Financial Support

To boost innovative & entrepreneurial activities, the University provides the following:

- In order to promote research, the university provides a seed money upto Rs. 25000 to young faculty members to initiate research. The faculty members thereby gain an experience and confidence to apply to external agencies for funding of research projects.
- Faculty members registered for PhD from IISU are provided a concession of 50 % in Fee.
- In order to promote research among students, Student Research Projects are funded by IISU and provided a financial support of Rs.5000 each. A Total of 70 Student research projects were sanctioned in the academic year 2019-20.
- The University has well equipped research laboratories to provide the necessary support base to the faculty and students involved in research work. The University sanctions financial support for procuring high end research equipments for the labs to promote quality research work and innovation.
- The University has a Consultancy Policy in place. The finances are shared with the staff in the ratio 60 (staff):40(University)
- The University supports the budding Entrepreneurs by providing financial support through the IISU Incubation Centre, which as of now is being completely funded by the IISU Trust. IISU Incubation offers the following incubation services to the incubatee start-ups:
 - a) Mentorship
 - b) Co- working space
 - c) laboratory support for product development through food and nutrition lab jewelry designing lab, textile and fashion lab, Chemistry lab, fine arts lab and Computer Labs. The University provides necessary working space and financial support to the Incubation centre to support and nurture the startups.
- The University also sanctions annual budget to the extension committee for carrying out various extension activities.
- All the finances related to filing of copyrights and patents are borne by the University.
- The IISU has a CPCSEA, Government of India approved Animal House & Animal Ethics Committee which is used extensively in research. The total annual expenditure of running the animal house is borne by the University. in the year 2019-20, the total annual expenditure was Rs. 231500.

Credit course work on Entrepreneurship/Innovation - Self or jointly with external agencies

- The University nurtures the innovative and entrepreneurial skills of young students by providing them adequate exposure to subjects related to entrepreneurship & Innovation in their respective courses.
- Credit based courses on Entrepreneurship, innovation & Product Development are offered in programmes like MBA, BBA, B.Com, M.Com, B.Sc (Fashion Designing), B.Sc(Jewellery Designing), B.Sc(Home Science).
- A credit based foundation course on Entrepreneurship is offered, thus giving an opportunity to the students from different streams to opt for the same
- In order to boost social entrepreneurship, practical courses on Community Engagement Services have been included in the curriculum of the students of MBA in Semester I & Semester II. The students work on different projects with different NGOs and CSR departments of Companies.
- Courses on Rural Community Engagement have been introduced in the curriculum of M.A. Sociology. Along with sensitizing the students with the problems related to rural community, course also aims at promoting Rural Entrepreneurship.
- The University offers Career Oriented Skill Development Courses (COSD) in different streams like Fashion Designing, Jewelry Designing, Fine Arts, Journalism, Photography, Analytics, Event Management etc. which equips them with adequate skills to be a successful entrepreneur.
- The University is a Registered Oral Coaching Centre (ROCC Code # 1048) for running the Certificate in Accounting Technician course offered by Institute of Cost Accountants of India (ICAI).
- The University is also offering B.Com(H) In Applied Accounting & Finance in Collaboration with Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA), London. The course aims to make students to explore the job avenues in Finance Sector at global platform.
- Pedagogy in all courses include a blend of theory and experiential learning activities through projects/seminars and labs.
- Bazar on Campus activity is organized for all departments promoting entrepreneurial skill amongst students. In this activity students under the supervision of their faculty, are required to prepare business plans and present different business models pertaining to their course.
- Students with innovative ideas are motivated to participate in B plan Competitions and also register with the IISU Incubation centre. At present IISU Incubation Centre is supporting 09 student startups and 01 department startup from the department of Chemistry.
- Business plan workshops are organized as part of the curriculum to give practical exposure to the students along with the theoretical knowledge.
- The University has proposed a new course titled MBA Innovation, Entrepreneurship and Venture Development (MBA-IEV) to AICTE to be effective from the Academic Session 2020-21. MBA- IEV is a very unique and special program of IIS (deemed to be) University which aims a facilitating budding innovators and aspiring entrepreneurs to transform their ideas into viable business set up and nurture them into successful & sustainable ventures. The course curriculum has been prepared as per the guidelines received from MHRD.
- The university has also adopted National INNOVATION and STARTUP Policy 2019 of MHRD in order to build an ecosystem congenial for promoting students and faculty startups.

The IISU Incubation centre is formed with the primary purpose to facilitate the creation of ideas and inventions that benefit society and importantly, are commercially ready by the end of incubation program. IISU Incubation Centre provides a rigorous incubation program and also facilitates collaborations with mentors, partners, industry leaders and investment professionals.

The objective of the IISU Incubation Centre is to:

- To foster an entrepreneurial culture, by providing the students, alumni, and faculty, opportunities to transform their business ideas to reality. These facilities are also open to the general public.

- Helping idea to translate into reality and upgrade them to the level of commercial value.
- To create startup ecosystem at campus.
- To facilitate the availability of resources to the incubatees in a mutually beneficial way.
- To provide a conducive working environment to the incubatees to nurture their innovative ideas.
- To liaise with private and public sector funding sources, government agencies, industrial associations, chambers of commerce and industries to provide facilitation and networking for incubate companies.

Intellectual Property Management Cell

Introduction

IIS (deemed to be University) (IISU) has set up an Intellectual Property Management Cell (IPMC) in year 2014. IIS (deemed to be University) has set up a Intellectual Property Management Cell (IPMC) at the University to deal with available and growing knowledge wealth in the University. The IPMC will immensely support the rapidly growing activities on IP education and management in this University.

The IPM Cell provides facilitation to person interested in the matter of IPR. The Cell offered assistance protecting innovation and the Intellectual Property. The IP services including Prior-art search report, patentability opinion, drafting patent specification, preparing filing documents, filing application and follow-up, prosecuting the filed application by responding office action such as FER etc, advisory services on various IPR, IP management, reviewing IP policy of the University, organizing various capacity building workshops/conferences on IPR etc.

As the Cell gains experience, it would also act as a think tank on policy matters related to IPR in India with special emphasis on issues relevant to the local area.

Objectives

The main objective of an IP Management Cell under academics is to integrate IPR with the education process to enhance the quality of thinking, propagate a culture of regard and respect for IPR, ensure speedy and accurate identification and protection of innovations arising out of the research work carried out in the university, facilitate transfer of knowledge and technology from the university to industry and enhance the scope of their commercialization. The Cell also aims to offer assistance to grass-root innovators in the local area to realize the commercial benefits of their innovations.

1.3 Learning-outcome based curriculum framework (LOCF) :

The University has adopted a LOCF as part of which student-performance is monitored and assessed regularly. The learning outcomes are clearly spelt out in each programme-syllabi which go through minor updations every year and major revisions, once in five years.

Besides these, course objectives of each programme specified in the syllabus articulate the desired outcomes/goals of that course in terms of attributes, academic skills and learning goals.

Moreover, various extramural activities organized by the University through Guilds, Clubs, Societies, etc. aim at inculcating the following generic skills in the students:

- Soft skills such as Presentation skills, Communications skills, etc.
- Career Oriented Skills
- Entrepreneurship Skills
- Leadership skills
- Sense of patriotism

The outcome of these attributes is monitored through the following systems operative at the University level:

- Two credits per semester are awarded to those participating in one of the co-curricular activities viz. NCC/NSS/Sports/ cultural so as to inculcate in them a sense of patriotism, social responsibility and value of sports/games and cultural activities.
- Presentation, Linguistic and Entrepreneurship skills etc. form an integral part of the evaluative component of a number of courses and are hence monitored.
- Development of add on skills is monitored through the Continuous Assessment and annual examination pattern of Evaluation.
- Acquisition of Leadership Skills is evaluated on the basis of feedback obtained from students about the members of the student council that is taken and analyzed by the management every year.

As part of the assessment strategies, a system of Continuous Assessment (CA), exists in the University to assess the performance of the students. The University collects and analyses data on student learning outcomes in the following ways:

- Continuous assessment through ongoing evaluation of students' performance on various parameters
- Semester/Trimester End examinations
- Result analysis
- Feedback from all stakeholders
- Placement status

This data is used to identify barriers to learning and strategies are formulated to take appropriate measures, as under:

- The reports of the result analysis are provided to the faculty members for further improvement in their pedagogical practices to overcome the barriers to learning
- Arrange extra classes for slow learners

3. Information Communication Technology (ICT) being used by the Deemed to be University for effective teaching learning:

The university has wi-fi enabled campus to support online-learning for students and faculties. The University has introduced cloud based educational ERP system, namely Metacampus. The university has licensed software like Quark Express, WIEN2K, AutoCAD, Mathematica, Final CutPro (Audio and video editing), Adobe Premier Creative Cloud, SPSS version 20, Gaussian 16, MATLAB, Tally etc. which are embedded in the curriculum and are used in research. Besides these a number of open source software like R Programming, Python, etc are included in the curriculum.

The examination process from generation of the roll numbers to the preparation of the result is computer based. The University has devised inhouse examination software which manages the whole process.

The University has developed its own software to conduct online exams in some of the papers

The Research Entrance Examination (RET) for the Ph.D. Candidates is also conducted in the form of Computer-based Exams.

The faculties are also adapting to conduct real-time classroom assessments with the help of educational mobile applications like Kahoot and Padlet to name a few.

The University has also subscribed plagiarism software—Turnitin which is used to check Plagiarism of the thesis of postgraduate dissertations and Ph.D.

Google Forms are used by students and research scholars for the purpose of data collection for dissertation and Ph.D thesis preparation.

The University has an intensive ICT enabled feedback collection mechanism, wherein, feedback on various aspects pertaining to the course, pedagogy and teachers is collected online from the students and other stakeholders

The University is facilitated through automated e- library, with subscriptions to e-journals like Springerlink, Questia, Delnet, etc.

The University Library has subscribed to Alice Oasis software

IISU Digital Library is an interface which has over 9000 full-text journals from quality QA publishing resources, over 80,000 audio-visual learning resources, over 1,20,000 full-text thesis, dissertations and course materials and more than 10,000 academic presentations.

The MOOCs has been integrated in the curricular structure as per the credit transfer scheme of UGC.

The University is a Remote Center of IIT Bombay outreach program.

The ICT resources like LCD, Computers, video clips, visualisers, smart boards, etc. form an integral part of the pedagogy.

The University has a Community Radio Station, 'CRS Radio 7' and a state of the art audio-visual studio which is used as practical laboratories to give students a hands on training and provide exposure to advanced learning.
