
Chrysolis, the e-cell showcased 25 stalls on campus at the "Student Bazar" which gained tremendous response from students as well as staff members.





MBA EXECUTIVE COURSE

An MBA helps you polish your leadership, managerial and communication skills to climb up to various levels of hierarchy in an organisation. The IIS University provides an MBA Executive (Part time) course which is a three year course for working executives. It is a part time dual specialization course meant for male and female professionals, helping them get a better understanding and grasp over areas such as human resource, marketing, international business, IT and finance. It also enables the individual to pursue a PhD. The course has a revised and updated content with specially selected core faculty. This programme is not a distance learning course and is available for only those who have graduated (50%) from a recognized university along with a minimum of two years of work experience after graduation. Since it is a specifically designed for professionals, classes are held in evenings (6 pm to 8 pm) at IIIM Mansarover, Jaipur.
