Objective of the Extension Activity

- To enhance the financial knowledge of participants
- To apprise the participants about wealth management

Summary

A workshop was organized by the Faculty Development Committee, IIS (Deemed to be University), Jaipur on the theme, “Bridging the Gender Gap in Finance” by the FDP committee on 5 March 2023. The curated workshop was preceded by Money Personality Test for exploring the unique money mind set of individuals. The Resource Person was Ms. Nidhi Sachdeva from SALT. She was accompanied by Ms. Preksha from SALT. She explained the basic concepts of money management and opined that financial management is a series of cumulative life experiences. She busted several myths about money and stated that 72 percent Indians are unaware about how to put aside money for financial freedom. She shared the financial wellness checklist with the participants and threw light on broad ideas of investible surplus, savings and investments. She also discussed about investment in gold, real estate, equity insurance and offshore investment. Gold and fixed deposits are safe investments but the rewards are less. She also explained about large, mid and small cap and stressed that there should be some planning to beat inflation. Investment should be planned in different assests. She encouraged the participants to take calculated risks because the return potential is more. The participants enthusiastically participated and raised several queries about financial management. The participants were also familiarized SALT’s proprietary tools to enable them to create a personalized financial plan.

Outcome

The workshop enhanced the financial literacy of the participants so as to bridge the gap between life of dreams and current money habits. The participants also

learnt how to analyse their portfolio and plan for wealth management according to their needs and desires.




Analysis of Feedback provided by participants

1. Please rate your knowledge-level with respect to the topic covered in the workshop **before** attending the workshop.





Objective of FDP

- To upskill and drive professional development
- To familiarize the participants with contemporary student engagement strategies

Summary

A Faculty Enrichment Session was organized by the Faculty Development Committee, IIS (Deemed to be University), Jaipur on the theme, “Student Engagement and Enrichment Strategies” on 8 July 2023. The resource person for the session was Mr. Sandeep Menghani, Management Professional. He discussed student engagement strategies so that all kinds of students are engaged in the teaching learning process as some are visual learners, some are auditory learners and some are kinestics. He stated that role of a teacher is more of a facilitator. The teachers should share their life experiences with students to encourage them and enrich their academic journey. The session revolved around various psychological theories that explain human behavior. The speaker emphasized the importance of creating a safe space for students within the educational environment. He highlighted the need for teachers to acquire knowledge and skills in operating artificial intelligence (AI) systems and utilizing prompts effectively. This was identified as a crucial requirement in the current era. He also emphasized the significance of working on one's own attitude and personality as educators. The teachers were encouraged to prioritize their mental, physical, emotional, and spiritual well-being. This included engaging in activities such as exercise, meditation, and staying updated with the latest news. He suggested replacing obsolete textbooks with contemporary and relevant information to enhance the learning experience of the students. Additionally, various activities were organized as icebreakers to foster rapport and empathy among the teachers. The participants were asked to

fill Circle of Influence worksheet and Self- Evaluation Checklist. The program celebrated teachers' achievements and provided a platform for them to share their victories. Finally, self-assessment was conducted by the teachers to gain insights into their current standing and establish their future goals. This enabled them to gauge their progress and identify areas for improvement.

Outcome

The enrichment session equipped the teachers with psychological knowledge, create a nurturing learning environment, with particular emphasize on the importance of AI integration, promotion of personal growth, and fostering a supportive community among educators.






4. Please rate your knowledge-level with respect to the topics covered in the **after** attending the session.

Objective of the workshop/ seminar/activity: To make the new faculty members aware about the various aspects of teaching-learning, research, publications and the systems and operations of IIS (deemed to be University).

Summary / Description

The University organized a 2-week Faculty Induction Programme, planned from 1-14 Aug.'23 for the newly appointed faculty members. The FIP began an inaugural session on Aug 1, 2023, wherein the University's management, i.e. the Chancellor & the Vice-Chancellor formally welcomed the new faculty members to the University. Both spoke about the duties and responsibilities of a teacher in an institution of higher education and also emphasised the need for continuous professional development, all the while striving to align themselves with the institution's vision and mission.

The FIP focused on key themes concerning higher education. Sessions were conducted on topics like Curriculum Development, LOCF, evolving Teaching-Learning Pedagogies, Blending technology in classrooms, Research Ethics and the important operations and systems at IIS (deemed to be University).

Day 1(Aug 1): A two-week Faculty Induction Programme - *Guru Dakshata* - organized by the FDP Committee of the University for its newly-appointed faculty members, commenced with an inaugural ceremony on 1 August 2023. In line with the UGC's mandate for the induction and continuous development of the new appointees, the programme has been conceptualised

to help them improve their teaching and classroom management skills, adjust to the culture of the University, as well as better understand their professional duties and responsibilities.

Hon'ble Chancellor, Dr Ashok Gupta, delivered the Welcome Address after which Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, Prof TN Mathur spelt out the aims and objectives of the programme. Both stressed the need for new teachers to go through rigorous preparation and make good use of opportunities for continuous professional development along with academic and administrative support.

Thereafter, the first **Session of the day entitled “Curricular Framework and Choice-based Credit System”** was delivered by Dr. Shilpi Rijhwani, Professor of Botany and Director, School of Life Sciences. Dr Rijhwani has been closely involved in developing a broad curricular outline for the University, keeping in mind the NEP guidelines for implementing a Choice-based Credit System (CBCS) within a Credit-based structure. She spoke at length about the various salient features of the CBCS and the sea-changes that have started to be made in its wake.

It was an interactive session wherein a lot of ground was covered pertaining to the students' freedom to choose courses from the prescribed ones comprising core, elective/minor, skill-based and ability-enhancement ones too. Dr. Rijhwani closed by sharing that these would be evaluated following the grading system, which is considered to be better than the conventional marks system.

Day 2(Aug 2): Prof. Ila Joshi deliberated on the topic ‘Teaching and Learning- Broad Overview’. Her session highlighted the implementation of an outcome-based approach to curriculum planning and its attainment. Prof Joshi demonstrated framing of CO, PO, PSO and mapping between COs with POs.

Day 3(Aug 3): Session on ‘Methods and Techniques of Teaching’ was taken by Dr Sreemoyee Chatterjee, IIS (Deemed to be University). Dr Chatterjee focused on methods and techniques of teaching. She talked about the importance of shifting from teacher-centric teaching to learner-centric teaching methods and the integration of digital tools in education to make teaching easier and more effective.

Day 4(Aug 4): The session on ‘Technology for Teaching’ by DrDevershiPallavi Bhatt, Manipal University, Jaipur focuses on Blended Learning. Dr Bhatt spoke on the various facets of blended learning and its logical progression given the accessibility of eLearning and online resources as well as the ongoing demand for a human element in the learning process. The speaker suggested that a blended learning strategy should be incorporated to engage the student in his or her learning process.

Day 5 (Aug 5) - In the session on 'Examinations at IISU', **Prof. Nisha Yadav, Controller of Examination, IIS(Deemed to be University)** acquainted the participants with different parameters relating to examination and evaluation patterns followed at IIS (deemed to be University), Jaipur. Prof. Yadav elaborated on all the components of internal and external assessments undertaken at the University.

Day 6 (Aug 6)– Material Sharing

Day 7(Aug 7): The session on 'Understanding and Mentoring students' by **DrHimanginiRathoreHooja, IIS (deemed to be University)**, witnessed a discussion about the Mentor-MenteeProgramme at the IISU. DrHooja explicitly highlighted the expectations from the system like motivation, career guidance, providing timely and constructive feedback and professional development. The session strived to make participants familiar with Personal-emotional development with students.

Day 8(Aug 10):The first session was taken up by **Dr Anju Singh, Senior Assistant Professor, Department of Financial Studies, IIS (deemed to be University), Jaipur.**Dr. Anju talked about benefits of Internalization for India and recent policy initiative by Government of India. She has also discussed about improvement of the global ranking can be attained by utilizing the global resources. She has also elucidated on Internationalization of Higher Education as part of NEP 2020 and has shared the guidelines given by University Grant Commission within the framework of National Education Policy, 2020. She has also shared with us about the initiatives taken by our University i.e. IIS TIE and Tuning RISHII.

The second session of the day was conducted by **DrSonal Jain, Head, Department of Library and Information Sciences, IIS (deemed to be University), Jaipur.** She has acquainted the audience with the various sections of the central library and also the types of books/ Journals/ Magazines, etc and e-resources at University like INFLIBNET, JSTOR, National Digital Library, EBSCO-Corporate Resource Net, DELNET, Proquest, Prowess, Economic Outlook, EPWRF India Time Series, Directory of Open access Journals, NISCAIR Online Periodical Repository, NPTEL resources and Shodhganga. She shared the innovative practices of the University – Compendium, which covers the latest contest pages of the Journals & latest articles. Towards the end, DrSonal has also guided the faculty members to access the electronic databases and the way they can get themselves registered at the VIDWAN portal.

Day 9 (Aug 12):A session was conducted on "Strategic Planning and Management at IISU" by **Prof. K.S. Sharma, Advisor, IISU.** In this session, Prof. Sharma discussed the importance of strategic planning. He provided a comprehensive overview of the responsibilities that university teachers hold, followed by underlining the significance of integrating ICT (Information and Communication Technology) tools into teaching practices. He further explained the multifaceted role that teachers undertake, encompassing mentorship

and active involvement in various committees. Prof, Sharma acquainted the participants with extension activities and the committees that are doing these activities at the university.

The second session of the day was **Dr. Payal Chaturvedi, Coordinator, IQAC**. She explained the role and responsibility of **Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)**. Additionally, she provided a concise overview of the accreditation entity, NAAC (National Assessment and Accreditation Council), which conducts evaluations of educational institutions according to a set of seven criteria. Notably, she placed a significant emphasis on the pivotal role played by teachers in addressing the seven criteria utilized for Institutional Evaluation by NAAC.

Day 10 (Aug 10) The first session of the day was focused on the intricate aspects of **systems and operations** within IIS (Deemed to be University) Jaipur. The resource person for the Session was **Prof. Sharad Rathore, Professor & Head, Department of History, IIS (deemed to be University), Jaipur**. The session revolved around the salient features of deemed universities, the pattern of courses, the credit system, and the underlying course structure at the university. Prof. Rathore emphasized the autonomy granted to these universities by the University Grants Commission (UGC) of India, which allows them to design and implement their academic programs and curriculum to respond more dynamically to emerging trends in various fields. She also elucidated the credit system and highlighted the adoption of CBCS pattern at the undergraduate level for all the courses by the University. The second session of the day was centred around the comprehensive **Support Initiatives** within the IIS (Deemed to be University) Jaipur. The speaker for this session was **Prof. Raakhi Gupta, Registrar, IIS (Deemed to be University) Jaipur and Dr. Shelja K. Jueneja, Professor, Dept. of Environmental Science** also accompanied her for the conduction of some activities for the participants. The discussion in this session was aimed at highlighting the critical role of teachers, as well as the mechanisms and support initiatives in place to enhance the academic, research, holistic development, and financial aspects for both students and staff members. Prof. Gupta began the talk by emphasizing the pivotal role of teachers in shaping the educational journey of students. She delved into the University mechanisms and diverse range of support initiatives available at the University for staff and students that can be classified broadly into three categories viz. Academic and Research, Holistic development, and Financial and other supports. The speakers also highlighted the research initiatives, highlighting the university's research policy and fellowships, R&D Labs, Research Development Centre (RDC), etc. She also elaborated on consultancy policies, along with the presence of ethical committees for both animal and human research. Additionally, she mentioned the university's support for research publication, which includes in-house journal publications. She elaborated on guilds, societies, clubs, and associations that cater to a wide range of interests, fostering extracurricular engagement. Moreover, she highlighted the role of centre and national forums, as well as cells like Training and Placement and the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) in enhancing students' overall growth. The speaker also pointed out the significance of international and other memberships within the university, promoting global exposure. Prof. Gupta outlined various financial schemes

available to students, including support for the alumni network, endowment awards for meritorious students, financial support for research work, etc. She also highlighted the university's commitment to the well-being of its students and faculty members by providing accidental insurance coverage and financial assistance in cases of severe disease or ailment.

Day 11 (Aug 11) The session for the day was taken by **Dr. Roopam Kothari, Associate Professor from the Department of Management Studies, on Consultancy and Incubation.** Dr. Kothari emphasized the symbiotic relationship between academia and industry, shedding light on how academic expertise can be harnessed to drive innovation and growth in the corporate sector. Her practical insights resonated with the audience, sparking engaging discussions on fostering effective collaborations and the role of universities in fostering entrepreneurship.

The second session of the day was by **Prof. Ankita Jain, on "Building Constitutional Values through Education."** Prof. Jain shared the essence of how education plays a pivotal role in nurturing not only professional skills but also strong moral foundations. She highlighted the importance of integrating constitutional values into educational curricula, emphasizing the responsibility of educators in shaping socially responsible and ethically conscious individuals. The participants were deeply engaged. The vibrant discussions demonstrated the participants' enthusiasm and willingness to explore the intersections of academia, industry, and societal values.

Day 12 (Aug 12): The first session was on **Feedback Monitoring System** led by **Dr. Ruchi Nanda, Associate Professor and Head, Department of Computer Science & IT, IIS deemed to be University, Jaipur.** Dr. Nanda emphasized the significance of gathering feedback at various levels within the university. The session explored the different sources of feedback within the university context, such as students, faculty, parents and alumnae. An interactive activity was organized during this session by Dr. Monica Sharma, Head, Department of Clinical Psychology, IIS deemed to be University, Jaipur to provide a practical understanding of the concepts discussed during the session.

The second session was on **"Quality Assurance in Higher Education"** was **Dr. Payal Chaturvedi, Coordinator, IQAC, IIS deemed to be University, Jaipur.** She explained the role of quality assurance in the realm of higher education. The session covered strategies and practices to ensure and enhance the quality of education within an institution. She also conducted interactive activities, including a crossword puzzle and a quiz, which were aligned with the content of her presentation.

Day 13 (Aug 13) – Material Sharing

Day 14 (Aug 14): The final day of the FIP witnessed a session by **Dr. Shweta Kastiya** from the School of Management Studies, spoke on **"Research Ethics and Innovation"**. Dr. Kastiya discussed the place of ethics in both carrying out research as also in the publication

of findings/ results. She highlighted such related aspects of ethical research as publication misconduct, authorship issues, predatory and cloned journals, on the one hand, and intellectual honesty and research integrity, on the other. It was an interactive session, with the Participants being taken through a few portals and plagiarism-software for use in their research-based endeavours.

The **valedictory session** of the Faculty Induction Program – Guru Dakshata took place on 14th August 2023. The session was graced by the presence of Hon'ble Dr Ashok Gupta, Chancellor, IISU and Registrar Dr Raakhi Gupta, Registrar, IISU. During the valedictory session, participants shared their experience of the “Gurudakshata - Faculty Induction Programme’. The experience-sharing session was followed by a certificate distribution ceremony wherein the Hon'ble Chancellor and Registrar awarded a certificate to all participants for completing the Faculty Induction Programme.

The program received positive feedback with no qualitative suggestions. Objectives of the Extension Activity

- To spread the fundamental knowledge of AI and its usage in daily life
- To acquaint the participants with Generative AI and its implementations

Summary

A day long FDP on the theme, “AI for Daily Usages” was organized by the School of CS & IT and Faculty Development Committee of IIS (Deemed to be University), Jaipur on 13 January 2024. The FDP had two different sessions from separate experts. Session one was taken by Dr. Rekha Jain who presented her talk on “AI for Everyone”. She explained the meaning of Artificial Intelligence and discussed about the branches of AI and its applications. She elaborated on Machine Learning which allows the machine to learn by itself and take decisions thereby increasing its efficiency and improve its performance. Dr. Rekha also explained the concept of Deep Learning which makes computations of multi-layered neural networks. Applications of AI in daily life includes robotics, speech to text, smart cities, Internet of Things (IoT), medical diagnosis, stock market trading, online fraud detection and lot more. She stated that job opportunities are available in finance, health care, retail, energy and almost every sector.

Dr. Satyendra Chauhan delivered his talk during the second session on, “Introduction to Generative AI”. He stated that Generative AI generates some new images, text, clone audio etc., from the already existing or non-existing contents. Dr. Chauhan also explained the process of generative modelling that can be used in education for personalized learning, grading and assessment. He drew comparison between AI and traditional Machine

Learning. He also discussed about fully visible belief network and Generative Adversarial Network (GAN). Ethical principles in generative AI like transparency, fairness, privacy concerns and security were also highlighted.

Outcome

The FDP helped the target group in understanding the core concepts of most in-demand technology, that is, “Artificial Intelligence” and its sub components. Participants across the domains came to know about the applications of AI in daily life and how it is going to impact the future of everyone.




Analysis of Feedback

In summary, the analysis suggests that the content delivered in Session I was well-received, with a significant portion of participants finding it either very useful or useful. The majority of participants had a positive perception of the choice and effectiveness of the speakers, with nearly half providing excellent or very good ratings. However, there is a notable portion that expressed a more neutral stance, and a smaller percentage had less positive feedback. This analysis indicates an overall positive but varied response to the speakers in Session I. A significant portion of participants had positive experiences with participant involvement and query-handling, the presence of a relatively high neutral response suggests a diversity of opinions or experiences within the audience.

Following are the observation of respondents -

- The sessions were informative, but a more hands-on approach, focusing on integrating AI platforms into existing technologies, would have provided practical insights for daily usage. I suggest future sessions incorporate interactive demonstrations for a more effective learning experience.
- Next FDP can be planned related to AI tools.
- The content could have been more based upon effective and efficient tools in everyday life rather than theoretical and procedural aspect of AI and Machine learning.
- Hands on training on such aspects should be given.
- The session was more oriented towards Computer Science students. Hands on towards AI usage was expected.
- They should suggest some tools that can help in using AI more effectively.
