## INDIAN SOCIETY FOR THE STUDY OF REPRODUCTION & FERTILITY (ISSRF)

The Indian Society for the Study of Reproduction and Fertility (ISSRF) was formed and registered in 1988 with the objective of providing a common scientific platform for all the scientists / specialists interested in the common cause of promoting reproductive health research. Over the years, the mandate of the Society has broadened and includes various multidisciplinary components of reproductive health. The strength of the Society has also grown phenomenally to almost 1300 Founder and Life Members who represent biomedical sciences, social sciences, veterinary sciences, clinical specialists in particular the obstetrics and gynecology and andrology, health care providers and woman's health groups.

One of the most regular activities of the Society has been its annual meetings wherein the scientists belonging to the broad area of reproductive health gather to discuss newer developments in the area. To date more than 45 national and international conferences have been organized and the proceedings of most of them have been published. Young scientists are particularly encouraged to participate in the meetings by way of financial support, holding special sessions and presenting awards for the best presentations. On the recommendations of the General Body/Executive Committee, the Society has instituted following awards: (i) Labhsetwar Award, (ii) Founder President Dr. T. C. Anand Kumar Memorial Oration, (iii) Prof. G. P. Talwar Young Scientist Award, (iv) Prof. G. P. Talwar Gold Medal for Middle Career Scientists, (v) Prof. L. S. Ramaswami Memorial Oration, (vi) Prof. N. R. Moudgal Memorial Oration, (vii) Prof. N. R. Moudgal young scientist awards and (viii) Lifetime Achievement Award for outstanding research contributions on different aspects of Reproductive Health. These awards are given at the Annual meetings of the Society.

The other initiative of the Society has been the publication of its quarterly Newsletter, ISSRF Newsletter, to disseminate information on reproductive health and also facilitate interpersonal communication between the members.

## JAIPUR

Jaipur, the city of victory, capital of Rajasthan, famous as "Pink City" the world over is placed in Western part of India and it is known for its cultural heritage and palaces. A big fleet of deluxe and air conditioned buses is operated by the Rajasthan State Road Transport Corporation and Rajasthan Tourism Development Corporation (RTDC) between Delhi and Jaipur. There is also a special luxury train, the palace on wheels, starting from Delhi on a round trip of Rajasthan, first stop being Jaipur. It is well connected to other parts of the country by a good network of air, rail and road connection. Other famous cities well connected to Jaipur within 500 km range are Jodhpur, Udaipur, Bikaner, Jaisalmer, Ajmer, Chittorgarh, Mount Abu, Agra and Chandigarh. Jaipur offers a wide variety of accommodation ranging from five star deluxe palace hotels to budget hotels.
