the concepts of both regression analysis and exploratory factor analysis. The applications of SEM were explained with the help of examples. The AMOS commands of SEM were explained and the participants were given an exercise on SEM. The basics of conjoint analysis were also explained.

#### **Day 13**

The resource person for the session was Prof. Nisha Yadav, Department of Sociology, The IIS University, Jaipur. She delivered lecture on Philosophy of Social Research. She elaborated on ontology, epistemology, axiology and rhetoric. She explained about research paradigm. She stated that paradigm serves as a framework for guiding research. She also explained about Symbolic Interactionism and Critical Research. Positivist Paradigm and Interpretive Paradigm. The resource person for the next session was Prof. Uma Joshi, Amity University, Jaipur. She gave her lecture on Qualitative Analysis: Content Analysis of Verbatim Expression (CAVE Technique). She discussed about behavior, event and interview. She also discussed about tests to measure competency. The next session was quiz session. The participants were given fifty questions based on the topics covered in the sessions.

#### Day 14

Prof. Vinay Srivastava, University of Delhi, New Delhi was the resource person for the day. He reflected on various aspects of qualitative research. He elaborated on the domains of research. He explained about Ethno-methodology and stressed that interpretative understanding of the

Logical and conceptual knowledge is a prerequisite of sound research. The aim of the 7-Day

workshop on research methodology was to promote research acumen among young researchers

in the faculties of Arts and Social Sciences and Commerce and Management. The Centre for

Research, Innovation and Training, The IIS University, Jaipur with the following objectives

organized from the workshop 4-10 April, 2016:

To enable the participants to conduct effective qualitative and quantitative research.

To familiarize the participants with the basics of data handling and analysis.

To give hands on experience in research to the participants through the practical work

assigned to them.

To enable the participants to develop research plan proposal.

To develop the applied research skills of the participants.

There were three sessions of one and a half hour each. The workshop was attended by 35

participants from various universities.

**DAYI** 

The sessions on day one were devoted to Problem Identification & Review of Literature. The

resource person for the sessions was Prof. N. K. Garg, Dept. of Commerce, MDS University

Rohtak. Prof Garg enlightened the students on the basics of formulating a research problem and

proper referencing. The students were exposed to several techniques of looking for research

problems and giving citations to sources. The last session of the day was planned to give practice

to the participants on the learning of the day.

**DAY II** 

The second day of the workshop was planned to update the participants about research designs,

experimental designs and measurement of scales. The first session of the day was taken by Prof.

Jalpur-302020 (Raj.) INDIA

Ameeta Sharma, Dept. of Statistics, University of Rajasthan. Prof. Sharma taught the basics of research designs to the participants. Her lecture covered the important types of research designs such as experimental, correlational, case study, survey and longitudinal. During the second session of the day Dr. Bhawana Arya, Dept. of Psychology, The IIS University, Jaipur talked in detail about the designs in experimental research. The participants were made familiar with the different designs followed in experimental research and the strengths and limitations of each type of design. Since an effective designs ensures an effective research, the session delved into the importance of research designs. The third session of the day was taken by Prof. Nisha Yadav, Dept. of Sociology, The IIS University, Jaipur. Prof. Yadav apprised the students with the different types of scales and the procedure of their construction. The students learned the basics of scale construction.

#### DAY III

The third day of the workshop was dedicated to teaching the research scholars effective methods of conducting review of literature identify research gaps and arrive at a research problem. The resource person for all the three sessions was Dr. Satish Kumar, Dept. of Management, MNIT, Jaipur. Dr. Kumar demonstrated effective ways to extract data from online databases and identify valid research gaps which can be subsequently taken up as research questions. He also did a lot of exercises with the participants to ensure maximum learning. The last session of the day was a practice session for participants, supervised by Dr. Kumar. The students tried to identify gaps and write research questions.

#### **DAY IV**

Day five was scheduled for variable selection and hypothesis formulation. Dr. Ashwini Kumar, Dept. of Management, JKLU, Jaipur was the resource person for the day. The first session was dedicated to selection of variable and their measurement. Dr. Ashwini shared with the students the classification of variables into dependent and independent variable. Variables can vary between people (IQ, Height), places (weather, unemployment) or time (profit, sales, motivation, absenteeism, productivity). In the second session, Dr. Ashwini talked about the various types of hypothesis. The important things while framing a hypothesis include level of significance, confidence level, one-tailed Vs two-tailed tests and power of test. The third session of the day was designed as the practice session to enable to the participants to apply the knowledge gained



during the first two sessions. They completed worksheets to practice variable selection and hypothesis formulation.

#### DAY V

The first session of day five focused on the tools of data collection. Data for research can be collected through interview, schedule and many other secondary sources. The resource person for this session was Prof. N.D. Mathur, Dept. of EAFM, University of Rajasthan. Prof. Mathur delved into the details of data collection through primary and secondary sources. He also talked about the common mistakes made by research scholars while collecting data. According to him secondary sources have their own importance and all data sources should be handled with care. The second session was also taken by Prof. Mathur in which he talked about ethical report writing and writing a research proposal. Plagiarism is a major problem of research writing. He shared many tips with the participants to avoid plagiarism. The final session was designed to give practical exposure to the participants. The session was facilitated by Dr. Bhawana Arya. In this session, the students were asked to start working on a research proposal which was to be presented on the final day of the workshop.

#### DAY VI


Day six of the workshop was dedicated to develop the skills of questionnaire formation in the participants. The sessions were conducted by Prof. Sanket Viz, Dept. of Management, BPS Mahila Vishwa Vidyalaya, Sonepat. The students understood the steps in the formation of a questionnaire. Prof. Viz. talked about the different types of questions with their strengths and limitations. An adequately designed questionnaire leads to collection of relevant data for the purpose of research. The last session was designed as a practice session for the participants. Prof. Viz guided the participants through the process of developing a questionnaire.

#### **DAY VII**

The final day of the workshop was dedicated to the presentations of research proposals by the participants. The resource person for the day was Prof. Vinay Srivastava, Dept. of Social Anthropology, University of Delhi. In the first session Prof. Srivastava talked in detail about the field research. Ethnography and its importance in social science research was discussed at length. The remaining sessions saw the presentation of the research proposal prepared by the



participants. Prof. Srivastava listened to each proposal and provided his valuable suggestions to the participants. The sessions were followed by valediction. Prof. Srivastava gave away the certificates to all the participants.

# **Demonstration on Drawing in charcoal**

A Demonstration on drawing in charcoal was given by Mr. Steve Johnson, Associate Professor, of art at he College of Charleston, Charleston. Through this demonstration students discovered a unique set of tools and techniques designed to refine the portrait into its purest, gestural manner. The exercise was designed for two hours to establish easy-to-follow anatomical formulas and increase recognition of important torso landmarks. The demonstration consisted of a single long pose in both cool and warm light. The development of torso structure through practice and interpretation of plane shifts projecting and receding was stressed during the lecture. Aspects of anatomy, proportion and movement were discussed along with the instructions of using the dry pastel technique. The students asked many questions regarding the use of various types of material. After the demonstration the artist comforted the students with the answers, Students were given sheets to draw the model while understanding the mode of light and shade, the posture in which the model was seated, the anatomy and the muscular built. Mr. Steve drew various postures of the same model in speed drawing. He asked the students to observe the subject in just one glance and to remove eyes from there and whatever captured should be drawn in one single stroke. This exercise develops observation, understanding of various curves and shapes and memory drawing. Later in the class of Life Study, students tried this learning and could come to know that this kind of exercise develops confidence, creativity, strengthens memory and opens mind. In all this exercise made students confident and creative.

The workshop communicated about various research methods, research processes, use of research tools and techniques, writing skills to the young researchers. The workshop endeavored to prepare participants to approach research in rational way, streamline the research question and pointed in context to empirical data collection strategies.

Prof. R.K. Bansal, Emeritus Professor, Department of Chemistry delivered the first talk on formulation research problem and keenly discussed the importance of scientific research in one personal and professional growth. Protection of Plant Varieties and Farmer's Rights Authority (PPVFRA), Ministry of Agriculture & Farmer's Welfare, Government of India, New Delhi sponsors the program. The Protection of Plant Variety and Farmers Right Act, 2001 (PPVFR Act) is an Act of the Parliament of India enacted to provide for the establishment of an effective system for protection of plant varieties, the rights of farmers and plant breeders, and to encourage the development and cultivation of new varieties of plants. This Act received the assent of the President of India on the October 30, 2001. A Seminar on Protection of Plant Varieties and Farmer's Rights was organized on March 10, 2016 by Intellectual Property Management Cell (IPMC), The IIS University, Jaipur. # National Seminar on Higher Education in 2025: Growth, Opportunities and Challenges

Date: 20th -21st November 2015

No. of Participants: 157

Higher Education in India has in recent years, undergone a considerable change. With over 600 million people under 25 years of age, the system is under tremendous pressure to expand. Many trends are emerging in the key areas of higher education, research and innovation. The access to technology, social mobility of community, patterns of funding for the organizations in this sector, increasing significance of research and diversification of the education system, have acted as accelerators of transformation. Educational institutions and universities should in an appropriate manner respond to this paradigm shift, and adapt to the growing need of young India towards higher education. Across the globe the higher education sector is an important player in introducing innovative approaches along with sustaining pressures of running a large institution controlled by external factors such as rankings, increasing competition among students, attracting intellectual faculty and confronting in-house pressures from the boards. To address these issues and to explore trends, innovation and research in higher education a two-day National Seminar on "Higher Education in 2025: Growth, Challenges and Opportunities" was organized on 20- 21 November, 2015 by the Centre for Research, Innovation and Training, The IIS University, Jaipur and sponsored by ICSSR with the following objectives:

- To promote effective institutional practices aimed at improving the quality of higher education.
- To device and develop strategies to retain high quality faculty.
- To bring renewed awareness of the various aspects of governance and reforms in leadership structures.
- To analyze the sustainability of corporate-academia partnerships in higher education.
- To explore the infrastructural changes required in higher education.
- To advance the innovative practices in research.
- To discuss the role of funding agencies in expanding higher education.
- To explore the future prospects in research and higher education.



The seminar was divided into the inaugural session, four technical sessions and the valedictory session. First technical session was devoted to panel discussion and the other three technical sessions comprised expert talks followed by paper presentations. In all, sixty five papers were received from different parts of the country.

The inaugural session of the seminar began with lamp lighting and Saraswati Vandana. Dr. Ashok Gupta, the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor of the University, gave the welcome address and thanked the Indian Council of Social Science Research for extending support in organizing this seminar. He stated that a paradigm shift is taking place in higher education and the institutions should respond to the changing needs of the society. He was confident that the deliberations at the seminar will help us examine the issues related to higher education in a critical manner and lay out strategies for addressing this phase of transition.

The Aims and Objectives of the seminar were highlighted by Dr. Subhash Garg, Dean & Director, Centre for Research, Innovation and Training, The IIS University, Jaipur. He stated that this seminar is an attempt to review the existing educational policies as well as to identify those models of teaching and learning which will raise standards of higher education in India and make it globally competitive.

The inaugural address was delivered by Prof. Arun K. Pujari, Vice Chancellor, Central University of Rajasthan, Kishangarh. He said that it is important to analyze the past, present and future of education. He threw light on reasons for changing attitude of the people imparting and receiving education. Academic community, institutions and society are creating situations which is finally resulting in change in expectations. He focused on equity, excellence and employability as the important factors in higher education. He elaborated on the above factors with examples. He stressed that the challenge for 2025 is to motivate the private agencies for funding research in order to achieve excellence in education. He also emphasized that higher education should be co-related with society.

On this occasion a souvenir of the seminar was also released by Prof. Arun K. Pujari. Prof. Raakhi Gupta, Rector& Registrar of the University delivered the vote of thanks. She emphasized that entrepreneurial skills should be developed among the students. She thanked the resource persons, participants, guests and the organizing committee for their contribution and collective efforts.

#### **TECHNICAL SESSION I**

The topic for panel discussion in this session was 'Higher education in 2025'. The chairperson of the session was Prof. B.P. Singh, Chairman, Society for Human Transformation and Research, New Delhi. The panel experts were Prof. Devi Singh, Vice Chancellor, FLAME University, Pune, Prof. V. K.Tewari, Retd. Principal, DAV College Jalandhar, Prof. N.D. Mathur, University of Rajasthan, Jaipur, Prof. Nisha Yadav, Department of Sociology, The IIS University, Jaipur and Prof. Manju Nair, Principal, ISIM, Jaipur The session was co-ordinated by Dr. Shweta Kastiya and Dr. Payal Mehtani, The IIS University, Jaipur.

Prof. Devi Singh presented his views on 'Future Road Map of Higher Education'. He stated that Indian Higher Education system is at the cusp of a big transformation and we need to create additional capacity to train 140 million people in the age group of 18-23 by 2025. He opined that education is supposed to transform the individual, society, nation and the world. He stressed that to achieve positive transformation we require innovative and structural changes in curriculum and pedagogy, faculty development, research and outreach, use of technology and governance.

Prof. V. K. Tewari discussed about 'GATS and Higher Education'. He threw light on various aspects of GATS and reflected on its implications on higher education. He expressed his concern about education being moved from non-profit sector to profit sector and reduction of government subsidies. He stressed that higher education should be built according to the constitution which categorically specifies that education is a non profit sector and we should not violate the basic fundamentals of our constitution by privatizing education sector.

Prof. N.D. Mathur reflected on 'Higher Education in 2025: Shifting Dynamics'. He highlighted the major trends in education and discussed how education is changing with technology, behaviour and cultural expectations. He stated that future education will be technology driven and it will shift from physical form to virtual form. He was hopeful that by 2025 India will be known for intellectual sharpness, quality of skills, educational institutions and edu-nationalism i.e a nation build by higher education.

Prof. Nisha Yadav elaborated on education for whom and knowledge for what. She stressed that higher education should have the goal of social development and well being. It should be reflective and critical. She said that there is a large gap between theory and practice. This disconnect needs to be addressed by 2025. She suggested that a new model is required for

collaboration between research and society so that effective knowledge transfer takes place. She concluded her lecture by highlighting the importance of knowledge transfer.

Prof. Manju Nair expounded on the challenges of higher education through AEQ Model where A stands for access, E stands for equity and Q stands for quality. She discussed about curriculum, pedagogy, research and infrastructure. She stressed that project based study and blended learning models should be promoted in higher education. She also recommended that life long learning should be made an integral part of higher education and there should be flexibility for the learner at entry and exit points.

The panel discussion was followed by question -answer session with the participants. The participants raised several questions related to challenges in higher education, privatization of higher education and modes of funding. The panel discussion and the interactive session proved to an enriching and intellectually stimulating experience for the participants.

#### **TECHNICAL SESSION II**

The second technical session was devoted to the issue of 'Quality Education'. This chairperson of the session was Prof. Devi Singh, Vice Chancellor, FLAME University, Pune. The resource persons were Dr. Nidhi S. Sabharwal, Centre for Policy Research in Higher Education, National University of Educational, Planning and Administration, New Delhi and Prof. V.K.Tewari, Retd. Principal, DAV College, Jalandhar. The session coordinators were Dr. Mani Bhatia and Ms. Risha Kalra, The IIS University, Jaipur

Dr. Nidhi S. Sabharwal delivered her lecture on the topic 'Equity as Quality: Student Diversity as a Resource for Quality Higher Education'. She opined that equity is a major concern in the expansion of higher education in India and stressed that student diversity is a resource for developing empowered learners. She discussed student diversity in the context of higher education and shared data from national sample survey organization. She illuminated on various aspects like gender, socio economic strata as a measure of diversity. She emphasized that it is essential that higher education does not limit itself only to prepare a workforce with technical skills but also democratic skills that prepares them to respect differences in the society. Prof. V. K. Tewari talked about the role of teachers and teacher organizations in higher education. He stressed that fair conduct of examination and evaluation is the backbone of education. Teachers have a pivotal role to play in a nation's development. There is need for continuous improvement and development of teaching learning skills. He said that it is the



teachers who can bring the economically backward student to the forefront and educate them. He cast his guarded doubt on the policy of uniform syllabi in all the central universities and expressed concern about privatization and commoditization of education.

The expert talks were followed by paper presentations on various aspects of quality education, like Global Higher Education Hubs: A New Era of Quality Education, Gap between Expectations of Employers and Higher Education, Women's Studies in Higher Education etc. This session brought forth many innovative suggestions for improvement in higher education.

#### TECHNICAL SESSION III

The second day of the seminar began with Technical Session III on the theme 'Governance: Leadership and Partnership'. This session was chaired by Prof. A.N. Rai, Former Vice-Chancellor of Mizoram University & North-Eastern Hill University, Shillong and Former Director of NAAC. Prof. B.P.Singh, Chairman, Society for Human Transformation and Research, New Delhi and Prof. K.S. Sharma, Advisor, The IIS University, Jaipur were the invited speakers in the session. The session was coordinated by Dr. Meenakshi Sharma and Ms. Geetika Vyas, The IIS University, Jaipur.

Prof. B. P Singh, started by remembering and highlighting the glorious history of India in terms of higher education since the era of Nalanda and Takshila. He then focused on the current scenario of higher education in India. He showed the quantitative dimensions of growth of universities and colleges in India from 1970 to 2015. He discussed the challenges like low gross enrolment ratio, lack of qualified faculty, accreditation system, financial constraints and poor focus on research and employability. He stated that investment in human capital formation is very critical for transforming the quality of life of Indians. He forcefully expressed that the higher education system is examination oriented, whereas it should be value oriented, skill oriented and human formation oriented.

Prof. K. S. Sharma stated that accreditation is an important aspect when we refer to the quality of educational institutions. He discussed at length the parameters used in international ranking system. He showed the rankings of Indian institutions declared by various ranking agencies and elaborated on the reasons for low ranking of Indian institutions. He suggested that the government and the teachers should make rigorous efforts to improve the current situation of higher education in India.

The expert talks were followed by paper presentations. The papers were on topics like Open Educational Resources, Concerns about Autonomy and Academic Freedom, Role of Policy and Regulatory Framework in Development of Higher Education in India etc.

# **TECHNICAL SESSION IV**

The theme of the session was 'Infrastructure and Research Funding in Higher Education'. This session was chaired by Prof. Jayanta K. Parida, Utkal University, Bhubneshwar, and President, Indian Commerce Association. The invited speakers of the session were Prof. P.K. Chaubey, Indian Institute of Public Administration, New Delhi and Prof. V.K. Shrotriya, School of Economics, University of Delhi, New Delhi. The session coordinators were Dr. Sarabjeet Kaur and Dr. R.K.Tailor.

Prof. J.K. Parida delivered his expert talk on the topic 'University-Industry Interface for Sustainable Economic Development'. He highlighted that due to the forces of globalization and liberalization there is a need to tune the higher education system in accordance with the changing market requirements. He stressed that the mind of the students should be directed towards development through university-industry interface. For this purpose the experience and knowledge of the professors and students should be exchanged with the skills, requirements and practicability of the industry. He explained the benefits of this interface and suggested various measures to overcome the barriers.

Prof. P. K. Chaubey delivered his lecture on the topic 'Public- Private Partnership in Higher Education: Examining the Case for India'. He discussed about various public private-partnership models and the current policies of government on education. He focused on the shifting government stand on higher education. He stated that private participation should be promoted for various activities like outsourcing, training, governance and sponsoring long term projects. He concluded that minimum standards have to be ensured through regulation and mandatory compliance. He recommended that education sector be kept non-commercial, so that the prospects of keeping it inclusive remained bright.

Prof. V.K. Shrotriya discussed about various aspects of Governance and Research funding. He opined that higher education institutes should find new ways of increase research funding apart from government grants.

The valedictory address was given by Prof. A.N. Rai, Former Director, NAAC. In his valedictory address Prof. Rai talked about the need for a national quality assurance framework for higher education in light of RUSA and mandatory accreditation regime. He advocated that the accreditation bodies in India should take a cue from global practices to develop a credible mechanism. Vote of thanks was given by Ms. Risha Kalra, The IIS University, Jaipur.

4-Day Workshop on Teaching Methodology

Jaipur with the following objectives:

The current and impending social changes require radical educational responses. It has become imperative that traditional teaching methods are evaluated and new innovative methods are used to enhance learning and to make the classroom non monotonous. Teaching approach is shifting from teacher centered to learner centered approach. Education is a vision of future and the purpose of education is considered to be that of cultivating the spirit of innovation and fostering creativity among students. The role of a teacher has to be changed from that of an instructor to an agent of learning by enhancing their teaching competencies. To address these issues a four-day workshop on "Teaching Methodology" was organized from 5th - 8th August, 2015 by Centre for Research, Innovation and Training and Internal Quality Assurance Cell, The IIS University,

- To make the faculty participants familiar and friendly with the innovative tools of teaching and learning.
- To incorporate instructional designs to promote student engagement.
- Strategies to be used to inside and outside the classroom for encouraging the culture of learning.

The workshop began with the welcome note by Prof. Subhash Garg, Dean & Director, Centre for Research, Innovation and Training, The IIS University, Jaipur. He highlighted the aims and objectives of the workshop and expressed confidence that the training sessions at the workshop will help the teachers to examine the teaching strategies in a critical manner and build a foundation for creative and interesting teaching—learning strategies.

One hundred and fifty five faculty members of The IIS University, Jaipur participated in the workshop. ## **Training Session I**

The Resource Person for the session was Prof. N.D. Mathur, University of Rajasthan, Jaipur. The topic of the session was "Dynamics of Teaching". Prof. Mathur highlighted various aspects of inclusive teaching and the role of teacher as counsellor, communicator, collaborator and as role model. He dealt at length with the pyramid of teaching which highlighted Must, Should and Could of teaching and discussed the qualities of a creative teacher. He also analyzed the problems of teaching and the hierarchical patterns in all areas of education.

## **Training Session II**

The topic of the session was "Teaching Aids for Effective Teaching". The Resource Person for the session was Prof. N.D. Mathur. Various aspects of effective teaching methods like case study, brain storming, group exercises, simulations, role play and use of visual aids were discussed. Group activity was also undertaken during this session which highlighted the importance of team work.

# **Training Session III**

The third training session was on 'Teaching, Learning Process: Challenges and Instructional Strategies'. The resource person for the session was Prof. M.C. Sharma, Director, School of Education, Indira Gandhi National Open University, New Delhi. He stressed that learner's experience and learner's appraisal are important aspects of teaching learning process. He explained the challenges of education in context of explosion of knowledge, increased enrolment of learners, learning society, information and communication technology and value based education. He explained various learner centric instructional strategies which included computer assisted learning, culture specific pedagogy, blended learning using ICT and programmed learning strategy.

### **Training Session IV**

The fourth training session was on "Class-Room Management and Recent trends in Educational Evaluation". The resource person was Prof. M.C. Sharma. The focus of this session was on management of human and non-human resources in the classroom. Prof. Sharma dealt with the principles and processes of classroom management which included clarity and competence, participation, democratic behaviour, self control and flexibility. He also discussed the purpose of internal assessment, marking and grading system and developing a question bank. He drew attention to the features of good evaluation as validity, reliability and objectivity. The session

was then opened for discussion with the participants. The discussion revolved around problems of management of large number of students and assessment.

### Parallel Training Sessions V (A) & VI (B)

This session was for the Faculty of Commerce & Management and Faculty of Arts & Social Sciences. The topic of the session was "Case Study Method of Teaching". The resource person for the session was Dr. Ashwini Kumar, J.K. Lakshmipat Singhania University, Jaipur. He introduced case study method as a form of instructor guided, discussion based learning. He also described various stages of case analysis.

Group activity was undertaken during which the participants were divided into ten groups. Each group was given a case for SWOT analysis which was continued in the next session. The group representatives were asked to present their SWOT analysis. The analysis was then refined by the resource person and linked to theoretical aspects. Overall it was a good learning and educative experience for the participants.

# Parallel Training Sessions V (B) &VI (B)

This session was organized for the Faculty of Science keeping in mind their specific needs of teaching learning strategies. The resource person for both the sessions was Prof. Ravi Prakash, M.D. University, Rohtak. The topic for the sessions was "True education and Milestones for Success". He discussed about learning experiences from nature and about various parameters of success.

## Parallel Training Session VII (A) & VIII(A)

This was a joint session for Faculty of Commerce and management and Arts & Social Sciences. The resource person for the session was Prof. Sanket Viz, BPS Women's University, Sonepat. The topic of the session was 'Applied Research as an Effective tool to enhance Class-Room Teaching-learning Process'. He discussed the use of applied research in teaching-learning strategies. This session was based on group activity. The participants were divided into 12 interdisciplinary groups. The groups were asked to choose a topic of their choice from the list supplied by the resource person. The groups were then asked to prepare a questionnaire based on their topic. This activity was continued in the next session. The questionnaires framed by different groups were then distributed among the participants. The filled questionnaires were discussed by the resource person. He enlightened the participants on various techniques of



framing a good questionnaire and anlaysis of data. The participants enthusiastically participated in the group activity.

## Parallel Training Sessions VII (B) & VIII(B)

The resource for the sessions was Prof. Ravi Prakash. The topic of the session was 'Biological Organization'. He discussed about system biology, interaction at ecosystem level which include predation and competition. Further, Hardy Weinberg's law and its application for human health was illustrated. Prof. Prakash also stressed the importance of reading books for enhancement of knowledge.

The workshop on teaching methodology was an enriching experience and enhanced the understanding of various teaching learning strategies and also innovative methods of teaching. The workshop succeeded in bringing to light the latest trends in the teaching learning process which will prove to be enriching for the faculty in the times to come.

# Calligraphy Workshop

In the art field it is important to have knowledge of writing- styles, fonts as it is applicable in each design. Here comes the art of Calligraphy. It is the design and execution of lettering with a broad-tipped instrument, brush, or other writing instrument. To make our students well equipped in this field, a three day "Calligraphy Workshop" was organized by the department. Shri Harishankar Balothia, an eminent Calligraphy artist and a professional graphic designer from Jaipur was the key person. 76 students took part with enthusiasm and registered for this workshop. He made the students aware of how and where the skill can be used in the market in the form of wedding invitations and event invitations, font design and typography, original hand-lettered logo design, religious art, announcements, graphic design and commissioned calligraphic art, cut stone inscriptions, and memorial documents, for testimonials, birth and death certificates, maps, and other written works.

Balothia Ji patiently explained and demonstrated the art and various techniques of calligraphy. As shown by him, ways of doing calligraphy included: pen loading, writing speed, nib pressure, the angle of both nib and pen shaft, fine entry and exit strokes, flicks and pen manipulations that follow-through and other body movements; and rhythm. Sir broached the concepts of traditional and contemporary calligraphy.


On the first day he made the students aware of the history of writing and the word 'Calligraphy'. Later he explained the types of it and how they differ from each other. He took out his tools and demonstrated them according to the styles developed during the past centuries. He showed students how the pen, brush or any tool is gripped and moved to create interesting fonts and stylised writing. He showcased his own work of calligraphy to make the students interested. He distributed some of his own created stick calligraphy pens. The students were personally guided in trying out different styles of fonts. Second day was for creation of artwork in the own unique styles developed by the students. During the workshop the students were given assignments to write in the manner taught. He taught to write with brush, pen, kalam, and with the back of the brush even.

On the second day the students were more interested to learn this art form. They were discussing the work done by them which was given as assignments the day before. He made corrections
