#### INTRODUCTION Inception

The IISU grew out of the International College for Girls (ICG), which was established in 1995, as a college affiliated to the University of Rajasthan. Since then, ICG has crossed many significant milestones in its journey towards excellence in higher education. Besides receiving numerous other accolades, it was accredited A+ by the NAAC of UGC in 2005. It was also identified as a Model College by the state government in 2006 and thereafter it was conferred the status of Autonomous College in 2007 by the U.G.C. It was further recognized as a College with Potential for Excellence (CPE) by the UGC in 2010. In a national survey conducted by AC-Nielsen-ORG MARG, also in 2010 for the India Today magazine, ICG was rated as the topmost college in the state in Arts, Science and Commerce streams. Ranked among the top 30 institutions of the country in this survey, the College became a symbol of quality education and women's empowerment. The institution while working as an Autonomous College was declared as Deemed-to-be-a-University by the Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD), Government of India, vide its notification dated 2<sup>nd</sup> Febraury, 2009, issued under Section 3 of the UGC Act, 1956. This, more than an achievement, was a reaffirmation of our faith in the quality and innovation, in research and academics taken up at the institution right from its inception in 1995. Soon after becoming Deemed University in the name and style of 'The IIS University', in a review conducted by the 'Tandon Committee' constituted by the MHRD, it was recognized for its competence and strength and was placed in category 1, along with the 37 other Deemed-to-be-Universities of Category 1 across the country. This has accorded IISU greater reliability and credibility and provided with a unique opportunity to explore and put in place what is needed to empower its students through the three Es -Efficiency, Excellence and Effectiveness and prepare them as worthy citizens, ready to takeup social and economic reforms with a scientific aptitude.

Thus, from a visionary beginning in 1995, IISU is now moving on to new heights as a digitally smart campus with contemporary and relevant programmes and e-learning systems. Alongside its rapid growth and development, the University retains a friendliness and warmth, which has characterized the institution from its early days. Prof. Dipan K. Ghosh explained about the development of **Ammonia Molecule as a two state system of the theoretical concepts** and found the Perturbation Solution under weak and strong electric field cases.

Prof. Brijesh Pare, President, Association of Chemistry Teachers shared that this Research Convention is the first of its kind of designed and executed research convention for Post Graduate students, research scholars and faculty members.

**Prof. Gyorgy Keglevich**, Department of organic Chemistry and technology, Budapest University of Technology and Economics, Hungry, delivered an insightful talk on Development of Results. Prof. Martin D Rudd, University of Wisconsin, USA. Delivered a talk on the topic Getting Your Research Published focussed on understanding of editorial processes and what editors look for. #### **Research and Innovation: Exploring Gendered Challenges**

In tune with the Global Women's Breakfast event being organized by the International Union of Pure and Applied Chemistry(IUPAC) on the theme of "Empowering Diversity in Science", the departments of Chemistry, Sociology and Centre for Women's Studies, IIS (deemed to be University), Jaipur, in collaboration with Association of Chemistry Teachers(ACT) organized a global webinar on "Research and Innovation: Exploring Gendered Challenges" on February 9, 2021 at 3:30 pm-4:30 pm(IST).

With an aim to explore and address issues for such gender gap, the sessions were taken up by two eminent resource persons, Dr. Rashmi Jain, Head, Department of Sociology and Director, International Cooperation Cell, University of Rajasthan, Jaipur and Dr. Neelima Gupta, Associate Professor, University of Rajasthan, Jaipur.

The webinar commenced with the blessings of the Almighty. A short video by IUPAC was played to acquaint the participants about the Global Women's Breakfast. Several excerpts from all over the world Malaysia, Russia, Singapore, etc. were shown in the video.

The first speaker, Dr. Rashmi Jain brought attention to social issues governing gender inequality which has been a persistent feature of all modern societies and insisted on the need of mainstreaming gender in all walks of life. According to her, gendered social expectations construct women's career choices. Emphasizing on the Science, Technology and Innovation Policy (STIP), 2020, she suggested that there is a need to inculcate scientific socialization in women since childhood. The second speaker, Dr. Neelima Gupta, beautifully showed us the inspiring journey of women in Chemistry, featuring the past, present and future of the field. She briefly explained the important role of IUPAC and GWB to encourage women in the field. She highlighted the remarkable journey of women receiving Nobel Prize in Chemistry since 1901, including Charpentier and Doudna who have recently received the prize in 2020. She also threw a light on few government policies and programs like GATI, SERB-POWER, Women Scientists Scheme, etc. to provide and promote opportunities for women scientists in India.




#### Hands on training on biochemical analyzer

#### Discussion on the movie Parasite

The Department of English of the IIS University organized a virtual Reader's Club Activity on 25th November, 2020. It was a discussion on the Academy award-winning South Korean movie Parasite.

The students observed the style and tone presented in the movie. Several motifs and symbols such as the stairway and the subway smell were examined. Moreover, the phrase given by the movie's director, Bong Joon-ho, describing Parasite as a "comedy without clowns, a tragedy without tears" was also brought in. It threw light on the engaging blend



of humorous and tragic tones employed in the movie, as well as to the sudden transformation from a seemingly comic narrative to an intense thriller, and ultimately into a unique tragedy.

#### **Disability in Bollywood**

The Department of English organized a virtual enrichment lecture on 27 November 2020 for its UG and PG students with Dr. Anita Ghai, a Disability Rights activist and Professor in the School of Human Studies at Ambedkar Univ., Delhi, on 'Disability in Bollywood'. Beginning with an account of her own experiences, she went on to discuss how disability is portrayed in Bollywood films beginning with cult classics such as Mother India and Dosti. She questioned the necessity of depicting a curative or at least a compensating characteristic in films for the disabled are usually seen as departing from what is considered 'normal' by the society's standards.

The session came to a close with an interactive Q and A wherein she interacted with the students and faculty members, followed by a formal Vote of Thanks.

#### The Researcher-Teacher

The eighth Alumna-Interaction session was organized virtually by the Department of English, IIS (Deemed to be) University, on 8 December 2020. Ms. Kanika Gandhi, Assistant Professor at Shaheed Bhagat Singh College, Delhi, spoke on the topic "The Researcher-Teacher."

She shared how her perspective, her capability to change, and having the courage to stand up to the world, have further contributed to her success. She also acknowledged how the simple act of compulsorily attending classes and seminars, organizing events and taking part in extra-curricular activities, changed her life for the better. She also suggested Cuddon's Dictionary of Literary Terms & Literary Theory - among several other references - as the holy grail for further studies in English Literature. She quipped, "Literature is what you and I do in everyday life!" and asked the students to not limit their knowledge to textual books and to apply it in their daily life.

#### **Creative Minds Master Class**

A Readers' Club Activity was organized by the Department of English on 23 December 2020. The topic for the activity was "How do some of the best creative minds think?" It explored the lessons imparted by some popular and literary minds, using the trailers of Master Class, a streaming platform where the world's best writers train the aspiring writers.

The trailers screened in the class included the literary authors such as Salman Rushdie, Margaret Atwood, Neil Gaiman, and Joyce Carol Oates, as well as popular authors like Judy Blume, Dan Brown, R.L. Stine, and David Sedaris. The discussion ranged from poetry, drama, prose and fiction, and language to wider concepts such as culture, ethnicity, creative expression and techniques of writing across genres. The session gave diverse suggestions on the art of creative writing, making many participants think, learn



and rethink the topic. The session proved beneficial to all the students who contributed for the activity, the students who participated, and the faculty members present.

# Canadian Literature Today: Literary Solidarity & Critical Diversities

The Department organized the fourteenth virtual enrichment lecture on 12th February, 2021. Prof. Smaro Kamboureli was invited to speak on the topic "Canadian Literature Today: Literary Solidarity & Critical Diversities." The speaker explored the emergence of Canadian Literature in context of Canadian identity, interdisciplinary methodologies and Literary Solidarities. Referencing to Northrop Frye's famous essay, she emphasized "Where is here?" as central to Canadian identity and literature. She also suggested some books revolving around and beyond literary criticism, such as Margaret Atwood's Survival: A Thematic Guide to Canadian Literature, and Richard Cavell's Love, Hate, and Fear in Canada's Cold War.

The Talk was followed by some questions from the students and faculty, opening further discussions on the clash of identity, the nature and role of orality, as well as the diversity of contemporary Canadian Literature. The lecture, thus, turned out to be truly enriching.

# Literature and Journalism: The Crossing-Over

Miss Anushka Yadav, currently working as an Editorial Assistant with Global News, is a cum laude post-graduate (Journalism) of Humber College, Toronto, Canada. Miss Yadav, after having been introduced to the students, very humbly yet assuredly addressed the topic of 'crossing over from literature to journalism' in a rather precise manner leaving the platform open for any interaction or query from her audience.

Stating how the experience had encouraged her to push her boundaries and work towards something bigger than any of us. She has gracefully gone through all the motions to evolve and become her own person. Miss Anushka is, in a way, an excellent example of how one can switch, relate and co-relate with the transition from academic creativity to layman communication.

# Poetry Slam

# **Courtesans and the Indian Erotic Imagination**

The fifteenth Virtual Enrichment Lecture was organized by the English Department of the IIS (Deemed to be) University on "Courtesans and the Indian Erotic Imagination" on 6 March, 2021. Professor Ruth Vanita, University of Montana, was invited to deliver the same.



Professor Vanita began the lecture by describing in length that Courtesans were highly educated women who were accomplished in the art of singing and dancing. Known in North India as *Tawaifs*, they were the "female intellectuals" who were brought up in matrilineal households, owned property, and were the highest income-tax payers in nineteenth-century Lucknow.

The lecture was followed by an interactive Q/A session. The discussion revolved around on the upsurge of the contemporary LGBTQ movement in India and whether it casts adequate light on women sexuality. With such vibrant thoughts, the erudite session came to an end.

#### From Literature to Linguistics: Allied Avenues

The Department of English organized the tenth in the series of virtual Alumna Interactions on March 13, 2021. For the same, Ms. Anshika Arora, was invited to speak on the topic "From Literature to Linguistics: Allied Avenues". She began by talking about her foray into Linguistic Studies during her Post-Graduation from Kellog's College, Oxford University (UK) and her journey since then.

Her long-standing association with Linguistics allowed her to talk at length about sociolinguistics and English as a lingua-franca. She also discussed the challenges to teaching English as a foreign language (EFL) in the UAE as well as the pitfalls of resorting to the first language equivalents in second language acquisition (SLA).

She also helped distinguish between SLA, EFL and EMI (English-medium Instruction) with respect to language acquisition and instruction and highlighted the differing approaches of instruction employed in South Asian countries (such as India) vis-a-vis the Middle East as also the US and the UK (as seen in the American and the British schools, respectively.

#### **Photos like Poems like Photos**

The Department of English of the IIS University conducted Reader's Club Activity on the20 th of March 2021 at 9:30am via Google meet. The topic of the activity was "Photos like Poems like Photos". The activity focused on the symbiotic relationship between poems and photography and gave students a chance to present their self-composed works based on photographs.

The theme was beautifully defined through the work of poetess Anupama Raju and French photographer Pascal Bernard. Their composition discovered the city of Pondicherry using photography and poetry. With this brief introduction, the stage was opened for students to interact and share their views. The teachers enlightened the students with literary facts and characters. Students and faculty members also recited their creation based on picture on varying topics.

#### From a Literary Ambience to the Corporate Environment

The Department of English organized the 11th Alumna Interaction Session on 7th April, 2021. Devyani Tyagi from the class of 2014 was invited to speak on the topic "From a Literary Ambience to the Corporate Environment". While talking about her own



professional journey, the speaker also explored the various fields of work in this sector, such as Public Relations, Brand Management, HR, etc. She gave insights into the skills looked out for, the research required, and the management needed to create and augment the consumer pull. She further discussed the significance of humanities in understanding and interpreting culture, society and its demands.

Ms. Tyagi, at the end, inspired the participants with her motivational words and advice about taking criticism positively, introspecting on feedback and to be honest to oneself.

#### Literary Engagements beyond Academics

The Dept. of English organized yet another Enrichment Lecture, as part of its ongoing series, on 12 April '21. The speaker was Dr. Yamini Dand Shah, a Mumbai-based literary researcher engaged in Gender Studies and socio-economically marginalized communities/ writers of South Asia and Canada as also Indian Aesthetics, Culture and Arts Management.

Dr. Shah began by throwing light on the vast field open to students for literary engagements beyond the classroom. The students were given useful information about as diverse fields as interning at publishing houses to helping curate literature festivals; from homing their academic writing skills to come up with research papers to minutely observing their surroundings to dabble in creative writing as well. The session closed with an interactive round of Q&A and with Dr. Shah finally closing it by reading one of her poems entitled "Being left behind".

#### Literature & the Pursuit of Scholarly Excellence

The Dept. of English organized the 12th Alumna Interaction Session on 8 May, 2021. Megha Sharma from the class of 2017 was invited to speak on the topic "Literature & the Pursuit of Scholarly Excellence".

Ms. Megha explored the study of Literature and the prerequisites for literary research. She highlighted many important points that help one in critically studying Literature.

She further talked about the more nuanced aspects of Literature such as graphic novels, comic books, films and even memes and graffiti, and elaborated on how such newer perspectives have transformed Literature from being just on the page to becoming a medium of communication.

## The Indian Partition and the Practices of Memory

The Department of English organized the seventeenth in the series of online Enrichment Lectures on May 13, 2021 with Prof. Shuchi Kapila from Grinnel College, Iowa (USA), on "The Indian Partition and the Practices of Memory".

Prof. Kapila began her talk by introducing the students to the broad, interdisciplinary field of Memory Studies. She cited a couple of theorists who have extensively researched memory and its ambivalence in terms of Partition narratives. She went on to distinguish individual memory from collective memory which concerns itself with shared versions of both the quotidian and ritualistic aspects of the past in a socio-cultural milieu, while



also underlining the need to study the two kinds of memories together in order to gain a comprehensive understanding of the past.

# Shakespeare v/s Milton: The Kings of English Literature Debate

The Readers' Club of the Department of English organized a virtual discussion on "Shakespeare v/s Milton: The Kings of English Literature Debate" on May 31, 2021. The discussion began with an astute observation that Shakespeare penetratingly explores diverse human relationships in his plays as well as poetry, thus being justly called "the great poet of relationships." A brief reference was made to Shakespeare's language as a playwright and poet and which was quickly followed by the fact that Milton's language surpassed Shakespeare's "in his command, music, the weight, the taste and texture of English words", but falls short in his grasp over human psychology when pitted against the Bard.

With such an absorbing pursuit of dispute, the wholesome and enriching session came to an end with the conclusion that both the literary giants explored the essential human condition and represented human frailties and foibles.

#### **Black Feminism on the Edge**

The Department of English organized the eighteenth in its series of virtual Enrichment Lectures on June 7, 2021 with Prof. Samantha N. Pinto from the Univ. of Austin, Texas (USA), on "Black Feminism on the Edge". Prof. Pinto began her talk by elaborating on the term "edge" and how it entails pushing the edges and margins of the society in order to open up new avenues of feminist thought. Her work is thus devoted explicitly to Black Feminism in its multiple forms, iterations and locations and looks at Black women at the center of debates about rights, nationality and freedom. She further stated as to how Black women's stories were essential to achieving corrective history, especially those of the "infamous" bodies who are situated on the verge of intelligibility.


The talk was followed by a Q&A session which prompted a discussion on various topical issues such as the *Black Lives Matter* Movement.

References. The session was followed by the queries which students had and were discussed at length.

The Department of Fashion & Textiles has organized a guest lecture for the students of B.Sc. Fashion Design on 22<sup>nd</sup> May 2021. The resource person for the lecture was Ms. Annaya Tak, Alumni, IIS (deemed to be University), Jaipur.

Ms. Ananya briefed the students about the concept of style reading. She stated Fashion as globally accepted language and its importance with reference to working as fashion illustrator in the fashion industry. The process of creating illustrations with style reading was discussed with students. Stepwise procedure for creating collection on particular theme or for particular clientele was discussed.

She also shared the 3R formula wherever data's are involved that is, Read, Report and Review.

In the end, the webinar was left open for the students to put on their thinking caps and ask their mind and heart out.

#### Workshop on Video Editing

The Department of Journalism and Mass Communication organised a seven-day workshop on the topic of 'Basics of Visual Media' from October 20-26<sup>th</sup>, 2020. The trainer for the workshop was Mr. Ankit Keshari. The workshop was organised on Google Meet platform.

The workshop trained the students about the basics of technical exercises of visual media, such as camera operations and editing visuals. On the last day of the workshop, students were given exercise of shooting and editing a video.

#### Webinar On Spotting Fake News and Misinformation in the Digital Age

The Department of Journalism and Mass Communication, IIS (deemed to be University) organised a webinar on the topic of 'Spotting Fake News and Misinformation in the Digital Age' on Thursday, November 19<sup>th</sup>, 2020. The resource person for the webinar was Prof. Umesh Arya, Dena & Chairman, Faculty of Media Studies, Guru Jambeshwar University of Science and Technology.

Prof. Arya talked about the problem of the information overload in today's era. He also discussed about various fake news being circulated through various social media platforms and how it is a punishable offence under various sections of Indian law. Prof. Arya shared various tips and apps useful to spot and combat fake news. Students also participated in the quiz shared by Prof Arya during the webinar.

#### PR and Advertising: In Action and Practice

The department of Journalism and Mass Communication of the IIS (deemed to be University) organised a six days' workshop on the topic of 'PR and Advertising: in Action and Practice', from November 23rd to 28th, 2020. The purpose of this workshop was to



provide a better understanding and on-field knowledge from experienced professionals to students aspiring to enter the field of PR and advertising.

On first day of the workshop i.e. 23rd November, a session on the topic 'Media Relations and Writing' was organised with Shri Sudhir Gore, as the key-note speaker. The session was interactive with students asking questions and Sudhir answering all the questions.

On the second day of the workshop i.e. 24th November, the session revolved around the topic 'Corporate Communications' with Ms. Anindita Sinha as the key-note speaker. Throughout the session, Ms. Sinha shared her learning and personal experiences with the students, and stressed on the idea of "Being a brand is to Create one".

On third day of the workshop i.e. 25th November, the session focussed on the topic 'Organising Press Conferences' with Shri Sudhir Gore as the key-note speaker. Shri. Gore complied all the necessary aspects of press conferences in his presentation and stressed on practical learning of the students.

The fourth day i.e. 26th November was dedicated to Advertising with Ms. Pratibha Singh as the key-note speaker of the session. Ms. Singh discussed 'Ideation and Advertising Planning' with the basics of advertising in the discussion.

On the fifth day i.e. 27th November, the topic of the session was 'Crisis Communication' with Mr. Ramendra Kumar as the key-note speaker. Mr. Kumar practically approached the topic while discussing various theoretical aspects of the job and critically analysing various case studies; he briefly discussed the New Age Media, functioning and sustaining in a corporate set-up.

On the Sixth and last day of the workshop, Shri. Nishant Verma was invited as the keynote speaker and the session revolved around 'Social Media for Creative Campaigns'. Shri. Nishant Verma focussed on making it an informative and interactive session. He spoke about the importance of campaigning and the power of mass communication with the help of various examples and case studies.

# Media Language and Writing

The department of Journalism and Mass Communication of IIS (Deemed to be University) organized a two days workshop on "Media: Language and Writing" on 7th & 8th December, 2020. The workshop was organized to enhance the writing skills of students in respect with language aspect of writing. The keynote speaker of the workshop was Shri Prem Prakash, Senior Journalist, Jansatta, Uttar Pradesh.

Shri Prem Prakash commenced the workshop by discussing the usage of Hindi language in various fields of Journalism and tried to make the students understand what importance does Hindi language hold irrespective of the medium. He further added that whether it's the field of Advertising, Public Relations or News Anchoring, both the oration and the written aspect of understanding the Hindi language is to be given equal importance.

On Day 2, he critically analyzed various written pieces of the students after their learning from Day 1 and suggested all the necessary changes which were required in the respective pieces and made the session interesting and informative by sharing his experiences. The



workshop proved to be very informative and knowledge enhancing for all the students. The workshop ended with a question answer round.

# **Contemporary Debates on Farm Bill**

The Department of Journalism and Mass Communication of IIS (deemed to be University), Jaipur organised an interactive session about Farm Bill under the title 'Contemporary Debates' on Saturday, January 9th, 2021. The key-note speaker for the debate was Mr. Harikishan Sharma, Assistant Editor, Indian Express.

#### New India: Fiction to Facts

The department of Journalism and Mass Communication of IIS (deemed to be University) Jaipur organised third episode of the 'Happiness Dialogue Series- Elate' on the topic, 'New India: Fiction to Facts' on February 11<sup>th</sup>, 2021. The Webinar was organized to acquaint the students with the global media's ongoing scenario and trends. Miss Tinymaghul from Kyrgyzstan was the first guest speaker of the webinar. Miss Mimoza Kociu from Albania discussed about the right to freedom of speech and expression and how well do people try to exhibit this right whenever required. Ms Maria Valeria Capisano from Argentina shared about the cooperative media models and how social media and its tools play an important role in communicating with the masses. She



further added the challenges that have been faced by the media to become liberal and free in her country.

The last speaker of the session was Mr. Rajesh Sundaram from India who spoke about the various opportunities that the Indian media provides to its citizens such as citizen journalism, which has been a platform for the citizens to be a part of the media.

The session concluded with the closing dialogues from all the speakers where several points about the importance of Journalistic Influence and rise of women leaders in journalism were raised.

The last speaker of the session was Mr. Anurag Punetha. Mr. Punetha discussed about the social media anarchy, misinformation and disinformation with the students.


# Cinema is a mirror, a sharp reflection of the society and the greatest actors are the WOMEN: Travelling back and forth in time.

#### **Poster Exhibition**




## & Online guest Lecture on impact of COVID on Animal, 19th October 2020

Growing your own forest with Miyawaki techniques.

The session was started by Mr. Arpit Patni, introducing about the CII and different Yi chapters and also stating the objective of the organization, followed by Ms Madhana Ratnavel who stated the main objective of the session and introduced the topic to the



attendees of the webinar. Next, Mr Kushagra Juneja, introduced the speaker of this webinar and also gave the welcome speech.

The speaker of the webinar was Miss. Sheeba Sen, founder of Alaap, a social enterprise with a mission to catalyse reforestation. She aims of bringing back the native forest by urban forest techniques such as Miyawaki technique. She works for integrated reforestation projects and Youth fellowship program. Firstly, she talked about climate change and what does it mean for India. According to her, climate change mainly occurs due to rise in temperature level, disrupted rainfall, extreme weather events and causes more diseases. She then stated about Miyawaki

forest. Miyawaki forest was first established in Japan by Dr. Akira Miyawaki who has planted more than 40,000,000 trees worldwide, at 1700 different locations. Miyawaki Forest aims at 30 times more denser forest building, 10 times more growth as compared to conventional forest, 100 times more bio- diverse and 100% natural. It focuses on multilayer green forest which include canopy layer, tree layer, sub-tree layer and shrub layer and grows 30 trees per 100 square feet with over 50 different native species. There are 6 steps to forest creation namely soil survey, native species and biomass survey, sampling preparation or procurement, preparation of soil and mound, plantation with community and maintenance and monitoring. The benefits of Miyawaki Forest are that it recharges water sources, addresses man-animal coexistence issue, increases biodiversity, especially birds and insects, increase 10 time the rate of conventional methods. Lastly the session was ended by some Q&A by the attendees and vote of thanks by Mr Kushagra Juneja to the attendees and to Miss. Sheeba Sen for the wonderful and deep learning session.

#### EQUAL OPPORTUNITY CELL

The IIS (Deemed to be University), Jaipur has introduced this Cell in order to curb down the deprivations that the marginalized groups, identified as SCs, STs, OBC (non-creamy layer), minorities, physically challenged, face barriers of denial of access



to materials, cultural and educational resources and to promote the deserving, yet socially disadvantaged students. The Institution has been conferred with grants and scholarships, during its Autonomous status, for students to give them an opportunity to excel in preferred fields. These scholarships have been a huge motivation to introduce a separate unit which will work specifically towards the promotion of female students coming from these social groups. Currently, the Cell is catering to the needs of almost 400 students of IIS (Deemed to be University).

#### Aims and objectives

1. To provide guidance and counseling to students with respect to academic, financial, social and other matters and to oversee the effective implementation of policies and programs for disadvantaged groups.

2. To adopt measures to ensure due share of utilization by SC, St, OBC, minorities in admissions, recruitments (teaching and non-teaching posts) and to improve their performances.

3. To orient them for scholarships, test and programs which will help them receive financial support from State/Central Government and to organize interface with well-established/leading academicians from the same categories regularly so that the students are motivated towards achieving their goals.

4. To make efforts to sensitize the academic community regarding the problems associated with social exclusion as well as aspirations of the marginalized communities.

5. To provide them access to opportunities thorough guest-lectures and broaden their knowledge.

6. To introduce to them, social welfare schemes offered by the State Government for the betterment and promotion of these classes.



#### Orienting students about Equal Opportunity Cell Talk By Professor K. S . Sharma

A talk was organized at the IIS (Deemed to be University) on 7 January 2021 by the Equal opportunity Cell on online platform. The speaker was Prof. K. S . Sharma Advisor, IIS (Deemed to be University). He apprised the students about the purpose of having EOC in the university. It is meant to address the issues relate students belonging to Schedule Caste/Schedule Tribe, Other Backward Caste, minorities, Persons with Disabilities (PWDs) & women on a continual basis. The main objective of the Equal Opportunity Cell is to help and empower the persons with disabilities, students to participate fully in the academic, intellectual, social, and cultural life of university on an equal basis. The talk was carved out with the design of bringing together the resources and special schemes available for the SC, ST, OBC, Minorities and Divyangjan.

He counseled the young minds that to provide equal status to these disadvantaged groups special privileges have been accorded in our constitution, but we still need to actively participate to reap maximum benefits of them.

He spoke on Economic Development and Women Empowerment focused on women's

sense of self-worth and their right to have access to opportunities and resources in our society to ensure the Sustainable Development of the country.

Dr. Deepika Singh, Nodal Officer, Equal Opportunity Cell, IIS University proposed a formal vote of thanks and boosted the morale of the students.



#### Celebration of International Women's Day organized by Centre for Women's Studies, Equal Opportunity Cell and NSS Units in Collaboration with Connect Signal (NGO)

On the occasion of International Women's Day, Centre for Women Studies, Equal Opportunity Cell and NSS Units organized an event to celebrate social, economic, cultural and political achievements of women the role of women and to raise awareness about equality for women on 8th March 2021. The programme started with a formal welcome address by Dr. Ashok Gupta, Chancellor, IIS(deemed to be University)Jaipur through which he expressed the importance of recognizing the determining roles played by women in all societies. After the welcome address Dr. Sunil Chaturvedi, Secretary, Connect Signal was invited to speak about the NGO Connect Signal that proved monumental in making women self -reliant and giving them a platform for livelihood generation. Connect Signal was started in 2016 as a part of initiative taken by Bosch India under their social engagement programme. The agenda was to generate opportunities for livelihood to empower for women and help them become self-sufficient. In the two villages that have been adopted by Connect Signal, they carried out extensive work by through social mapping to identify the chances and scope of activities that can prove to be lucrative to the women living in that area. He talked about the exemplary case of Mohanpura village where through the initiatives of Connect Signal women transformed their lives. Mohanpura village is in proximity to Sitapura Industrial area which is the hub



of garment industry. Modules were designed to train women under 'Fit to Industry', a 45-day short-term programme. Over 100 women have been trained to take up jobs in the garment industry. For all those women who couldn't commute to city, a Common Facility Centre was set up so that they can contribute and become economically independent.



**Gender Sensitization Session** 

The Centre of Women's Studies, Women Cell and Equal Opportunity Cell of the IIS (deemed to be University) organized a Gender Sensitization Session. Gender insensitivity is an issue we deal globally, and this leads to non-participation of both men and women in important sectors. Miss Bhumika Badlani acquainted students with the construction of gender and discussed how the differences between men and women are socially constructed and how the biological identity cannot determine a human being's potential or position in the society. The sesion covered concepts related to gender and socialization process and how gender discrimination leads to an unbalanced division of labour within the social institutions and in professional spaces. The culture of discrimination is normalized and hence we witness problems like dowry system, sexual harassment, differential treatment in personal and professional spaces. The discussion exposed various myths that are society is occupied with when it comes to the idea of gender and how that can be transformed to have a better society.

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








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
