INCEPTION

The IISU grew out of the International College for Girls (ICG) which was established in 1995, as a college affiliated to the University of Rajasthan. Since then, ICG has crossed many significant milestones in its journey towards excellence in higher education. Besides receiving numerous other accolades, it was accredited A+ by the NAAC of UGC in 2005. It was also identified as a Model College by the state government in 2006 and thereafter it was conferred the status of Autonomous College in 2007 by the U.G.C. It was further recognized as a College with Potential for Excellence (CPE) by the UGC in 2010. In a national survey conducted by AC-Nielsen-ORG MARG, also in 2010 for the India Today magazine, ICG was rated as the topmost college in the state in Arts, Science and Commerce streams. Ranked among the top 30 institutions of the country in this survey, the College became a symbol of quality education and women's empowerment. The institution while working as an Autonomous College was declared as Deemed-to-be-a-University by the Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD), Government of India, vide its notification dated 2nd Febraury, 2009, issued under Section 3 of the UGC Act, 1956. This, more than an achievement, was a reaffirmation of our faith in the quality and innovation, in research and academics taken up at the institution right from its inception in 1995. Soon after becoming Deemed University in the name and style of 'The IIS University', in a review conducted by the 'Tandon Committee' constituted by the MHRD, it was recognized for its competence and strength and was placed in category 1, along with the 37 other Deemed-to-be-Universities of Category 1 across the country. This has accorded IISU greater reliability and credibility and provided with a unique opportunity to explore and put in place what is needed to empower its students through the three Es -Efficiency, Excellence and Effectiveness and prepare them as worthy citizens, ready to takeup social and economic reforms with a scientific aptitude.

Thus, from a visionary beginning in 1995, IISU is now moving on to new heights as a digitally smart campus with contemporary and relevant programmes and e-learning systems. Alongside its rapid growth and development, the University retains a friendliness and warmth, which has characterized the institution from its early days. With about 5000 students on its rolls and more than 300 faculty and staff members, it offers Undergraduate, Postgraduate and Doctoral degree programmes in streams like, Arts, Humanities, Visual Arts, Science, Home Science, Social Sciences, Computer Science and IT, Commerce and Management, Fashion Designing, Jwellery Designing etc. A multidisciplinary University, its curriculum requires both

The students were provided the information on cloud computing where he told the students about the growing need of computers in our day to day life so the computing resources that we need also go up. The data and the services provided reside in massively scalable data centers and can be ubiquitously accessed from any connected device all over the world.

He further discussed different types of cloud computing. Also he motivated students that cloud computing enables innovation by alleviating the need of innovators to find resources to develop, test, and make their innovations available to the user community. Innovators are free to focus on the innovation rather than the logistics of finding and managing resources that enable the innovation.

The overall session was enlightening and the students enjoyed it. The session ended with thank you note by expressing gratitude to Mr. Sharma for taking out time from his busy schedule and making the students aware of the basics of Cloud Computing.

Intellectual Property Rights in the field of Jewellery Designing

A guest lecture on "Intellectual Property Rights in the field of Jewellery Designing" has been organised dated 19 Oct'19 in the Department of Jewellery Designing at the



IIS (Deemed to be University) Jaipur where the resource person is IP Facilitator Pankaj Kumar arranged by the IP Management Cell (IPMC) of the University.

More particularly, it covers basics of IPRs, categories and the types of IPRs, introduction of various IPRs, rationale behind IPRs, balancing of the rights, objectives, options to the innovators.

The beneficiaries of the program were around 20 students and 2 teaching staffs from the department. During the interaction, some participants showed their created designs and requested copyright and Industrial design registration. The course develops cultural, business and professional awareness as well as communication skills. Work becomes increasingly self-directed through the course.

Some participants informed that so far they share their created design to any person interested and put such designs in open access and now they realized that it would be difficult to prohibit other person to misappropriate other creation until the claim supported by strong evidences which may be admissible to the law of courts. There are some tips given how to freeze the evidence of such creation helpful later to prove the rights.

The speaker for the lecture was Professor Pranab Banerji who has been a professor of Economics at Indian Institute of Public Administration and Lal Bahadur Shastri National Academy of Public Administration, Mussoorie. He has been a Visiting Professor at the Centre of Economic Studies and Planning, Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi and Guest Faculty at IIM Rohtak, NTPC Business School Noida, RGIPT (under Ministry of Petroleum) and School of Planning and Architecture, New Delhi. There were fifty students who attended the lecture. Prof C.R.Bishnoi, head, Department of Economics, felicitated Prof. Banerji. In his lecture, Prof.Banerji discussed the current state of Indian economy and why the year



2019 witnessed the slowdown of Indian Economy. According to him, the fall in the rate of growth of GDP (Gross Domestic Product) of India affected the overall performance of the economy. He provided insight into the theory of macroeconomics which can be studied to determine how the changes in the components of aggregate demand- consumption, investment, government expenditure and exports, can affect the growth of GDP. Decrease in consumption of consumer goods and automobile goods are causing unemployment, further decline in profits and capital formation are causing fall in investments. All of this is also creating uncertainty in the financial market. The other have been decline in the incomes of farmers and increase in the educated unemployment, income inequalities and stagnation of income of middle class. Also decline in exports and government spending are affecting aggregate demand in the economy.

In the interactive session with the students, Prof. Banerji also discussed some solutions to combat slowdown, which are- creation of job opportunities, consumption of basic consumer goods to increase overall consumption and investments in the economy.

This lecture threw light on the current status of Indian economy and it made all the students aware of reasons behind it in a clear and effective manner.

He talked about bottleneck in this field. Since genomics is a data driven domain, more the data being generated, more is the manpower required to analyze the data. Close to 40 exabytes of the sequencing data is expected to be generated peryear by 2025. The lack of skilled manpower is proving out to be a big bottleneck in this opportunity abundant domain.

This lecture surely will help students in deep Understanding of Functional Genomics. It will also aid to the students and scientists who are planning to work on Next Generation Sequencing Based research projects using RNA-Seq, ChIp-Seq, DNA-Seq, Amplicon Seq,etc.

They organize an array of activities to enhance the help extended to the sightless.

The various activities at the school ensure that the deprived learn and master skills which will help them to fetch them good jobs. They also prepare them for self-employment. All this, so that the visually impaired can live a comfortable life and sustain their families. A ray of hope for the visually impaired, **Rajasthan NetraheenKalyanSangh** did a tremendous job for the betterment of its students.

The sangh provide the education and boarding facility for children. The school is from 1st standard to 12 th standard. There were 15 teachers which includes blind and normal teachers. There is well established hostel for boys and girls separately. The rooms are around 15 for boys and 8 for girls. In each room there were approximately 3-4 children. The students are provided 4 meals daily, breakfast, lunch ,tea and dinner.

The education, provided to the kids is free of cost. In addition, free boarding and lodging facilities are also rendered. Their only aim is to nourish and develop them so that each and everyone can live a normal life. And can break the superstition surrounding them that the blind cannot live well.

Computer education has become a necessity in every walk of life. Keeping that in view, RNKS started computer center and learning resource center in collaboration with Amway Opportunity Foundation. The objective of computer education is to empower the students so that they can keep up with the development of the technology. In turn, it will fulfill the criteria of making the visually impaired, jobready.

Braille is the standard script to read and write in the world for the visually impaired and blind people. It's the only measure by which they can learn. Hence, RNKS has set up a Braille Production Center comprising contemporary equipment and a team of well-qualified professionals, to publish books and magazines based on Braille.Furthermore, they publish the only **braille newspaper** 'Braille Samacharpatra' that informs and inspires the visually challenged people.

RNKS has come up with the **digital audio books** recording project. The books are recorded and then distributed to the destitute free of cost. **RNKS has established** a library consisting of braille and talking books. Any person of any age can access the books here, at zero cost.



The students really were surprised with the school, hostel and the facilities. It was a memorable experience and students learned how to use Braille and teaching aids.



VISIT TO RAJASTHAN NETRAHEEN KALYAN SANGH, JAIPUR

An Educational trip to Nahargarh Biological Park Jaipur

On 4th October 2019, during wildlife week, the Department of Zoology organized an educational trip for students to Nahargarh Biological Park, Kukas and enriched their knowledge about faunal as well as floral diversity. The visit to the park was an enlightening effort to make the students learn in the lap of Mother Nature. The students of BSc and MSc were able to visualize different fauna and their behavioural interactions. The park is an abode for tiger, lions, leopards, wolves, fox, jackals, hyenas, black bear, spotted deer, black buck, sambhar deer, Indian gazelle, hog deer, emu, alligators, crocodiles, porcupines, wild boar, langurs and a cascade of butterflies which included plain tiger, lemon pansy, common rose, lime, blue pansy, peacock pansy, common jejebel, white orange tip, pioneer, oriental glass jewel, common yellow, indian palm bob and rounded pierrot. The park also contained numerous species of birds which included rufoustreepie, peacock, kingfisher, tailor bird, babbler, bee eaters, indian roller, parakeet, pigeon, laughing dove, red wattled lapwing, drongo, robin, bulbul, and humming bird etc. The students were also enlightened by the NGO-RAKSHA about the importance of venomous and nonvenomous snakes. SOS Children' Villages of India, Rajasthan

There were total 196 children in SOS, 92 girls and 104 boys. There are14 SOS families, where they grow up with their sisters and brothers. Every home is known



by different name i.e. Neer etc. Each home has mother and there are approximately 13-14 members in one family. Every home has 3 bedrooms, drawing room and kitchen.

There is computer centre also in the SOS which is well equipped with the computers. The teacher visit there and teach them about basic skills in Computer. SOS village also has first aid facility for all the members.

The students were very much impressed with the school ,their management and infrastructure.

The project ensures empowerment and sustainable livelihood opportunities for its beneficiaries, by creating quality hand made products based on the principle of fair trade. It is being funded by Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Government of Rajasthan, Donations and contribution of local community.

The students visited the center and interacted with the teachers, trainers etc. They also interacted with few beneficiaries of the organization to prepare their case studies. Industrial Visit to MayurUniquoters, Dhodsar, Jaipur

Department of Chemistry, IIS University, Jaipur has organized an industrial visit for the postgraduate students. The visit to **MayurUniquoters**, **Dhodsar**, Jaipur leather industry was a wonderful experience for our students. The students were



enlightened with the knowledge of manufacturing of artificial leather/PVC vinyl using release paper transfer coating technology and found the visit very relevant and useful for their subject. They were informed about applications of organic solvents, copolymers and colour pigments and the work of certain machineries like circular knitting machines, Brazzoli machines for washing and bleaching of fabrics, hot slitter machines, sterner machines and also how the manufactured products are inspected chemically and physically in laboratories.

They were made aware of the eco-friendly operations of the industry. The above visit provided an opportunity to students to upgrade and enhance their academic skills and their entrepreneurship.



VISIT TO BAREFOOT COLLEGE, TILONIA

The Department of Economics, The IIS University conducted a field visit to Barefoot College, Tilonia for students of undergraduate and post graduate on 21st October 2019. The aim of the visit was to environmentally analyse the team work, other positive traits as well as academic excellence through innovative technology and methodology such as Solar Plants, Biogas Plants, Drip Irrigation etc.

Barefoot College, Tilonia was visited by 31 students of the department. Students were also shown the art of puppetry and how people are trained to portray the importance of skill based learning by the art of puppet shows. Students were also made familiar with some of their most famous puppet characters and also how the people there have prepared some acts to describe the journey of the Barefoot College to the guests and visitors there.

After enhancing their knowledge about the traditional art and uses of puppetry, students were taken to the factory where all the handicrafts were being prepared. Proper knowledge about the machines and materials and the manufacturing process was being provided to the students. After this session students were taken to



the**solar department** where a workshop on photo voltaic cells was going on. Women trainees (popularly known as Solar mamas) from 12 countries viz. Mexico, Syria, Senegal , Madagascar, Bali, Somalia, Kiribati etc. were receiving training on solar components. Pokhar Mal Ji explained, "Barefoot college provides training in solar lighting, solar water heaters, parabolic solar cookers and solar powered water desalination technology addressing the energy needs of people where electricity doesn't reach. Trainees are often illiterate or semi-literate middle-aged women from rural villages worldwide who are trained to become solar engineers."

Students were taken to the Tilonia craft shop (handicraft emporium) showcasing a variety of traditional decorative pillows, bedspreads, paper books, quilts and duvet covers. Emporium manager explained students about different types of traditional arts used in making items here and that all the items are handmade, produced in house by rural women artisans. He said "The purpose behind setting up such type of emporium is that we wanted to **empower** the rural women and make them self-reliant. During our audits in nearby areas we found that rural women are capable of making creative products if given proper training and support. Thus we started a handicraft center for training and sales purpose and now you can see women are creating wonders."

Also the unit where sustainable sanitary pads are made was a nice experience to come across as it taught the students that how by using environmental friendly things they have surpassed some developed cities as well in their thought process. We also met a lady who has never ever attended school and still can perform some major dental procedures just be watching and learning experts.

Kunstocom India limited is well known for Design & Development of Mould, Manufacturing of Plastic Components for Automotive, Electronics and Consumer Durables and Assemblies.

The visit to the above mentioned industries was organized for the purpose of understanding the manufacturing process and the environmental Management system (EMS) of the companies which is a part of the curriculum at PG level. After the visit Students could understand the process of manufacturing LED bulbs and motors at Havell and the process of manufacturing plastic spare parts at Kunstocom India limited.

The visit helped students to understand the prerequisite and process of getting an ISO 14000 certification for the company.

For getting acquaintance with the flora and fauna of Himalyan region, the group visited Jim Corbett National park where the students could got a chance of observing varied type of flora and fauna indigenous to the region. A Visit to Dravyavati Experience Centre

Educational visits gives lifetime learningsalong with exposure and practical understandings. An educational visit toDravyavati experience centre (Jaipur) was organized by Department of Management (HRM & IB), IIS (deemed to be University) Jaipur. The major objective of the visit was to attain the better understanding of subject "Project Management" and to know the real scenario and technicalities of the project.

Dravyavati River was once a thriving river turned into a drain (AmanishahNallah), to rejuvenate this river a project was taken by TATA group in collaboration with Jaipur Development Authority (JDA). This rejuvenation project is based on the concept of watershed rehabilitation, flood prevention, pollution treatment and recovering the lost ecology of the river. Dravyavati River project "A 47.5 km of beauty, cleanliness and joy!"



The visit held was exclusively for MBA semester 4th students. Total 25students and two faculty coordinators Dr. MahimaRai and Dr. VarshaChoudhary left the campus at 10:10 a.m. and reached the Dravyavati river front by 10:30 a.m. Initially students explored the entire project sight, i.e. Riverfront and landscape park walkway after that students explored the Experience centre it is beautifully constructed and has pictorial representation of Dravyavati River since the year 1770 till 2018 .A beautiful tree that has been made from scrap material, that were gathered while cleaning the nallah at the entrance of the experience centre. Later on, we students were guided towards AV hall inside experience centre which have subtle interior. There students had an interactive session with Mr. Prasant from TATA groups. Initially they showed a short film on Dravyavati river project which stated that the Project is dedicated to residents of Jaipur and aims to improve health and sanitation by proper waste collection and then they gave a brief introduction of project in which they talked about project proponents i.e. water channels, check dams, walk ways, plantation, 3 Parks, garbage collection, STP, street lightings, Wi-Fi facilities, and security surveillance and the project experience centre building (PEC building). They enlightened students with their in-depth knowledge of the subject and all the technicalities of the projectwith the help of a presentation through which we got to know the materials, technology(SBR) and expertise (engineers and IITians) that has been involved into the project and that the project is a lumpsum EPC (engineering, procurement construction) Project. They gave us some factual knowledge like 1,7500 trees has been planted, and landscape development of 1,00,000 sqm and employment generation (30,000+) and reclamation of value of land.

They also shed light on challenges faced by them during project and how they cope up with such challenges. They talked about their planning for future maintenance of the river as well. Furthermore, they talked about project management concepts linking it to the practicalities of project which includes, Project life cycle phases, social cost benefit and feasibility and all the core aspects of the project like the financial aspects, social aspects, economic aspects, environmental aspects etc. were covered. The session was very wholesome and informative. The visit came to an end with a group photograph and they also provided a Project Brochure to all students. The entire visit was effectual and full of enlightenment and so with good memories and truckloads of experience students reached back to the campus by 12:30 p.m.

Report on Educational Visit to RIICO Sewage Treatment Plant (STP), Jaipur

The department of Environmental Science of IIS (Deemed to be University) Jaipur organized a one day educational visit to RIICO Sewage Treatment Plant, Jaipur on 4th February 2020 for undergraduate and postgraduate students of Environmental Science department. The main purpose of this visit was to enhance the practical and field knowledge of the students, to relate the theoretical concepts with real time problems and solutions, and most importantly to give them the exposure to sewage treatment plant setup. A total of 21 students along with one faculty member, Mr. AshishTambi, Assistant Professor, Dept. of Environmental Science, visited the plant. The site Visit was organized with the prior permission of Mr. BhupeshSaraswat, Jr. Engineer, Jaipur Development Authority (JDA), Jaipur.

The RIICO Sewage Treatment Plant was designed for 100 MLD capacity based on Sequential Batch Reactor Technology popularly known as SBR Technology discharging its effluent into Dravyawati River, Jaipur. M/S TATA Projects Ltd., SUCG Consortium, manages this sewage treatment plant and the complete operation of the SBR basin/reactor is controlled automatically through PLC system. All key functions are automatically controlled along with data logging. Complete historical records of plant operation are available on SCADA system.

On reaching the site, Mr. Vinay Narayan Wadgaonkar, Manager (QS), RIICO STP explained the students about the various processes and working of Sewage treatment plant units. Students were also taken to the laboratory where the wastewater samples are tested on routine basis to check meet the efficiency of the



plant in terms of maintaining the effluent standards for inland waste water discharge set by MOEFCC. The parameters which are regularly checked and monitored in the laboratory includes BOD, COD, ammonia, nitrate nitrogen, coliform count, etc. The field visit gave an opportunity to the aspiring students to have an insight to real site working mechanism including process of sewage treatment. By this visit students got familiar with industrial environment and get knowledge of different units of waste water treatment plant.

A one day educational visit to DST- Science Park, Jaipur

A one educational day visit to DST- Science Park, Jaipur was organized on 13th February, 2020. Thursday by Department of Biotechnology and zoology for M.Sc. (Biotechnology & Microbiology) students. It particularly focused on "women in Science: Hands on" on the occasion of National women's day. This visit was planned for not only empowering our students with the most recent and current trends in the field of Biotechnology and microbiology but also with the role of women in the field of bio-physics, biochemistry and molecular Biology.

Students attended the inaugural function, science film show and talk, poetry elocution, nukkadnatak etc. Students took keen interest and participated in card making competition later etc. In this visit 30 students visited and they were accompanied by two faculty members from biotechnology and zoology



departments respectively. Over all it was a very learning experience and students were looking forward to more of this type of visits.

Visit to SDS Instruments Stall

SDS Instruments have put up a stall at 48th Dairy Industry Conference, Jaipur at Birla Auditorium from 20th Feb. to 22nd Feb. 2020. They have invited the faculty members and students of Department of Home Science, IIS (Deemed to be UNIVERSITY), Jaipur to visit the stall and see the functioning of the instruments like Texture Analyzer, water Activity meter and Head Space analyzer.

On 22nd Feb. 2020, one of the faculty member ad 3 research scholars of the Department of Home Science went to visit the stall and have observed the functioning of all the instruments displayed at the stall.

First of all, after reaching the stall, we have seen the functioning of Texture Analyzer. It is used to quantify sensory evaluations like Freshness, spreadability, tenderness, springiness, gumminess, hardness, firmness, consistency, fracturability etc. of variety of food products like bread, biscuits, jams, jellies, chocolate, cereals, dough, Readyto-eat Extruded foods like kurkure, chips etc. We have seen the fracturability of kurkure, gooday biscuits, spreadability of dough. With the use of Texture Analyzer the results can be obtained in just 15-20 minutes.

Later, we have seen the functioning of water Activity meter, this instrument is used to measure the water Activity of dairy, milk and other products like bread, biscuits etc. The instrument employs chilled mirror dew point technology for water activity analysis. This instrument is software supported. We get the results in few minutes.



Lastly, We have seen how the Head Space analyzer analyses the concentration of modified atmospheric gases in the headspace of flexile and rigid packages such as foil sachets, cans, bottles, packets of extruded products like lays, bingo, kurkure, puffcorn etc. We have served how it works to measure the headspace of lays packet. The instruments were of utility as our students develop new products both as part of their dissertation work and research work, so it would be of use to them. Moreover it was easy to use and give results in few minutes but very expensive the cost of texture analyser was 16 lakhs, water activity meter was 9 lakhs and headspace analyzer was more expensive.

Overall the visit was fruitful and we have learned the functioning also.

VISIT TO BOSCH PLANT

The company's CSR department is tied with the 6 NGOs and by the management faculty the students are divided into 6 groups with 3 to 4 members each. The different tasks are assigned to individual students who will perform and work under the supervision of their coordinators of the specific NGO. At the end of the session students got an opportunity to interact with their coordinators and know about the further working with them. The students found this meeting highly constructive and informative and got an amazing opportunity to work with them. After the session visit came to an end with a group photograph and students returned to the university campus at 12:40 p.m.


The experience was very informative and learning for the students about the structure of PanchayatSamiti and how the work and other centers are operated for welfare of the villagers.

They invited Dr. M. C. Kharkwal, IAEA, Expert, Ex. Principal Scientist, IARI, New Delhi to deliver his lecture on current status of genetically modified crops in the world. Extension Activity Titled- "Gender Discrimination"

The Department of Home Science of the IIS University organized an extension activity on Gender Discrimination on 14th Sept 2019 in Haziyawala community. The extension activity was organized by **Ms. Archanakumari**, Assistant Professor, Department of H.Sc, Human Development and students of B.Sc (H) H.Sc Semester III.

The programme aimed at creating awareness among women and children of urban slum about gender discrimination at home, school and public places.

Target Group & Venue:

The target group for this activity was women and primary school children of Haziawala community. The reason behind selecting this particular section was that when the NSS team of IISU was conducting their activity, it was observed by the coordinator that many students especially females are irregular. The principal of the school informed that she talked to their mother and got to know that since in most of the family both the parents are working and they leave their daughter at home to take care of the home and siblings. So a urgent need was felt to conduct an extension activity in this area.

The activity was organized in the premises of Haziawala Government Primayschool after taking the prior permission from the principal of the school. A total of 106 women and children of the community attended the activity.

Materials & Methods Used:

The whole activity was planned in three steps namely, Presentation, Role Play, games and Interaction with women and children. Materials were prepared accordingly like pictorial self- explanatory PPT, costumes, stickpuppets for games etc.

First a game was played by all the participants in which questions were asked by the students regarding expected gender role. All the participants were given sticks puppet having pictures of girl and boy. They were asked to show the appropriate puppet according to them suited for that particular role. This game was conducted to have an idea about the prevailing gender streotypes and perception of gender role in the community. It was surprising to know that most of the household chores were expected to be done by the girl child whereas male child were given much freedom. This was followed by a role play performed by all students depicting different ways in which gender discrimination is done by parents, family members and teachers. All the students participated in this role play as per the role assigned to them.



Lastly an interactive and counseling session was held with the help of pictorial PPT. Women were counseled to give equal opportunity to their girl child in every field. They were told about the changing gender roles in today's society with the help of PPT.

Impact of the Activity:

It was observed that the interactive session was very effective. Women and children interacted with students about their prejudices and stereotypical thought. Many of them said that they also faced gender discrimination in their own family in their childhood. So they have those prejudices that girls are supposed to perform household chores and boys are better at outside work. One old lady was very sad as she was having two three granddaughters and no grandson. Many females were having two-three daughter but they are hoping to have a boy baby in the next delivery. Many females were workers and they shared their feelings that how they are being discriminated by their employer for their wages and leaves. Towards the end some of them realized that they need to change their stereotypical thought regarding gender roles. The activity was ended with a hope that one day they will raise their voice against this shameful act. In the end small refreshments were given to all the participants. i.e. Poha and tea.

Navratra Celebration in SaraswatiAnchal Day Care Center

In India, Navratri is Hindus famous festival celebrated with great joy and reverence. This festival is a joyous way of worshipping Goddess Durga. Day-1

Inaugural Session

The conference commenced on 13th March, 2020 at 10:00am with theInaugural Session, seeking the blessings of the Almighty in the form of SaraswatiVandana. This was followed by lightning of the lamp by the dignitaries on the dais – keynote speakerProf. N. Venkatachalapathy, Head, Department of Food Engineering, IndianInstitute of Food Processing and Technology, Thanjavur, Tamil Nadu, Honourable Vice Chancellor, IIS (deemed to be University), Dr Ashok Gupta, Rector and Registrar, IIS (deemed to be University), DrRaakhi Gupta, Dean, Faculty of Science, Prof. PradeepBhatnagar, Conference ConvenorProf. Ila Joshi and Organizing Secretary DrGargiSaxena.

This ceremony was followed by the Presidential and welcome address by the conference chairperson **Dr. Ashok Gupta**, Vice-Chancellor, IIS (deemed to be University), Jaipur. He extended a warm welcome to the resource persons and delegates who braved the scare of corona virus and came to attend the conference from all around the country.**Prof. PradeepBhatnagar**, conference Counsellor, then acquainted the delegates with the purpose of the conference. This was followed by the release of the book of abstracts by the keynote speaker **Prof. N. Venkatachalapathy**. In his inaugural remark, the keynote speaker called all the



delegates as brave hearts for fighting the Corona virus and coming to attend the conference. He talked about how India was dependent on foreign countries for food some 50 years back whereas today India not only produces food but exports it as well! He threw light on the latest trends in food processing to make food available to all throughout the year. He concluded his talk by motivating the students and young scientists to opt for start- ups and become employers instead of job seekers. The inaugural session ended with a formal vote of thanks by conference convenor Prof. Ila Joshi. The inaugural session was followed by the Keynote Session. Prof. N. Venkatachalapathy delivered the keynote address on the theme of the conference. He talked about the leadingcause of the development of processed foods. He emphasised that new consumer satisfaction technologies are required to mitigate hunger so as to fight against malnutrition. His talk also covered various types of Ready to eat foods available in today's market, various processing methods employed to improve the shelf life of the products. He ended his talk with the message "Eat Right, select good processed foods that are nutritious."

Technical session I

This session was chaired by **Prof. PradeepBhatnagar**, Dean, Faculty of Science, IIS (deemed to be University), Jaipur. The invited speakers of this session were **Prof. V.H.Patel**, Head, Department of Foods and Nutrition, Sadar Patel University, Anand, Gujarat and **Prof. MamtaTiwari**, Director, Prioritization, Monitoring & Evaluation and Associate Director, Extension at Agriculture University, Kota.

Prof. V.H.Patel, delivered a talk on "**Nutrigenomics: An Interdisciplinary approach towards healthy life**". He started by explaining that Nutrition + genetics= nutrigenomics. He said that, Genetic material differs with person to person. Therefore, personalized nutrition, custom made for one's genes is needed.

Prof. MamtaTiwari gave a talk on "Entrepreneurship through Agro Processing and value addition" wherein she highlighted the importance of providing jobs to poor farmers through skill development trainings and entrepreneurship ventures.

Technical session II

Technical session II was chaired by **DrMadhuBala Singh**, Scientist 'G', ICMR, DMRC, Jodhpur. In this session, two invited speakers **Prof. P. K. Nema**, Department of Food Engineering, NIFTEM, Sonepat and **Ms. Shakun Sharma**, Senior Project Associate, Food Fortification Programme – GAIN, New Delhi delivered their talks.

Prof. P. K. Nemaspoke on "Superheated steam drying for better retention of nutrients in the processed food products". In his talk, he has discussed about the need of drying food commodities and various methods employed in drying of the food for better retention of nutrients and better shelf life. He has focussed on Hybrid drying method, a upcoming technique and the technology of SSD ie. superheated steam drying along with its advantages and disadvantages.



Ms. Shakun Sharma from GAIN talk about "Food Fortification: Enriching Foods, Enriching lives". She has thrown light on importance of food fortification. She has shared the latest data on prevalence of malnutrition, anaemia and other micro nutrient deficiencies prevailing in India. Ms. Sharma also discussed the technique of fortification of salt, flour and oil and about the logo of fortification.

The Technical session II was followed by **oral presentations** by Young Scientists from different cities of the country. **DrKanikaVarma**, Associate Professor, Department of Home Science, University of Rajasthan, Jaipur has chaired the session. There were six oral presentations in this session. The judges for the same were **DrSreemoyeeChatterjee**, Associate Professor, Department of Biotechnology, IIS (deemed to be University) and **DrYaminiChaturvedi**, Associate Professor, Commissionerate College Education, ShikshaSankul, Jaipur.

Day 2

On the second day, the conference commenced at 9:00 am with poster presentations by young scientists. The posters were judged **Dr P. N. Kalla**, Dean, Faculty of Science, Jagannath University, Jaipur and **DrCharuJhamaria**, Associate Professor, Department of Environmental Sciences, IIS (deemed to be University), Jaipur.

Technical session III started at 10:30 am on day 2. Session was chaired by **Prof BeenaMathur**, Retired from Department of Home Science, University of Rajasthan, Jaipur. The speakers of this session were **DrMadhuBala Singh**, Scientist 'G', ICMR, DMRC, Jodhpur and **Mr. Anshuman Jain**, packaging consultant, Mindbox Packaging Solutions, Jaipur.

DrMadhuBala Singh delivered her talk on "**Role of pearl millets and its products in improving nutritional outcomes**". She stressed on the importance of pearl millet for ironretention, zinc retention and prevention of anemia.

Mr. Anshuman Jain talked on "**Food Packaging**". He emphasised on variety of packaging materials available, importance of biodegradable packaging, threat of plastic disposal and the latest trends in food packaging. He has also focussed on how packaging is done and content specific packaging.

Technical session III, was followed by 10 oral presentations. Total 16 presentations were given by young budding scientists.

This session was followed by Lunch.

The last session was **Technical session IV**, which emphasised specifically on Food Safety. This session was chaired by **DrMuktaAgrawal**, Associate Professor & Head, Department of Home Science, University of Rajasthan, Jaipur. The speakers of this session were **Mr Rahul Mathur**, Academic Head & HOD, Front office, Ananta Institute of Hotel Management, Jaipur and **Mohd. Shahid**, Plant Manager, Frubon, Jaipur.

Mr Rahul Mathur delivered his talk on "Food Risk Analysis". He has covered all the three aspects of Food risk analysis ie. Risk assessment, risk management and risk



communication along with Hazard Analysis Critical Control Points, a very important parameter in maintaining

Food Safety. He concluded his talk by saying, "Food safety affects us all, and in our daily lives we naturally want to avoid food that puts our health at risk".

MrMohd. Shahidtalked about "**Food Safety and Management System**". He has focussed on the regulatory authorities of the Government, basically the rules and regulations laid down by FSSAI to be followed by each food industry.

The conference concluded with a valedictory session where awards and certificates were distributed to the winners of oral and poster presentations. The awards were given only to the student category. TanushreeChakraborthy has won the first prize and Sunidhi Mishra From MPUAT, Udaipur has won second prize in oral presentation. Further, the opening and welcome regards were given by Dr. Ashok Gupta. He told about the importance of periodic table in our daily life. Prof. R K Bansal briefed about the events going to be held and also he addressed about Prof. UdayMaitra.

The winners of **Chemistry Olympiad** from each institution were awarded by Dr. Ashok Gupta and Prof. UdayMaitra. Around 57 students (first, second and third position holders from each institutions) from 19 institutions were awarded. 


Orientation Programme for Undergraduate Students

documents and learn LaTeX as they go. Students learnt the tool very well and hope will use in writing their seminars, dissertation, research paper etc.

LaTeX is a document preparation system and is widely used in many scientific fields like mathematics, statistics, computer science, engineering, chemistry, physics, economics, linguistics, etc.. It is a powerful and open-source system that provides numerous facilities for automating typesetting of the document: i.e. structuring page layout, listing and auto-numbering of sections, tables, figures, generating a table of contents, managing cross-referencing, citing, and indexing. Unlike other WYSIWYG editors, the content is written in plain text along with appropriate commands, thus, allowing the user to concentrate on the content rather than the aesthetics.

- Scissors, rough cloth, brushes, carbon paper yellow, news papers
- Basic stationary material

Day 1: Liquid Embroidery



Ms. Raj Dholiwal demonstrated free hand Embroidery technique using Pidilite Fevicryl Colours and 3D outliner. She used 3D colours on cotton fabric to give the effect of embroidery. Such colors can be used on T-shirts, Scarf, Saree and Kurtas.

Day 2: Photo mug Designing

Ms. Raj Dholiwal demonstrated that how u can make photo mug at home with low cost using acrylic colors and Pidilite modge podge. Students also tried to make the articles using the same and they were very happy to see the results. After the activity Ms. Raj Dholiwal took the online feedback from all the participants. She also applause for the participants and said that they are very creative and did a very good job by creating articles using the techniques demonstrated by her.

Demonstration of Sewing Machines

The Department of Fashion & Textiles organised a demonstration on Array, Flat lock, Over lock, Leather sewing machine and fabric cutting machine for the students of M.A/M.Sc./M.com semester I. Mr. Deeraj Motiani along with his technician was the resource person. They demonstrated the various functions of flat lock and over lock sewing machines which are electronic and technologically advanced models. They also demonstrated working of embroidery machine from Brother's, heavy fabric stitching machine, fabric cutting machine. Students learnt the working of flat lock and over lock machine to stitch their knitted garments. Students are also learnt the working of fashion maker.

Students practiced on aray machines, flat lock, over lock machines for stitching of knitted fabrics. The focus of the demonstation was to develop skills and understand working procedure of flat lock, over lock, aray machines. Students found this session to be highly informative and useful.

Curative & Preventive Conservation of Textiles

Department of Fashion & Textiles organized two day National Workshop on "Curative and Preventive Conservation of Textiles" in collaboration with Textiles and Clothing Research Centre (TCRC). The main objective of the workshop was to bring together experts from the field of Textile conservation to give hand on training for better upkeep of artifacts. This workshop was conducted with the help of presentations and practical exercises. There were 53 participants from all over the India. Besides Rajasthan, there were participants from Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh and Uttar Pradesh.

The workshop began with the inaugural session seeking the blessings of almighty followed by lighting the lamp. Guests were given a formal welcome.

Resource persons of the workshop were Dr. Anamika Pathak, Founder Chairperson, Textile and Clothing Research Centre (TCRC). Dr. Simmi Bhagat, Associate Professor, Lady Irvin Collage, Founder Member TCRC, New Delhi. Ms. Smita Singh, Textile Conservation Consultant, Founder Member and Chief Editor TCRC, New Delhi.



On day one workshop began with an inaugural ceremony. In which Dr. Ashok Gupta, Vice Chancellor, IIS (Deemed to be University) Jaipur extended warm welcome to all the resource persons, delegates and participants and threw light on the importance and relevance of the workshop. After this Dr. Anamika Pathak highlighted the importance of preserving textiles for historic interest. She also explained the aesthetic appeal and cultural significance the textiles. She explained role of textile as heirloom, art and craft. She mentioned Rajasthan as the "Garh" of textiles because of its rich heritage and culture. In her presentation she showed collection of textiles of Museum through pictorial presentation to give exposure towards cultural heritage.

After this session, Dr. Simmi Bhagat explained the meaning of conservation with reference to textile as cultural property. She focused on restoration as a third branch of conservation after preventive and curative treatment. She emphasized on different factors of deterioration like natural and manmade and discussed the factors that cause damages through an example of Calico Museum Ahmedabad. Sensitivity of textiles and vulnerability to decay when stored or displayed in inappropriate environmental conditions was also explained.

Thereafter Dr.Anamika Pathak briefed the audience about the handling and movement of textile objects. She described the materials used in handling of textiles like aluminium with wooden edges, PVC tubes of different dimensions according to the products and for storage of the object like flat keeping, framing, mounting and card box.

Another session was taken by Ms. Smita Singh. The key highlights were on the different factors and causes of deterioration like mechanical, physical and chemical. She gave the condition report for textiles to the participants for getting an idea about the practical procedures of documentation of textiles. This report is used by the conservators in museum to keep record of the objects. She also explained the concept of reactions which can be the cause of degradation of textiles like photochemical and oxidative reactions in the presence of light, humidity and temperature. She also explained how condition reports are produced after detailed examination of the object.

The second day of the workshop begins with the session conducted by Ms. Smita Singh. She addressed on analysis and testing methods for textiles like weave analysis, stitch analysis and digital methods. She explained the method of handling objects which includes folding with the concept of tissue paper padding to resist the object from creases.



This was followed by an overview of curative treatment of textiles. She explained that there are two types of cleaning i.e. mechanical and solvent cleaning were explained. She emphasized the selection of appropriate cleaning method to be used for conservation of textiles either in museum or in personal wardrobe.

She explained the concept of cleaning through pictorial presentation, and demonstration was given. She also showcased the specimen of adhesive coating to the participants for better understanding of object preservation. She also demonstrated the digital tool known as dinolight microscope which is used to take pictures of minute details of the object. This was followed by practical exercise where participants used sponge, brush and vacuum cleaner for cleaning purpose. Thereafter Dr. Simmi Bhagat took a session on stabilization of textiles. In this session she explained the basic stabilization of textile conservation stitches. She demonstrated various stitches and participants tried those stitches on samples.

The sum up the workshop was very useful and meaningful for the participants and delegates. With the help of practical experiences participants were able to understand the importance of valuable textile heritage, handling the museum artefacts and basic curative conservation techniques for upkeep of the textiles artefacts for the posterity.

Gandhi Jayanti Celebration

Department of Fashion & Textiles celebrated "Khadi Day" on the occasion of 150th birth anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi Ji at Clothing Lab, IIS (deemed to be University), Jaipur. This day was started with brief description given by Dr. Radha Kashyap, HOD & Professor, Department of Fashion & Textiles about the positive aspects of using Khadi fabric and sustainability initiatives. Theme of the competition was Eco Ensemble where in students have developed different products like accessories, handbags, footwear etc. using waste material.

The panel of judges for the competition:

Gandhi had been an advocated for a united India where Hindu and Muslims lived together in peace and helped free the Indian people from Britain rule through nonviolence resistance and is honored by Indians as the father of the nation.

Workshop on Expressive Artwork Therapy

February 22, 2020 turned out to be a very positive day, thanks to Mrs. Manju Khaden and Mr. Khaden. These facilitators of the *Expressive Artwork Therapy* opened the session with an extremely warm greeting to everyone followed by individual introductions of all the participants. They clarified the tone of *freedom*, *non-judgment* and *safety* from the very beginning and maintained the same throughout the session. The theme of the therapy was *Self-Compassion*. This concept was broken down into 3 parts and the session was also divided into phases accordingly.

I. Recognising emotions and befriending them
The facilitators distributed drums to everyone and a team-building exercise took place. Everyone was to beat their own beat and not talk, and then drum

together with everyone as well. This enhanced the realization that each person



was alone but also together at the same time. After this, the facilitators portrayed *six gestures of self-love* and went around asking everyone what their intensions from this session were. This was followed by a few *Tai Chi* exercises. The following aspects were covered:

<u>Emotion</u>: Scribble on the newspaper using 2 pastels representing any two negative emotions.

Message to Emotions: Write what you tell your negative emotions.

Embodiment of pain: Draw and depict where does it hurt when you experience these emotions.

This was followed by distribution of a *sensory bag* which contained a stimulus for all the 5 senses.

II. Recognize that you are not alone in experiencing these emotions

Using the newspaper (and/or pastels), we were asked to create a representation of *interconnectedness*, on half the chart. Also, a *prayer* was to be written which promotes contentment.

III. Loving yourself

Finally, the third phase was marked by creativity and pastels were used to portray self-compassion on the rest of the chart. Then, in a group of two, students were asked to discuss coping strategies.

Everyone's artwork was displayed and the session ended with a few more drumming exercises. All in all, it was an enriching experience and the session was packed with many little lessons. Expressive artwork is a rejuvenating technique which brings out your inner child.

Dialogue around gender and sexuality

The Department of Psychology, IIS (deemed to be University) organised a seminar on 29th Feb 2020 on "Dialogue around gender and sexuality" that majorly focused upon LGTB community and their constitutional rights. Breast Cancer Awareness

Breast Cancer is the most common female cancer worldwide. In India, it accounts for 25% to 32% of female cancers, where in every four minutes one woman is diagnosed with breast cancer and in every thirteen minutes one woman dies of it. To learn an ancient Indian painting technique 'Fresco Buon' which was a very prominent style of painting and can be seen in the frescos of Ajanta and was lost in the time due to invasions and some or the other reasons?

Fresco is a style of painting which is done on the prepared walls. It is an ancient Indian technique which is being practiced by a few artists of India. Dr, Nathulal Verma a miniature artist as well as a fresco artist is well known in this field. Another artist cum artisan Mr. Radha kishanji is also technically sound in preparing surface, colour and tiles to teach students the actual technique of Fresco Buon. The main objective of the workshop was to learn this ancient Indian technique to work on walls.

A piece of art is just not the final end product, it's the artist's hard work, patience, a lot of thought process put into it. It is to know from where it originated, the history it has. It requires a lot of hard work and patience to create an artwork. The students of Fine Arts were able to experience this in the "Fresco Workshop" conducted by The Department of Fine Arts, IIS Deemed to be University from 5th - 25th February'20.

Dr. Nathulal Verma and Radha Kishan Ji were the eminent artists who guided our students through it. In this 20 day workshop the 35 students learnt the art of making a fresco tile from the scratch. Starting from how a tile is made, how to make the natural colours, the process of applying it. Their patience was tested along with it, taking care of the tile as if it was a child. The phrase of putting all your heart and soul in an art work was well seen in action here.

Our faculty members and lab assistants didn't stay behind. They took this as an opportunity to enhance their skill and knowledge. They enjoyed being a student again. This chance of getting the knowledge first hand about an age old art form from the artist was a golden opportunity for everyone.

The students of painting could learn one of the famous painting style of Indian Art. They were taught to create tiles made of ancient methods, make colours through natural things like minerals, Kajal, semi precious stones etc. The students learnt the whole process of painting and technique. They were asked to create one or two tiles but they got so much interest in that they created more than three or four tiles. A great enthusiasm could be seen in the students to learn this technique and creating many tiles.



Painting Demonstration

This phenomenon was well understood in a demonstration done by Prof. Anjani Prabha Reddy , former head, painting, JawaharLal Nehru Architecture and Fine Arts University, Hyderabad. She is now working as a freelance artist. It was a good interactive session in which all the students and faculty members of Department of Fine Arts took part.

She advised the students not to lose the connection with art and practice it on a daily basis. This routine will help in building up confidence and hold on various mediums along with reducing the fear related to art. Her best advice was to be unafraid in expressing any thought and keep experimenting with art we are related to. This fearless feeling was evident in the way she applied colours to the canvas. Started off with dark colors and easily kept on mixing others into it. Experimenting was just not in her words, it was visible in the way she used the tail end of a brush to create the masterpiece on the base she had applied. The next canvas was unpredictable. None of the viewers could guess the colours that came out in the end. How easily she included a human figure in the whole composition along with the supporting elements was interesting. How to work in layers without the fear of the outcome and how to compose different elements together was what every student could learn from her.

No point in running away from new techniques she said, as the great artist Picasso also said that we should do self discovery through our art and try new things and not stick to making it realistic. Prof. Anjani was kind enough to share how she practices her art and the process she goes through in coming up with one masterpiece. She breaks out of her mundane routine and experiments with different mediums and ends up discovering a new thing. Self criticism is the key to creating good paintings that's her mantra.

She ended the workshop on the note that while being a student one should learn every preset rule of art but as we grow further one should know how to unlearn those rules. One should always keep the child alive within and everytime draw fearlessly like a child.

Day 1: 4th December, 2019

Technical Topic 1: The Impact of Fintech on Community Banks

Speaker: Mr. Nitin Saxena (Branch Manager, HDFC)

In this session, Dr. V.K. Gupta introduced students to the basics of Dematerialisation and Rematerialisation and their procedure. He demonstrated the students regarding



the opening of Demat account and how to run it. Students also learned about the factors to be considered before selecting a stock to invest in.

Technical Topic 6: The Global Derivative Market: Introduction & Practical Aspect Speaker: Dr. B.L. Gupta (Retired Associate Professor, UOR, Jaipur)

Dr. B.L. Gupta introduced participants to the world of Derivative Market. He discussed in length the various options available to investors like Forward, Future and Option and their mechanism of operation. Students were taught various Hedging strategies to manage the risk and maximize the returns in derivative market.

At the end, Workshop Director Professor M.K. Sharma congratulated the organising committee and the participants for the successful completion of the workshop.



1st Feb, 2020 BUDGET SESSION

A 'Live Budget Session' was organized by the Department of Accounting & Taxation of the IIS deemed to be University on 1 February, 2020 from 10:00a.m. to 1:00 p.m. for all university students. The session was compulsory for students of B. Com. (H) Prof., M. Com. and B. Com. (H) ATG elective to enable them better understand the practical aspect of the subject by listening to the Union Budget 2020.

Before the budget, various news channels showed expectations and opinions of common man, small and medium businessmen, farmers, company CEOs and other high ranking officials and government present and retired officials of various fields from the 15th finance commission report.

The students got to know the formal procedure of presenting a union budget in the parliament. They carefully noted the previous and new policies and provisions and then tried to analyze the changes and their prospective impact on the economy. Finance Minister, Nirmala Sitaraman pointed the 3 main points of the budget of financial year 2020-21 – Aspirational India, Economic India and Caring Society. She also stated that robotics, technology and analytics were among the focus of government for the upcoming financial year.

The key announcements included IPO (initial public offer) of LIC(Life Insurance Corporation of India), 100 more airports to be developed by 2025 under the UDAN scheme, the fund allotment to different sectors of economy like Rs. 99,300 crore for educational sector, Rs. 70,000 crore for railways, new tax rates, F.Y.(financial year) 20-21 fiscal deficit target- 3.80%, etc.

All the students actively participated in the 'Live Budget Session'. Their energy doubled up when the faculty members announced that a 'Budget Quiz' will be organized towards February end. They also appreciated the efforts of professors and other staff members to organize this session which provided them an opportunity to develop practical knowledge and analytical skills.

3 Days Workshop on Goods and Services Tax

The Department of Accounting and Taxation Department of the IIS (Deemed to be University) organised a 3 days GST workshop from 26th February to 28th February 2020. The session was taken by a team of Chartered Accountants from R Sogani and Associates, Jaipur. The workshop mainly covered the concepts related to return filing, registration, E-way Bills and refund under GST law.

The two experts discussed in detail the process of filing forms GSTR-1 and GSTR-3B. He also discussed the usage and need of Credit notes and utilisation of Input Tax Credit. The session ended with an assessment for students about the basics of GST.

Day 3: 28-02-2020

The final day session was conducted by CA Keshav Gupta and Mr. Vijay Chandolia wherein GSTR-9, e way bills and refunds were discussed in detail. A quiz was also held in the end where Rishika Singhal of B. Com. (Hons.) (ATG) stood first, Daksha Khanna of B. Com(Hons) (CS) stood second and Tanisha Vijay of B. Com(Hons) (CS) stood third.

In a nutshell, the workshop was a very enlightening and informative for the students. They were able to learn how to apply their theoretical knowledge practically.

In the end, queries of participants were answered by the Experts. The Webinar ended with a Vote of Thanks by Dr Mahima Rai.









National Conference on

"Contemporary in Trends and Challenges in Global Business Managment"

The Department of Commerce organised a 2 day National Conference on Contemporary Trends and Challenges in Global Business Management on 27-28 September 2019. The Chief Guest invited for the event was Dr. SubhashGarg, Minister for Technical Education, Rajasthan. The conference witnessed 187 participants spanning 4 technical sessions and myriad perspectives, discussing issues, exchanging ideas and views towards the advancement of theory and practices in the field of Commerce and Management.

It was the immense prestige and pride for IIS (deemed to be University), Jaipur to organise and conduct **The National Conference on Contemporary Trends and Challenges in Global Business Management** on 27th and 28th September 2019. The conference was based on changing global landscapes in Business and Management. While delivering the welcome note **Dr. Ashok Gupta**, Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, highlighted that due to changes in business environment at global level, it is



mandatory for corporate sector to understand the changes and their implications on business. Dean, **Prof. M.K. Sharma** elaborated on the objectives of the conference. Chief Guest **Dr. Subhash Garg**, Minister of Technical Education, Rajasthan addressed the august gathering and talked about digitalization and innovation in business. He took examples of Uber, Alibaba, etc. to explain the importance of innovation and its diffusion. He also highlighted the strengths lying in Indian economy in contrast to Western world. He urged students, research scholars and others to come up with innovative ideas and entrepreneurial skills. He also discussed about various start-ups.

The first technical session for the day was dedicated to **Trends in General Management**.

Prof. Harsh Purohit, Dean & Director, FMS Wisdom Banasthali Vidyapeeth, focused on ddeveloping frameworks rooted in Indian Culture for tackling challenges in the dynamic business environment. He said that it is the high time when we should give back solutions to problems through modifying the western specific concepts in backdrop of Indian culture by following indigenous approach. Moreover, he discussed topics from Indian ethos and highlighted a few less discussed approaches from Indian culture and tradition like 'Bhartiya Model of Financial Literacy', 'Saatvikta', Bhagwad Gita, etc.

Mr. Diptamoy Goswami, Chief Mentor, Alchemy Grooming, drew attention to Business Ethics and Corporate Social Responsibility. He differentiated between the traditional method and responsible method for CSR. He also took various examples from industry and talked about Doing Responsible things through Creativity.

The session was chaired by **Prof. P.K. Jain**, Director, Geetanjali Institute of Technical Studies, Udaipur. He exchanged his wisdom on topics like Crises of credibility, problems faced by youth, etc. Papers related to CSR, Corporate Governance, Waste Management, Sustainability, etc. were presented in the session. Deliberate discussions on recent developments and challenges faced by businesses at global level took place in the session.

The second technical session "Trends in financial management" was chaired by Prof. N. D Mathur, Director, School of Humanities & Social Sciences, Faculty of Arts & Law, Manipal University, Jaipur. The session had two keynote speakers Prof Navita Nathani, Prestige University, Gwalior and Mr. Mohit Sahney, Managing director and CEO, Finavo Capital. The session coordinator was Dr. Princy Thomas.

Prof. N. D Mathur enlightened the gathering by pointing at the central theme of the session by concentrating on the main facets prevailing in the current economy. Prof. Mathur brought out the difference between the concept of *State Central economy* and *Market central economy*. Sir, further acquainted the fact that growth is important however, it should be accompanied with the right support of regulatory authority.



Prof. Nathani then took forward the session by supporting the thoughts shared by the chairperson. Prof. Nathani presented her case on Behavioral finance through her empirical research on the topic *Importance of Heuristic on Investors behavior*. She further discussed about inculcating psychological concepts into the finance discipline.

On upon agreeing the same, Mr. Mohit sahney added the importance of finance in entrepreneurship and how one should trust his instinct while investing. Mr. Sahney also acquainted the gathering with the ideate of *idea centric business* and *efficiency centric business* and its utilization in order to attract the consumers.

A total of 12 presentations were read in this session. The session was ended with general discussion between the speakers and the audience.

The third technical session "Trends in Marketing Management" was chaired by Prof. Naveen Mathur, Vice Chancellor, Jagannath Institute of Management, Jaipur. The session had two key note speakers Ms. Meeta Mathur, Soft skill trainer and business consultant, Jaipur and Mr. Ashish Biyani, Co founder and partner, Activant Solutions, Jaipur and the session was coordinated by Dr. Sarabjeet Kaur Gogia.

Prof Naveen Mathur spoke about the digital aspect of marketing and its importance in the current market situation . The changing view of the buyer and inclination towards on line shopping. Sir further said that digital shopping lacks in human touch and also is a reason of fall in demand at retail stores.

Ms. Meeta Mathur enlightened the audience on challenges faced by the retail industry ,and the concept of retail apocalypse , she also enumerated that it was a delayed effect of recession of 2007-08. She further said that change in consumer behavior , consistent innovation and hyper personalization of product are a few major reasons for crisis in retail sector. She also discussed about the on line shopping giant- Amazon.

Taking further the same idea of digital marketing Mr. Ashish Biyani discussed on optimization and importance and existence of around 1.5 billion domains. He also talked about changes in advertisement styles over past 15 years and need to imbibe digital marketing in our course curriculum .

Total 29 papers were presented in this session by the participants.

The fourth technical session for the day was dedicated to Trends in Human Resource

Management.

The session was chaired by Prof. Anil Mehta, Former Head, Department of Business Administration, University of Rajsthan, Jaipur. Prof. Mehta shared his valuable views

and ideas pertaining to the contemporary issues related to Human Resource Management. He apprised the participants about the importance of Human Resource



Development and the Attrition rate in the industries coupled with the current economic

scenario.

Prof. Jyotsna Diwan Mehta, Director, Subodh Institute of Management and Career Studies, Jaipur. Prof. Diwan delivered her lecture on "Leveraging Employee Potential

through Diversity Management". She emphasised that in the global business scenario, it

is imperative for the business organizations to take measures to manage the diversity in

order to harness and leverage the potential of employees for competitive advantage. The second speaker of the organization was Ms. Alka Batra, Former Chair Person, FICCI & Managing Director, Aegis Consultancy Services, Jaipur. She expressed her

views on "HR, the unofficial physiologist, event planner, peacemaker, lawyer & teacher.

She shared her journey from scratch to becoming a successful entrepreneur. She emphasised that for effective implementation of Artificial Intelligence human touch/involvement is necessary. She focused on the concepts of skilling, re skilling and up skilling. She appreciated the enthusiasm and creativity in young generation and suggested that they should follow this philosophy that JOB IS NOT JUST FOR EARNING, BUT THIS IS A WAY OF LIFE.

Her lecture was followed by the oral presentations by the participants. A total of 16 presentations were made in this session. The research papers presented in this session

covered the following areas-

- Flexible working hours in the organizations
- Work life balance
- Training & Development
- Employee Engagement Services
- Green Human Resource Practices
- HRIS

to name a few

At the end of the session Prof. Anil Mehta shared his feedback and summed up the proceedings of the session.

The workshop was commenced on October 10th 2019. On the first day, Ms. Manchanda discussed about how to enhance aptitude and reasoning skills. She discussed various forms of vocabulary including the meaning, origin, pronunciation and usages of words, their synonyms and antonyms, as well as uses of idioms and phrases.

Day2 Techniques for Group Discussions and Mock Group Discussions

On October 11th 2019, the resource person discussed the techniques of participation in Group Discussions, Do's & Don'ts in Group Discussions, and conducted Mock Group Discussions for the students. There were about six Group Discussions held in the session. Each group consisted of 8-10 members. The topics of the discussion were related with current scenario. All the students actively participated in the mock Group discussions. At the end of each discussion, the resource person gave personal feedback to the students.

Day3 Tips for Personal Interview and Mock Personal Interviews



On the third day of the Workshop i.e. October 12th 2019, the resource person addressed the students about the tips for how to face Personal Interviews effectively. Mock interviews were conducted for all the participant students. During the mock interview, questions were asked from students like - introduce yourself, tell about your hobbies, strengths, weaknesses, career objective, and some specific questions regarding their discipline. This gave an opportunity to the students to interact with the Resource person and her team for personal counselling. Feedback was also provided to each student on their performance.

Outcome: The workshop was successful in promoting the employability and aptitude skills among students. The sessions were very interactive with the students. It helped the students in promoting knowledge of reasoning, vocabulary and grammar. The workshop gave an insight on the use of communication skills, leadership skills, effective listening, outer box thinking, self-efficacy, Interview skills, and use of data and information during Group Discussions.

Professional Makeup Workshop

The workshop was on power dressing and professional make up organized by the Training and Placement cell of The IIS University was conducted by Pooja Khandelwal, make-up artist and currently an IISU student.

Day 1 workshop was concluded by Mr. Anmol Singh who conducted a mock aptitude test for the students to know their command on the aptitude subjects.

Day 2 Mock group discussion was conducted. It was evaluated by Advocate Abhinav Bharadwaj and Ms. Akanksha. Students were divided in group of 4. GD topics included- Abrogation of Section 370, views on live in relationship, do short cloths leads to rape and reservation. Evaluators gave their inputs at end of each GD to every student on how better they can present their views.

Day 3 Mock Personal Interview was conducted by Ms. Akanksha. This conversational exercise resembled a real interview which helped students to understand what is expected in a real job interview and helped them to improve their self-presentation.

Our students got the golden opportunity to intermingle with them, ask questions and video interview them behind the scene and report their sessions as well, Anisha Singh covered a story on Mr. Tharoor's session and that even got published in DainikBhaskar. She even covered the Ravish Kumar story in Hindi. Sapna got to have a video interview of Mrs. Marya Shakil, Mrs. Deepal Trivedi (Editor, Ahmedabad Mirror) and Ms. Nistula Hebbar (editor- Politics in National Bureau of The Hindu), and Ms. Prerna Sahini (city editor- Dainik Bhaskar). They even learnt how news room works at different Hierarchy and what perception to have in mind while writing a new beat, how to do the field work, what and how a reporter does; from classroom to newsroom how the transition takes place.

The aspiring journalists in making from the university got recognized for their work and was rewarded in form of bylines of various stories for the same. Anisha got to cover 5 Hindi stories and begged the Best Reporter of the newsroom. Shruti Bohra got 4 Hindi stories and 1 English story. Sapna got bylines for 4 English stories and credits for 5 pictures and 3 videos. They learnt various tips from many sessions and seemed to have an amazing and a very memorable experience.



Resume and Statement of Purpose

A two-hour workshop was held on 14th October, 19 in The IIS University, Jaipur which was open for all the students of the university. The workshop focused on building a student's resume and the Statement of Purpose. The workshop started around 1 pm with the felicitation of the guest speaker who was Mrs. Vidya Suresh, the country manager, ESIGELEC India office.

In the first half, Mrs. Vidya Suresh emphasized on the significance of resume. She elaborated some of the characteristics of a good resume. She also explained the format of a CV which has to be in the reverse chronological order. She highlighted some of the main points which has to be included in the person's CV and those were: Personal contact details, Professional experience, Educational qualification, language skills, computer skills, Personal interests, References. She also emphasized on the importance of using some of the action words that can make a resume more attractive. In the educational column of the resume-Specializations, ranks, honors, awards, publications etc. are to be included to get an overall review of the person's performance.

Other things like attending a workshop, learning a new language could also be included. She also mentioned things that don't work in a CV which include spelling errors, lack of personal details, poorly presented photograph, fancy formatting etc. The second half was all about how to write a Statement of Purpose. The student has to understand that it is not a literary exercise. The answer to the following questions has to be there in the SOP: -

- What do I wish to accomplish?
- How did I arrive to this choice?
- How will this impact my future career plans?
- What style am I going to adopt?
- Who's my audience?

She also suggested checking the SOP, editing it, rewriting it and asking a family member or a friend to read the document to provide suggestions. The things that are to be taken into consideration when writing an SOP is, to avoid lies, plagiarism, flattery, childish sentences.

The workshop was wrapped up around 3 pm. The efforts of Mrs. Vidya Suresh ji were appreciated and encouraged by the staff as well as the attendees. There were a lot of questions put up by the audience which impressed the guest speaker. She showed her willingness for such workshops more in the in the coming future which is certainly motivating and encouraging both for the students as well as the faculty.

Industrial Visit to Zee Studio

An Industrial Visit to **ZEE STUDIO**, Sitapura, Jaipur was organized by the Training and Placement Cell and Department of Advertising and Brand Management. Dr. Shivi Saxena and Dr. Shubha Meghwanshi facilitated the visit for students.



The studio stands as one of its own kind, spread over 4 acres of land, with 4 studios in the premises. During the visit, the students were acquainted with the Pre and Post recording sections viz. Screening, Recording, Editing Sound and Screening. Mr. Devanshu Khatri, Centre Head, ZIMA & ZICA Jaipur Rajasthan briefed the students about ZEE Studio. He introduced ZEE's journey through a presentation. Zee started its journey from Adampur. It has 96 years of legacy. Mr Subash Chandra is Chairman at ZEE. ZEE is currently having more than 70 channels around the world. He enlightened all the students about the various zee group such as Z-Learn, Z-media, Z-news, dishty, ZEE Gold, Essel world and play win. He also briefed students about the ZEE institute "ZIMA" & "ZICA" for learning short and long term courses for students to enhance their skills.

Mr. Devanshu also informed the students about the job opportunities for the students in the field of media and television. He inducted students about the programmes offered by Zee for career enhancement. The visit ended with a detailed question-answer round put forward by the students.

Session on Incubation Centre

A session was held on 20.08.19 in the meeting room of IISU campus on 'Handholding Budding Student Entrepreneurs by establishing Incubation Center'.

And was attended by the HD of all professional courses of IIS deemed to be University.

The session covered the necessity of Incubation center on campus and the requirements for the same. The speaker started the session, elaborating the necessity of incubation center. He apprised the audience about the Government funding policy for campus incubation center. He also told that Government focuses on entrepreneurship to create more businesses.

The role of the Incubation Center was explained, which basically motivates the students for idea generation. It helps students from idea generation to up scaling business.

The speaker informed that, there are five stages of setting up the cell -

- 1. Idea generation Placing an idea drop box in the campus can be a good source for collecting ideas from the students. This provides a good thrust area for incubation center.
- 2. Infrastructure for establishing the center
- 3. Concept of businesses Registration of the start ups from campus. IPR cell to help for the same.
- 4. Funding university should also provide seed funding to the start-up companies, which can be from 1 lac to 10 lacs.
- 5. Mentoring A mentor to be appointed, who shall have experience in the same area. Faculty members can be real mentors.



The student start-ups shall be linked with local start-up incubation groups. Coworking spaces shall also be provided to multiple start-ups. The University is required to have incubatees, when planning to establish the incubation center. The companies which may be established in such start-up can be digital marketing, event management, CA firm, IP firm, photography etc.



Cultural Extravaganza

There is a plethora of extra-curricular activities on campus which give an opportunity to the students to hone their creative skills and further enrich themselves. Participation in these activities develops team spirit and raises their level of self confidence in interacting with fellow students and peers.

ANNUAL PLAY -"Ek Bhoot Ki Atmakatha"

The students of the IISU Theatrical Society staged their Annual Play 2019 titled "Ek Bhoot Ki Atmakatha" on 23rd September, 2019. The play was a culmination of a 30 day workshop that taught the participants various styles of theatre, disciplines and etiquettes of working on stage.

The Chief Guest of the play was, the renowned theatre and film artist,

Ms. Ratna Pathak Shah. She not only acknowledged the teams' efforts into creating the play but also provided useful insights about what the focus points while performing should be.



The entirety of the play was a result of a lot of time put in and had its own moments. After all, Rome wasn't built in day.

Process and milestones of the workshop:

The journey of 30 days was a splendid one. Each step, leading the students to become better actors and moreover, better people with strong personas.

The workshop began with the basic step of familiarization. Introducing themselves, the students' ideas and reasons to join theatre acted as a small window to knowing the team. They got to know the director, Mr. Siva Prasad Tumu and understood his expectations from the play, the team and his work ethics.

The very next step and one of the most important one was that of interpretation. It involved looking at the play beyond literal levels of understanding. Participants pondered upon the message these stories are trying to convey and how they link them to the real world. Through this, they got an outlook upon how the participants were not there as blank slates but came with their own set of thoughts which needed to be spoken out.

Portrayal through improvisations was a very intriguing step of the process. It not only showed how creative the participants were but also brought out their opinions in a structured manner. Each group gave different forms of the same story in different styles like mime, musical or dance drama or through plain narratives but with intricate formats.

Through these improvisations, the director moved on to character blocking. This was done through linking the participants' personalities with the characters' needs. Each person brought their own eccentrics and ideography as a contribution to the characters' development.

Once the blocking was complete, the plot as a whole was formed. The loop holes were understood and covered and each story was worked upon numerous times with several different styles. In this, our acting trainers, Mr. Jagannath Seth and Mr. Mahesh Godeshwar, played a significant role.

The participants were introduced to Chaau dance and Pina Bausch's style of theatrics. Mr. Seth made them understand the importance of inculcating the habit of feeling the rhythm of the music and the essence of the story and bringing it out in our movements. Mr. Godeshwar essentially worked on building an aura and leaving your presence on stage long after you've exited. Speech should not be limited only to words and dialogues but should create a link between the actor and the audience was his training motto.

The first run through was an impactful moment and nothing less than a milestone in this workshop. The students understood what the play was trying to tell us, how



strong its message is and how much more we need to contribute to it. It was one of the most emotionally moving aspect of this workshop.

Further to this came the stages of property development, set development, lighting and music settings and most importantly the art of projection techniques. The participants actively worked through the nitty-gritties of the play. Among other things was understanding how to use the stage space and exploring all possibilities of the set that was so vigorously made.

One thing that this workshop taught everybody all is that 'Theatre' is not just being on stage and delivering dialogues. It's about understanding others and more importantly, ourselves. From getting rid of inhibitions, stage fears and mental blocks to knowing that no matter how quirky you might be, theatre accepts you for who you are.

It taught us that no role is big or small. We're all working as a cohesive unit which might break and fall if one of us is lax.


After the rally school students with the help of NSS volunteers pasted posters on the walls of the school. The rally was successfully done in the community.

Swachta Campaign at IIS University Campus

A campus cleaning programme was organized by NSS volunteers in the university campus with active participation of NSS volunteers dated 5th AUGUST 2019 Monday. The cleanliness tasks were divided amongst the sub groups. Volunteers were divided into groups and were allotted with classrooms, laboratories, library etc. where the NSS volunteers interacted with the students briefing them about the importance of cleanliness in classrooms. Volunteers picked wrappers and foils and bits of paper lying in classrooms and threw it in dustbin and helped arranging chairs. The main purpose of this program was to create awareness among the students regarding cleanliness and its benefits and not to use plastic bags or any form of plastic. To save electricity and to take a step forward in this campaign by cleaning their classrooms. Efforts were done by the volunteers to create awareness not just among the students but also the staff members. Volunteers even interacted with teachers and briefed them about the consequences of littering and the benefits of keeping our campus clean. Volunteers even briefed about the arrival of diseases



due to unhealthy environment and also stressed on Hygienic environment as it aids in better learning. "Cleanliness is next to godliness"- with this mindset volunteers took the initiative to clean the university labs. So the volunteers visited geography lab, food science lab, textiles lab, chemistry lab, physics lab ,and psychology lab .Activities ranged from cleaning the slabs and boards of the different labs which were covered in dust, volunteers even urged the students as well as faculty members to reduce their usage of electrical appliances ,students were even briefed about the proper disposal of test tubes and even the importance of using clean and sterilized instruments to prevent the dangerous spread of germs. Our teacher coordinator motivated students towards 'Clean India' by his inspirational talk. The volunteers started cleaning the entire campus and collected all the litter for disposal. Some of the students were found using plastic bottles and straws so volunteers urged them and made them aware about the consequences of using plastic and also suggested them the alternatives of plastic .while investigating the campus the students found a pile of plastic glasses, straws and bottles around the canteen area so they requested the Janitors to clean it. The enthusiastic NSS volunteers devoted their time and energy to spread the message of cleanliness across the campus at multiple canteens and rest rooms. They visited the 'Planet J' canteen and picked up littered trash and used paper plates. They also stopped by the 'Amul' canteen and spread awareness about the importance of cleanliness and being plastic free. The volunteers even closely inspected the cleanliness of the rest rooms and volunteered to close leaking taps and even picked up some scattered trash. The project does not end here volunteers took an initiative to continue this project even outside the campus and be a helping hand towards the conservation of environment .The volunteers were instructed to clean their hands with soap at the end.

Problem Identification

Members of Jal Shakti team visited the Hasampura village on 2nd Sept 2019 to have an idea about the existing water conservation activities undertaken by the villagers, water related problem which they are facing and to formulate strategies to deal with those problems. One day before the visit Sarpanch was informed and he was requested to inform the villagers about the Jal Shakti team visit. Villagers were asked to gather at a common place and the activity started with a discussion on present status of water in the village. During the discussion the problems identified related to water are: There is an acute problem of water in the village and there is no alternate resource except Nevta bandh. The villagers did not just face problems with respect to irrigation for agriculture but also experienced difficulties in arranging water for day to day activities. The water level in the village had depleted alarmingly over the years.





Villagers were found aware about the water scarcity in their village and they are facing it too but surprisingly not doing anything for water conservation. Male complained that women at home waste water a lot but women did not agreed to their statement. Although they are informed about water scarcity in Rajasthan through different media sources but not taking any step to resolve this problem due to lack of self-realization. Only two-three households were found to have installed



the system of water harvesting. No further step was taken to renovate the traditional water bodies like wells, ponds etc.

Constitution of "Gram Jal Shakti Team" in Hasampura

A Gram Jal Shakti team of total seven members were constituted in Hasampura village on 2nd Sept 2019. Two women and three women from the village and two faculty members of IIS (deemed to be university, Jaipur), Dr.AlkaKatiyar and Ms. ArchanaKumari were included in the team. Approval of the village Sarpanch was taken for the Gram Jal Shakti Team.



Expert Talk on Water Conservation

On 4th Sept 2019 an expert talk was organized in Hasampura village. The expert was Dr.AlkaKatiyar, Assistant professor in the Department of Environment Science. She began her talk with importance of water and scarcity of it especially in Rajasthan. She said that water conservation should begin from home itself and teaching the future generation about the value of every drop of water should be practiced in each household. She suggested few measures for saving water and appealed especially to women present there to practice those strategies at their home. She talked about the depletion of groundwater level in the village and suggested the villagers to save rain water through the technique of rainwater harvesting. She also suggested few techniques to farmers for using and storing rainwater efficiently for irrigation in their farms. Tree plantation on a huge scale was also suggested by the expert.





Poster making on Efficiency in utilization of water

A poster making competition was organized in government school of Hasampura on 6th Sept 2019. The purpose to organize this competition was to make children aware about the ways they can adopt in their day-to-day life for saving water by using it efficiently. Before making the poster children were explained by the students of IIS (deemed to be University), Jaipur about how and when they generally waste water in their daily activities and how they can save water. It was very surprising to see that many students showed the ways of water being wasted in their surroundings through pictures or writing on paper.







On 9th Sept 2019 poster making competition on the same theme was organized in the IIS (deemed to be University), Jaipur campus. 46 students participated in this activity and prepared meaningful posters and pasted in every classroom.

Oath taking on water conservation

Students, teachers as well as non-teaching staff members of government school of Hasampura took a pledge to conserve water. The aim of this activity was to educate children on the importance of water and the need to plant saplings. Emphasizing on the significance of water conservation, the faculty of IIS (deemed to be University), Jaipur and Principal of the school asserted that it was the need of the hour. The teachers advised the students to stop wasting water and motivate their family members, friends and other acquaintances to save it.





Slogan writing on "Ban use of Plastic"

The activity of Slogan writing on ban on single use plastic was organized in government school of Hasampura on 11th Sept 2019. To make the campus free from plastic it is very important to make the students aware about the harm to the environment caused by using plastic and encourage them to take initiatives in making their campus plastic free. Slogans on ban of single use plastic were written and displayed in each and every classroom by the students.

On 12th Sept 2019 slogan writting competition on the same theme was organized in the IIS (deemed to be University), Jaipur campus.





Distribution of bags for collection of plastics from households

During the visit it was found that plastic has created havoc in Hasampura as there is no facility of common dumping area. The whole village is littered with plastics. Faculties and students of IIS (deemed to be University), Jaipur tried to convince villagers for not throwing garbage in open areas but in the absence of garbage dumping area it cannot be possible. So as alternative villagers were given big plastic bags and were asked to dump their plastic waste in that bag so that the van from the university will come and collect the garbage once in a fortnight.





Skit on Ban of single use plastic

Cattles roam the streets littered with garbage looking for food. As cows pick through piles of garbage, hunting for leftovers, they also consume plastic. Unsurprisingly, the biggest plastic pollutant digested by cows is plastic bags. The bits of plastic consumed build up in their internal organs, which make it difficult for cows to eat. As a result, milk production drops as does milk quality. Over time, the plastic consumption "sentences cattle to a slow and cruel death.

To sensitize the students towards this issue a skit was prepared and performed by students of government school under the guidance of students of IIS (deemed to be University), Jaipur in the school campus on 14th September 2019.







Documentary Screening on Ban of Single Use Plastic

Plastic bags are everywhere in our environment. In our modern lives, they have become a part of us. However, the convenience of these plastic bags come at a very high cost to the environment and negatively affects human health. To raise awareness on the same, a documentary screening was organised for the students of D6-D10 of NSS on the topic of "Ban on the use of single use plastic". Three documentaries were screened for the students namely 'A plastic wave', 'India could ban 6 single-use plastic products from Oct 2' and 'What really happens to the plastic you throw away'. It was an eye opener for the students as most of them were not aware about the complexity of the situation.





Documentary screening on Mahatma: A great soul of 20th Century

The volunteers of group A, B, C, D, E (6-10) attended the screening of the documentary on Mahatma – a great soul of 20th century for their NSS activity. The activity was held at the AV hall at 9:30 am. A short documentary was being played in which all the struggles faced and witnessed by our freedom fighter Mahatma Gandhi – 'The Father of the Nation' were shown.

All the movements which took place for the independence of our country and the particular cause behind all these movements were also informatively displayed. All the rights, policies which were removed and implemented by the Britishers were also discussed.

All the students found the documentary very informative and interesting. They all came to visualise the lives of their freedom fighters more closely and got to know more about the history and importance of which played the vital role in the independence of our country.



Literacy Project in Dadabari School

The NSS volunteers went to Dadabari school for the literacy project. There were forty volunteers who took up the task to impart knowledge among the students by using innovative ideas related to education. The students made posters with the volunteers. They expressed their concern about the importance of cleanliness through art. This activity aimed at inculcating knowledge among the students so that they can become channels of spreading civic sense in general. It was a true learning experience for the volunteers as well as the students.

Interactive Session: Rajasthan Police on Self Defense (Nirbhaya Squad)

Guest Lecture on Women's health and Check- up

A guest lecture was organised by NSS on 13th January, 2020 on the topic of 'women's health' together with medical check up for student as well as faculty of IIS (deemed to be University). NSS volunteers of group A1 to A10 participated in the same

The guest speakers for the day were Dt. Manila Bhargava and Divya Gupta from B. Lal Path labs. Dr. Divya Gupta started with a brief introduction about the cervical cancer and how it affects the Indian women. She discussed the potential symptoms of cervical cancer and the basic diagnosis involved, including details about pap smearing. She further discussed about the available treatment options and the vaccines, i.e, gardasil and cervarix. The age-wise dosage and the need for routine medical check-up was also emphasised upon.



Later, Dt. Manila Bhargava spoke about the importance of a balanced diet and the ill effects of lack of nutrition in one's diet and the requirement of having atleast 3 full meals in a day.

The importance of having an adequate quantity of water and diet enriched with vitamins and minerals were also discussed. Towards the end, she spoke about the main constituents of a balanced diet like cereals, protein, carbs, oil, ghee, milk, fruits, vegetables etc. and debunked myths related to healthy diets which include fasting for a long stretch, strict fruit diet to name a few. The program ended with the presenting of the momentos to the guests followed by a health check up camp in the infirmary.





Women Empowerment through Self Defence Skill Camp

The NSS unit of IIS (deemed to be University) has organized a seven days camp for Women empowerment through self defence in collaboration with Women cell of Jaipur Police for NSS volunteers of the university. The objective of this camp was to empower the girls by imparting them with self defence martial art skills. Self defence martial art skills training is specifically choosen to empower the girls so that they can protect themselves from mis-happenings taking place with girls in society now a days.

During the camp two women police officers have trained the girls. In order to empower the NSS volunteers of university with skill of martial art to be used against wrong doers, they taught various techniques practically to the girls. They also presented various situation in front of girls like front rolling, back rolling, when someone push from back or front, etc. and taught them how to tackle in such adverse situation.

The seven day camp ended on 25th January 2020 in presence of DCP and IPS Preeti Jain, Additional DCP SunitaMeena and Inspector MamtaShardul along with rector and faculties of university. In the valedictory session, DCP and IPS Preeti Jain addressed the gathering and quoted that martial art skills are insurance which will help girls to save in situation of difficulties. She focused on the fact that a girl should try to save herself on her own for first by making use of self defence techniques and then only look for legal help. Additional DCP SunitaMeena also addressed the girls and given them a message of not to be afraid of anyone. During valedictory session, NSS volunteers have demonstrated different tricks learned during the camp in front of dignitaries. All the volunteers trained in camp seemed to be full of strength and confidence after the camp.

Yoga session and Orientation for Nukkad Natak:

The first day of the NSS camp started with the yoga session. The early morning yoga session helped the students to collect their energy and get prepared for the entire day camp. The students participated in the session with keen interested. After the yoga session the Mr Mohammad Ali oriented the students about the intricacies of Preparing the Nukkad Natak. The mentors gave an insight into the basic principles and guidelines to be taken care off while making an impactful creative Nukkad Natak. The students were further divided into small groups which then brainstormed the ideas of the Nukkan to be showcased at the end of the camp.



Projects in Schools and Umang:

33 Students of special NSS camp **of Group A** participated and visited Dadabari Government school. There they all covered different subjects using creative methods of teaching from class 1st to 5th.Sudents of class 1st and 2nd were taught rhymes using hands ,class 3rd and 4th were taught addition and subtraction using number line and also prepared for their maths exam and 5th class students were revised hindi chapters for exams. Similarly the 35 students **of Group B** went to Badmohanpura school with the project on environment. NSS.. On day I students diliver a introductory session about environment pollution and their causes. In a week they are planning to arrange a documentary session , tree plantation and nukkad natak. Students of the school were excited for the whole week. 32 Volunteers of **Group C** went to Kalyanpura School with the project on stress management during examination. During the discussion, first they traced out the examination pattern followed in school. Thereafter they tried and find out students view point regarding stress before and during the examination. Volunteers have observed that there was a mixed response of students regarding stress but majority



was found agreeing that they remain in stress during exam.12 volunteers of NSS Group D took the project cleanliness and hygiene and went to haziawala school . The project for students of Group E was on Learning Physiotherapy named "Finer and Motor Skills" for helping disabled children and learning how special children learn through these activities in special school. 26 NSS volunteers of Group-E visited the special school 'Umang' located in Kshipra Path, Mansarovar, Jaipur. To begin with the Chairperson of Umang Dr Deepak Kalra briefed them about the organisation Umang. Students have gone for a visit to the school; their classrooms and training rooms and also to the physiotherapy area. The volunteers worked into two groups; and gave them hands on learning assignment of physiotherapy named "Finer and Motor skills". In this assignment NSS volunteers will get a chance to interact with the students; and also will learn about the physiotherapy school gives to disabled students.



Interaction with Principals of Government schools on Issues and ChallangesinGovt Schools

Dr.SumanVisth, Principle, Haziawala School, Jaipur and Dr.Jogender Singh Bugalia, HM, Hazialwala School, Jaipur were welcomed with a token of gratitude. Dr.Suman commenced the lecture with telling the students how NSS Volunteers have helped the schools and students to grow high with not only education but also their rights, which the volunteers of NSS have made them aware with the help of nukkad nataks and functions. Mr. Jogender shared the problems that they are facing in educating these children. Sir talked about how the children who come to the schools struggle to come to school but are very excited to learn. The session concluded with the experiences of NSS volunteers with the children of these schools.





Guest Lecture on hoe to make posters

Dr.ShwetGoyal, Associate Professor IIS (Deemed to be University) gave a knowledgeable and fulfilled lecture in NSS Special camp. The main aim of the session was to acquaint the students with the role poster's have played in human life since centuries. The speaker enlightened the students about the inclusion of posters in communication design and how they connect masses with one idea, by one caption or slogan. It was a mesmerizing lecture and the girls were glued to their seats listening to the lecture with all attention. Sir talked about different slogans used in posters to aware the citizens for various ideas like;"Youthchala polling booth", "Hum do, humaare do","Chordosaarekaamkaaj, vote karnechaloaaj" and many beautiful slogans. The session was very knowledgeable and informative.



Day 3: 28th Jan 2020

Yoga Session: The second day of the NSS camp started with the yoga session. The session helps to warm up the body. Few small aasana are practiced in this session. Students are quite enthusiastic for the same.





Nukkad Natak: After the yoga session the Mr Mohammad Ali started teaching few skills of nukkadnatak. Students are divided in team and different themes are selected by them. Students started practicing their respective group theme.

Projects in School: Students of special NSS camp of Group A As a part of the project theme 'Creative Learning', volunteers went to Dadabari school to help them with their studies. The volunteers as per the activity plan took pulses and gram to enhance motor skills of the students and teach them tables using the same. The NSS volunteers divided themselves into groups and each group went to various classes for interacting with the students and teaching them through innovative ways. For all those students who find mathematics difficult to learn, it was truly a fun activity and since they have their exams going on ,it was really a productive exercise for them .The volunteers used certain games to teach students that could help them remember various kinds of nouns. As a part of the literacy project, volunteers assisted the students to revise their curriculum. Similarly the students of Group B went to Badmohanpura school with the project on environment. They showcased a short movie on environment pollution, students love to see that. Film is based on a child who worked for environment conservation with limited resources. Volunteers of Group C went to Kalyanpura School with the project on stress management during examination. On day 2 ,nss volunteers shared strategy to cope with stress during exams .by means of chart they made the students understand how they can distress them by practicing very small things like time management, taking balanced diet, etc. Volunteers of NSS Group D took the project cleanliness Three activities were undertaken: Drains cleaning, Paper bag making Poster making competition The drains in Hajiyawala are open and filthy. So an effort was made to clean them and raise awareness about the same in the community. Drains were cleaned with the help of a sweeper, under the supervision of students. The school students were taught the method of preparing paper bags in order to discourage the use of plastic



bags. They prepared two bags individually. Poster making competition was organised on the theme of "Environmental hygiene". The winners were given chocolates as a token of appreciation for their work. Students enjoyed the activities. **Group E** was on Learning Physiotherapy named "Finer and Motor Skills" for helping disabled children and learning how special children learn through these activities in special school. volunteers of Group-E visited the special school 'Umang' located in Kshipra Path, Mansarovar, Jaipur. With their brief orientation the previous day, students moved on to understand and learn the various activities which they have to do with the special children in order to improve their finer and motor skills. There were 6 different activities involved which were related to development of sensation, perception, balance, etc., in special children. Thereafter, NSS volunteers were divided into groups of two and were monitoring the movement of every child in every activity. This was an enriching experience for all the NSS volunteers as they got to learn many complexities involved in such activities. They were thrilled to be a part of these activities developing 'finer and motor skills' in special children.







Rally on Assam: Students of NSS showcased the culture of Assam by the means of a rally in which students are dressed up in asmees attire along with different posters related to their culture, food, clothes, crops etc. The rally was full of excitement; even the other university students join them and followed their typical asmees steps.





Demonstartion on plantation: Dr.Aditi R Khandelwal, Sr. Assistant Professor IIS (Deemed to be University) Jaipur were welcomed. Her lecture was on Plant varieties available at market. She demonstrated how to put a plant both indoor and outdoor. She showcased different varieties of indoor plant, which are very user friendly. The main aim of the session was to get familier with assam culture by the means of poster making. The students learn poster making skills, how to make an expressive and acute posters.



Day 4: 29th Jan 2020

Yoga session: The day started with yoga session by Ms. JankiPareek. The NSS volunteers learnt and practiced various aasanas during the session. In the session , the instructor also tell them about various mantra like gayatri mantra , saraswati mantra and make the volunteers understood their importance in keeping one self fit. Towards the end of session, the instructor makes the volunteers practice meditation by spelling "OM".

Demonstration on Seed Ball Preparation: The second session of the day was taken by Mr. Nikhil of Podha NGO. The NGO Podha works for conservation of forest in the country. In the session Mr. Nikhil talked about his latest initative – "Seed Balls". Seed Balls are ball of mud and potters clay carrying seeds of trees. These ball when thrown in monsoon on soil leads to birth of a plant without any other efforts. Sir, explained the process of preparing the balls to the volunteers. He informed that such balls can be prepared for all kind of plants and trees. NSS volunteers also prepared the seed ball in his supervision during the session.

in preparing small skit on the topic environment conservation. Tomorrow these students will perform in front of other school students and teachers. Students of govt school participated with full enthusiasm and are looking very excited to perform tomorrow. 12 Volunteers of **Group C** went to Kalyanpura School with the project on stress management during examination. They have shown documentary to students to cope with situation of stress during examination. They also have made the charts related to theme and explained them to the students. The violent nature of the partition created an atmosphere of hostility and suspicion between India and Pakistan that plagues their relationship to the present.

GUEST LECTURE: SHRI NIRANJAN GOSWAMI



"We make the visible invisible and the invisible visible." This is how Padmashri Niranjan Goswami describes his art form: mime.

On the 9th of September, 2019, Shri Niranjan Goswami visited the IIS University as a guest lecturer and guided the students of the Theatrical Society about the foundation of mime in India and its origin. Shri Niranjan Goswami was born in 1949, Dhaka, Bangladesh. He trained in mime with Jogesh Dutta from 1966 to 1969 at the latter's institution Padaboli, and trained himself in theatre working with Sombhu Mitra at Bohurupee between 1970 and 1975. He established the Indian Mime Theatre in 1976. Shri Goswami has advanced the practice of mime as an independent genre in Indian theatre with his performances over the past two decades.

Among his significant productions are Sonarganyer Meye (1983), Dena Paona (1989), Srikanta (1990), Beej (1995), and Nagamandala (1997). Most of these are based on well-known literary works. To build up an audience for mime, Shri Goswami has been organizing festivals of mime theatre since the mid-1980s. He has also taught mime at several institutions, including the National School of Drama in Delhi, the Trissur School of Drama, and the Film and Television Institute of India, Pune. He has given lecture- demonstrations at the University of California at Los Angeles, U.S.A., and the Jawaharlal Nehru University in Delhi. Shri Goswami has been working with deaf children for several years, some of whom have won young Talent Scholarships of the Government of India. He has performed in the World Youth Festival (1989) in Pyongyang, North Korea, and the Shanghai International Art Festival (2002) in China, and has besides toured Europe, the former Soviet Union, and the United States as a cultural delegate.





Among other honours, he has received the All India Critics Association Award in 1998. He was awarded a Senior Research Fellowship by the Department of Culture, Government of India, in 2001.

Shri Niranjan Goswami received the Sangeet Natak Akademi Award for his excellence as an actor in mime. As part of the lecture, Sir illustrated the intricacies of mime. 

The students of the IISU Theatrical Society staged their Annual Play 2019 titled "Ek Bhoot Ki Atmakatha" on 23rd September, 2019. The play was a culmination of a 30 day workshop that taught the participants various styles of theatre, disciplines and etiquettes of working on stage.

The Chief Guest of the play was, the renowned theatre and film artist, Ms. Ratna Pathak Shah. She not only acknowledged the teams' efforts into creating the play but also provided useful insights about what the focus points while performing should be. The entirety of the play was a result of a lot of time put in and had its own moments. After all, Rome wasn't built in day.

Process and milestones of the workshop:

The journey of 30 days was a splendid one. Each step, leading the students to become better actors and moreover, better people with strong personas. The workshop began with the basic step of familiarization. Introducing themselves, the students' ideas and reasons to join theatre acted as a small window to knowing the team. They got to know the director, Mr. Siva Prasad Tumu and understood his expectations from the play, the team and his work ethics. The very next step and one of the most important one was that of interpretation. It involved looking at the play beyond literal levels of understanding. Participants pondered upon the message these stories are trying to convey and how they link them to the real world. Through this, they got an outlook upon how the participants were not there as blank slates but came with their own set of thoughts which needed to be spoken out. Portrayal through improvisations was a very intriguing step of the process. It not only showed how creative the participants were but also brought out their opinions in a structured manner. Each group gave different forms of the same story in different styles like mime, musical or dance drama or through plain narratives but with intricate formats. Through these improvisations, the director moved on to character blocking. This was done through linking the participants' personalities with the characters' needs. Each person brought their own eccentrics and ideography as a contribution to the characters' development. Once the blocking was complete, the plot as a whole was formed. The loop holes were understood and covered and each story was worked upon numerous times with several different styles. In this, our acting trainers, Mr. Jagannath Seth and Mr. Mahesh Godeshwar, played a significant role. The participants were introduced to Chaau dance and Pina Bausch's style of theatrics. Mr. Seth made them understand the importance of inculcating the habit of feeling the rhythm of the music and the essence of the story and bringing it out in our movements. Mr. Godeshwar essentially worked on building an aura and leaving your presence on stage long after you've exited. Speech should not be limited only to



words and dialogues but should create a link between the actor and the audience was his training motto. The first run through was an impactful moment and nothing less than a milestone in this workshop. The students understood what the play was trying to tell us, how strong its message is and how much more we need to contribute to it. It was one of the most emotionally moving aspect of this workshop. Further to this came the stages of property development, set development, lighting and music settings and most importantly the art of projection techniques. The participants actively worked through the nitty-gritties of the play. Among other things was understanding how to use the stage space and exploring all possibilities of the set that was so vigorously made.

One thing that this workshop taught everybody all is that 'Theatre' is not just being on stage and delivering dialogues. It's about understanding others and more importantly, ourselves. From getting rid of inhibitions, stage fears and mental blocks to knowing that no matter how quirky you might be, theatre accepts you for who you are. It taught us that no role is big or small. We're all working as a cohesive unit which might break and fall if one of us is lax. This is a place where we find solace among a whole team. A little bit of you can be found in everyone.



It was a great experience of being part of the **JAIRANGAM Master Classes 2019.** A very prestigious opportunity given by THE IIS UNIVERSITY to us, in which we had attended master classes conducted by the 5 masters of different arts and its relevance in theatre from 20th to 26th May, 2019.





On the 20th & 21th May the classes were conducted by Ranjit Kapoor Sir, who is a great theatre director and an alumna of NSD who has also taught at NSD. He taught us about a good script and the technique of writing a good play. He showed us a play directed by him in early 90's and a movie which is a satire on the Indian politics and politicians by which he taught about how can we convey our message in a creative and symbolic way in a creative manner.

On the 22nd May the class was conducted by Rajesh Singh Sir who is a theatre practitioner as well. He taught us about the origin of the theatre, covering whole history of theatre from the Greak theatre till the modern and contemporary theatre. He also touched upon theatre spaces, different forms of theatre from different places, exchange of cultures, and revolutions in the art form, and the Natya Shastra and its rules and importance.

The state of our mind changes with the change in the body posture. Quality of life refers to the light of a same time but in the different seasons and different atmospheres.

Industrial Visit - Dev Milk Foods Pvt. Ltd. Mahindra World City, Village Kalwar, Jaipur

Educational tours are essential for overall development of students. They provide valuable educational opportunities away from the classroom without using textbooks and other tools used in usual settings. Students on educational trips can often learn while having fun in a more informal environment.

An industrial visit was organized on 24th January, 2020 for 1st year Yuva members of the University. The aim of the visit was to provide practical exposure to the students where they could experience the operations of making various dairy and ice- cream products.

A batch of 50 students and two faculty coordinators (Dr. Anju Singh and Dr. Megha Arya) left the IISU campus at 10:05a.m and reached the arena of FruBon at 11:00 a.m. The management received the students and accompanying teachers with a warm welcome and guided them through the site. To begin with, the HR Manager and his team gave the students an introduction of company's history, profile and its present functioning in Dairy, Ice cream and Bakery products like milk, cheese, butter, Yoghurt, Buttermilk, Ice-Cream, Paneer, Cookies, and others. Some of the team members even shared their experiences with the company and asked the students their views about the FruBon products. They also ensured the students that in near future their products will match any good product in the market.

Next, the students were divided into two groups- one group to visit the ice cream production unit and the second group to visit the bakery section. Then, hygiene and safety precautions were taken and everyone was made to wear head-cap before entering the factory. Also, a set of strict safety rules were informed to the students.

In the white products division, the students were accompanied by Mr. Mohammed Shabid (Plant Manager-dairy section). The demonstration was initiated by informing about various sophisticated and advanced technology and machinery used for manufacturing in the factory. Next, the students were made aware of the process involved in procurement and pasteurizing of milk and were given demonstration of the making and packaging of various products. Then the students were also taken to the cold room with a temperature of 5°C, where various dairy products are stored.

In the ice cream section, the students were escorted by Mr. Rahul (Deputy Manager-Ice cream). Firstly, the students visited the laboratory where all kinds of physical,



biological and chemical testing are done. Next, it was followed by a visit to the raw materials storage segment. The aroma of the ice -creams filled their hearts with joy. Then the students were made aware about different stages of milk processing and the process involved in making ice

- cream and they enjoyed the fascinating site in making. Then the students visited the auto candy machine room where 6000 ice creams are produced in an hour. The students were fascinated even more when they were taken to the Blast Room with the temperature of -35°C.

The students were flabbergasted by the bursting of cold air on their faces.

The young Icgians were overwhelmed with joy and enthusiasm after they were offered complementary ice creams. This enthusiastic educational tour came to an end with a group photograph of the Yuva team and FruBon employees.





A Session on Stress Management

A session on "Stress Management" was organized on 27th January 2020 for Yuva members of the University. Yuva members participated in the session with great interest. The session aimed to guide the students on how to maintain a healthy lifestyle and to prepare to cope with the stress of everyday living. The session was addressed by Ms. Naintara S Agarwal. She is a psychologist and loves to work with special needs of children. 

- 4. To make efforts to sensitize the academic community regarding the problems associated with social exclusion as well as aspirations of the marginalized communities.
- 5. To provide them access to opportunities thorough guest-lectures and broaden their knowledge.
- 6. To introduce to them, social welfare schemes offered by the State Government for the betterment and promotion of these classes.

Women have been at greater disadvantage in this regard and hence a lot of established norms need to be questioned, the society needs to be sensitized towards gender to create equal opportunities for both men and women.

In this direction Ms. Chanda Asani, Lecturer, Women Studies organized a session on 3rd August,2019 in A.V. hall under to address students on the topic "Gender Sensitization. The session began with discussion on minor observations in regard to treatment of gender especially women in various spaces like homes, workplaces, media etc. The objective was look into the reasons for specified discriminatory practices against women and the reasons for it. After this interactive session, the students were shown a movie titled 'Ek naya Mayna' that was based upon myths associated with menstrual cycle and how with a little effort we can normalize a natural biological phenomenon. The movie merely with two characters; mother and daughter sent a strong effective message as to why periods have certain taboos and what used to be the logic behind it. A woman is not polluted during menstrual cycle, this is only a societal narrow-mindedness that has been fuelled by rigid structures of the society. Girls must have the entire information about this bodily phenomenon and must respect themselves. This movie was directed by a Radhika Sharma ,student of MJMC with UGC assistance. The participatory group included students from Journalism, Home Science and Financial Studies. The screening of movie was followed by a lot of experience sharing on the part of the students. It was an eye opener for the students. The movie covered biological, psychological, and sociological dimensions associated with menstrual cycle. There was a special emphasis on menstrual health too. Overall, the session could address a lot of less-talked issues surrounding menstruation in the society.





Breast Cancer Awareness

Breast Cancer is the most common female cancer worldwide. In India, it accounts for 25% to 32% of female cancers, where in every four minutes one woman is diagnosed with breast cancer and in every thirteen minutes one woman dies of it. Therefore, it makes it essential to have cancer literacy in women and for this, an initiative was taken by Women Cell





Women Empowerment and Health

'Progress has a plural connotation; it cannot be steered by a single person'. For any society to grow institutional approaches along with the involvement of community is equally essential as today's world is moving towards greater interdependence. Dr. Rashmi Saraswat ,a doctor by profession represented Mahavir International ,Jaipur and oriented the students about the functioning and initiatives taken by the NGO and the impact of the same. They have started various national projects like 'Vatsalya' and 'Amba' which are focusing on the health of women during pregnancy and empowering women respectively. These two are just two of the nine national projects the organisation has undertaken to help the community.

As we know that India has a bleak picture to present when it comes to maternal health specially in the case of rural women and hence Mahavir international under various initiatives distribute 'Poshan kit'which consists of pulses ,nuts ,jaggery ,ORS and glucose etc. Their approach is to provide pregnant women with a nutritional kit that has all the essentials which are affordable and highly beneficial to the health of the women and they also provide women with baby kits which are prepared by the local women who are paid for the number of kits they make and hence this initiative has led to financial independence for women. The session exposed students to the vital roles that can be played by the community in development and specially women who are otherwise socially excluded . The students got the idea of how skill development programmes and awareness regarding government initiatives could be helpful. The initiatives of the organisation like breast-feeding booths for women in various parts of Jaipur motivated students to come up with new ideas that can help women.



The session indeed had a lot in store for the students to understand how NGOs spearhead development. Students did put up questions at the end of the session. It was truly inspirational to know how students can contribute towards society.





Focussed Group Interview

Women's Cell, Centre for Women's Studies and Department of Sociology, IIS (deemed to be University) organized the field visit to GanwarBrahmana village in Sanganer Tehsil on 2nd March 2020. Dr. Pragya Sharma and Dr. Preeti Agrawat escorted the students. Focused group interview was conducted with women and young girls of the village. Women discussed about various problems which many times they can't be able to discuss when general interview is conducted. Women opened up with problems related to menstrual hygiene, pregnancy, other health issues and child rearing. They even discussed about the problems existing in village regarding their political participation, working in MNAREGA, drainage and sanitation system of village, unavailability of proper health facilities in village, dissatisfaction regarding the working of Sarpanch and transportation facilities. Students also interacted with the school and college going girls to know about the education opportunities and awareness regarding hygiene. Women were very interactive and responded properly. They shared their experiences. Students tried to make them aware about the women's rights, hygiene and various government policies.

IISU MUN

The Commission on the Status of Women (CSW or UNCSW) is a functional commission of the United Nations Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC), one of the main UN organs within the United Nations. CSW has been described as the UN organ promoting gender equality and the empowerment of women. Every year, representatives of Member States gather at United Nations Headquarters in New York to evaluate progress on gender equality, identify challenges, set global standards and formulate concrete policies to promote gender equality and advancement of women worldwide.

To commemorate the Women's Day, the students of IIS University enacted the working of the CSW as part of the Model United Nations activity conducted by Department of Political Science and Centre for Women Studies, Women's Cell. The Agenda was 'Social Protection System, Access to Public Services and Sustainable Infrastructure for Gender Equality and the Empowerment of Women and Girls'. The



purpose behind conducting this acivity was to acquaint the students as to how to do extensive research, public speaking, and teamwork on the issues related to women on the world level.

Up to this day, no country, developing or developed, has achieved complete gender equality. To advance efforts at an international level, the General Assembly established the United Nations Entity for Gender Equality and the Empowerment of Women (UN-Women) in July 2010 with the universal directive "to achieve gender equality, women's empowerment, and upholding women's rights."The work of UN-Women is guided by the principles laid down in the Convention on the Elimination of Discrimination against Women (CEDAW), the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action (BPfA), UN Security Council Resolution 1325 (2000) on "Women, Peace and Security," the Millennium Declaration, Millennium Development Goals, and other norms related to women's rights and gender equality. CEDAW and the BPfA are the cornerstones of the activity of UN-Women and provide the overall guiding principles for its work. Over the past 15 years, UN Member States have also gained greater awareness and understanding regarding the role women play in peace and security due in part to the adoption Security Council resolution 1325 (2000) on women, peace and security, and subsequent resolutions 1820 (2008), 1888 (2009), 1889 (2009), 1960 (2010), 2106 (2013), and 2122 (2013). These resolutions "represent a critical framework for improving the situation of women in conflict-affected countries," and ground efforts at the international, regional, national and local levels to protect and promote women's rights in conflict-affected situations. Supporting efforts to mainstream implementation of these global norms, as well as the principle of gender equality at the international, regional and national level is central to UNWomen's mandate and at the heart of the organization's mission. Achieving this mission is not a goal in itself but an important contribution to sustainable development as a whole.

The UNCSW committee of IISUMUN began with a brief introduction of the procedures and a short explanation to the Model United Nations. The Executive Board comprised of

A GSL is a description of their country's stance on the issues that are to be discussed in the committee. Preparing a GSL was mandatory for all delegates.

During the GSL varied controversial statements were made by the delegates. Some of the statements were-

India- "Women are provided with less opportunities in India"

Ukraine- "45% of women population suffers from sexual violence in Ukraine"

Oman-"Sharia law is followed to the protect the Islamic women"

Moderated caucus is a debate format that allows delegates to make comments on a specific sub-issue. Typically, the Chairs will call on delegates who raise their placards to speak one at a time.

All motions were passed with a proper voting session. The topics for the motion raised in the motion raised in the motion were a selected caucus with a selected caucus were a selected

- 1. Raised by Germany- Social protection of women and prevailing health issues in economically weaker countries.
- 2. Raised by Venezuela- Crimes against women with special emphasis to female vaginal mutilation.

There was 1 un-moderated caucus held in the committee, in which delegates were allowed to leave their seats to mingle and speak freely. The un-moderated caucus was used to sort countries into blocs, to form alliances, and to write working papers and draft resolutions. There were 3 resolutions which were floored in the committee by the delegates .The resolution was passed by 14 votes in the committee, after all discussions, debates and corrections.

Interactive Session on Social Work Intervention in Various Settings with special reference to Women's Welfare

Advancement of any general public or state is decided by the position held by women in that society. Gender equality must be recognized by every society in order to progress .Indian society has achieved a lot in this regard but a lot needs to be done to make things better for women who have been at disadvantage for centuries.

Professor Ankur Saxena, discussed about various aspects of Social work interventions related to women welfare. Women are as yet fail to change the position that makes them much powerless against misuse and less ready to spare themselves from separation and viciousness. He shared few of his field experiences with students, with this piece of information he stated "relating theory with practical", is necessary in the field of social work. He talked about how people are suffering from mental illness and the interventions to deal with mental crisis.



He ended the session with the necessity of studying social work is increasing in our day today life. The overall session was informative, and it ended with a question-answer round. Shipra Goyal, student of Master of Social Work delivered vote of thanks. The session helped the students to gain knowledge regarding social work interventions which will be helpful for them to make more people aware.

Social Equality: A Challenge for Women in Society

On the occasion of International Women's day 2020, Dr. Priyamvada Singh spoke on 'Equality for Women' as she has started a campaign called 'Each for Equality' which tries to cover the issues of women across generations. Dr. Priyamvada commenced the session by talking about her journey in the field of social service and what factors motivated her to work for people. She spoke about various challenges faced by women in the society irrespective of their backgrounds and how they put other before themselves.

She discussed importance of education for women and the need for the women to improve upon their levels of nutrition .The problems should be addressed from the very beginning as individuals are taught to discriminate themselves and others specially on the basis of gender and this results in a society that starts taking women for second class citizens. As not just in rural areas but even in urban and semi urban areas women suffer from anemia and other diseases because of lack of proper health and nutrition which led to increase in infant mortality rate and birth of weak infants. She said that if the society wants to ensure safety for women; instead of restricting girls, boys should be taught make how to behave.

She also said if we want to invest in a woman, we should, do it since her childhood. A woman should have access to all life chances, social prestige and security to become a productive individual in the society. The session was followed by discussion and students asked their queries. In the end vote of thanks was given by Professor Sharad Rathore, Programme officer NSS.

The library serves over 5000 members including students, faculty-members, research scholars and part-time staff-members.






