# **AN INDUSTRIAL VISIT TO DEV MILK FOODS PVT LTD**

**Jaipur, Rajasthan**

**(On 23 September, 2017)**

The first industrial visit of YUVA session 2017-18, was organised to the Dev Milk Foods Pvt. Ltd., Fru Bon ice cream plant in which 44 students participated. The company is wholly owned company of the Dev Milk Foods pvt, ltd. It manufactures market & sells milk and butter products under the Fru Bon brand (Ice-cream, Cookies, Bread and Rusk).

The plant was divided into 2 parts: Production plant of cookies and Production plant of ice - creams. Firstly introduce with the production plant of Cookies in which there is a production of cookies, breads, rusk etc and which is also divided into hot production and cold production. Then, there was an introduction of various machines like dough making machine (it has a capacity of producing 40kg in 10 mins), loaf maker, fermentation chamber and rotary oven (which has in built burner and fan). Then, secondly production plant of Ice Cream in which firstly they test the ingredients like sugar, butter, flavours whether it is upto the quality or not. Moreover, production itself a process for converting the raw material into finished product after passing though different types of process steps. In the other words production process is a combination of collectively taken certain steps to receive finished final product. There are around 68 variety of ice-creams along with bread, cookies etc.

The industrial visit gives a lot of information about various aspects of production, marketing as well as the operation of a company. The dissemination of knowledge by the support organization also gives a clear scope to the transactional analysis of the company. After conducting a survey of the company we found that there is a bigger market for the biscuits, ice - creams and confectionary in unorganized retail stores if proper supply of goods without breakage is there. It is also concluded that taste is the first preference of the both customers as well as retailers. Because of its brand quality & price it is capable of dominating the volume of dominated market due to its brand equity and better production strategy.

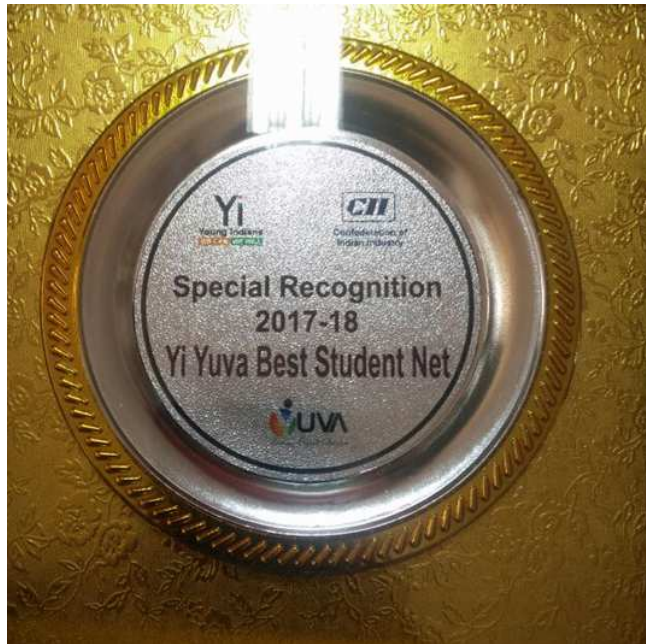

It was indeed very knowledgeable and helpful session for the students.



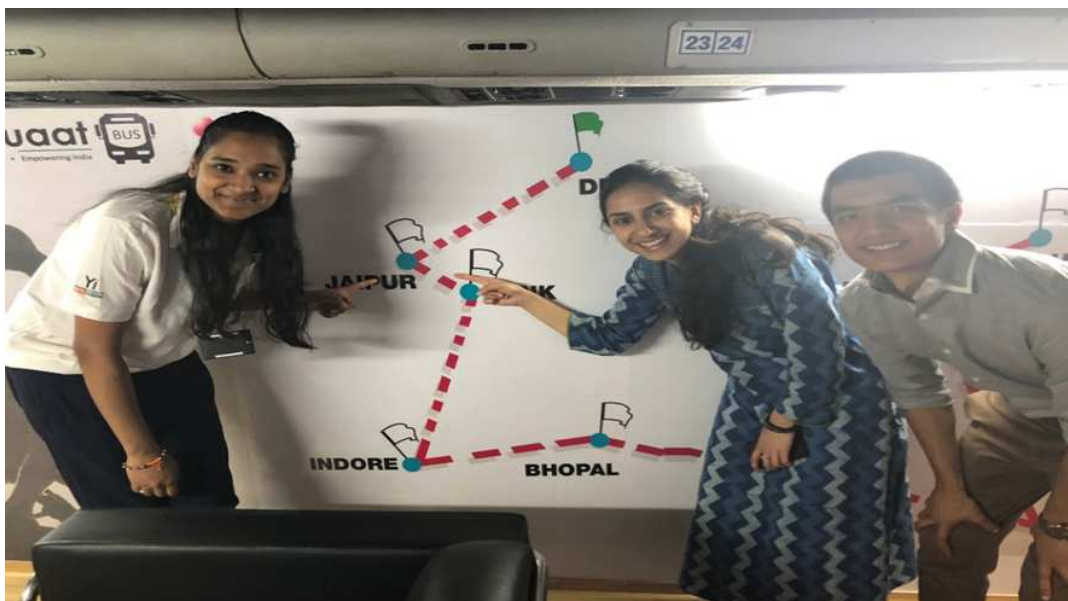
## SHURAAAT BUS
